

Need to develop ways to reduce carbon footprint: PM

THIRUMAYAM, TN, Aug 2:

Observing that climate change has become an urgent concern across the globe, Prime Minister Manmohan Singh today said ways and means should be developed to reduce India's carbon footprint as it would be among the nations to be "most seriously" impacted.

"We need to develop ways and means to reduce our carbon footprint through technological innovation. In our country, more than 50 per cent of power comes from coal-based generation, which is a major emitter of greenhouse gases," he said.

Dedicating to the nation public sector BHEL's Power Plant Piping Unit & Unit-II High Pressure Boiler Plant in this town near Tiruchirappalli, Singh expressed happiness over BHEL's initiatives for development of ultra super critical technology in line "with our mission for development of clean coal technologies."

He said the Jawaharlal Nehru National Solar mission seeks to develop 20,000 mw of power generating capacity by the end of 13th five year plan, adding its success has the potential of enhancing India's energy security, and "contributing handsomely to our efforts to combat climate change."

"I sincerely hope that

BHEL, which is bestowed with engineering expertise, manufacturing prowess and a commendable human resource base, will not only take the lead in solar energy in terms of power generation but also in the development of solar power technology in India.

"This is a difficult commercial decision, but well worth taking in the long term interest of our country," he said.

Lauding BHEL, the Prime Minister said "I believe that with the operationalisation of these two units, the company has achieved an annual manufacturing capacity of 20,000 mw."

He lauded his cabinet colleague Finance Minister P Chidambaram, saying he was instrumental in persuading BHEL, a maharatna PSU, to locate their new power plant piping unit at Thirumayam in Pudukottai district, falling under Sivaganga Lok Sabha constituency.

He commended Chidambaram for "tirelessly striving" for the all-round development of the backward block of Thirumayam, saying this showed his concern for his constituency, "and also exemplifies our government's commitment for development of the backward regions of the country."

Such projects benefit a locality by way of new employment opportunities, including indirect ones

through small businesses, besides boosting skill development and increasing the trade and commerce in the area, contributing to overall prosperity, the Prime Minister said.

Singh also said India needed to do much more in manufacturing, adding it must expand its manufacturing substantially both in absolute terms and as a proportion of GDP.

"Only this can enable us to generate productive employment for our large work-force. BHEL is not only one of our foremost companies but is also contributing to our efforts for expanding manufacturing by helping us make our economy more competitive," he said.

He said that to address India's power deficit and to meet the needs of an expanding economy, there was a need for a large-scale capacity addition programme.

"The government is targeting a capacity addition of more than one hundred thousand mw, including renewables, in the 12th five year plan. In the 11th five year plan, the country added around 55,000 mw of generation capacity which is more than twice the addition achieved in the 10th Plan," he said.

Out of this, BHEL alone accounted for almost half. This showed the critical role that the company played in one of the key sectors of our economy, he said. (PTI)

NEW DELHI, Aug 2:

Setting the stage for a stand-off in the Supreme Court on the autonomy issue, an assertive Centre today junked CBI's stand for more power for its Director with a minimum three-year term, saying an all powerful Chief without checks and balances entails the risk of "potential misuse".

Rejecting CBI's opposition for an Accountability Commission for the agency, the Centre in an affidavit also said that the need for an "external, independent and strong watchdog is imperative".

The Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT) also took a tough stand on CBI's plea for an independent committee headed by CVC to grant sanction for prosecution of senior bureaucrats and insisted on retaining such powers.

The Government stand raises questions on its assurance of ensuring autonomy given to the Supreme Court which had described CBI as a "caged parrot" that has to be insulated from interference by political executives and external influences.

"Vesting complete disciplinary control of Group A officers with the Director would not only be against the law but also be against settled principles of administration wherein safeguards have been provided to officers so that they work without fear or favour," the Centre said.

Strongly pleading for a watchdog over the working of the CBI, the Centre submitted that such mechanism is necessary as the agency outside the purview of RTI and "authority without accountability will be draconian".

"It is submitted that autonomy and accountability go hand in hand. Government is duty bound to protect its citizens against misuse of power and arbitrary action by any institution. Authority without accountability will be draconian," it said.

The Centre submitted that internal vigilance mechanism of CBI would not be able to deliver on the complaints against its officials as the CVO of CBI is a full time employee of the agency and may not be in a position to question the Director on potential acts of omission and commission. (PTI)

"An all powerful Director CBI without adequate checks and balances would not be consonant with settled Constitutional principles and would always carry the risk of potential misuse and may not be conducive to fearless and independent functioning of the organisation at all levels. Therefore, avancements of CBI are not agreed with," the 22-page affidavit said.

The issue of CBI's autonomy had cropped up in the wake of the agency sharing its probe report on Coalgate with the political executive.

The apex court, which is monitoring investigation, will scrutinise the stand taken by both the CBI and the Centre on August 6 during hearing of the PIL filed by advocate Manohar Lal Sharma on the issue.

While opposing the CBI's claim for giving complete disciplinary control over its Group A officers to its Director, the Centre said "it is not desirable to create new precedence which would create headburn and disension in similarly placed organisations".

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Prayers at Kedarnath temple to begin in September

DEHRADUN, Aug 2:

Regular prayers at Kedarnath shrine, suspended for over a month since the June calamity in Uttarakhand, will be resumed on September 11.

The decision was taken here today at a meeting held by Chief Minister Vijay Bahuguna with the Rawal (head priest) of the Himalayan shrine, representatives of Shankaracharya Swami Swaroopanand Saraswati, officials engaged in the clean-up exercise at Kedarnath and senior ministers, officials said.

The auspicious date of September 11 for resumption of prayers at the shrine was decided after taking approval of the religious leaders who attended the meeting, they said.

However, before prayers begin at the shrine, its premises will be purged and purified as per Vedic rituals, they said.

The decision follows completion of the clean-up exercise within the interiors of the famed temple, they said.

Though areas close to the temple bore the brunt of the natural calamity, its interiors had remained almost unharmed. (PTI)



Scientists discover new molecular pathway responsible for causing heart failure

WASHINGTON, Aug 2:

Scientists, including one of Indian-origin, have discovered a new molecular pathway responsible for causing heart failure and showed that a prototype drug blocks this pathway to protect the heart from damage.

In contrast to standard therapies for heart failure, the compound called JQ1 works directly within the cell's command centre, or nucleus, to prevent damaging stress responses.

"Our discovery heralds a brand new class of drugs which work within the cell nucleus and offers promise to millions suffering from this common and lethal disease," said Saptarsi Haldar, senior author on the paper, assistant professor of medicine at Case Western Reserve and cardiologist at University Hospitals

Case Medical Center.

The researchers focused on the cell's periphery to the nucleus - the very place that unleashes sweeping damage-control responses which, if left unchecked, ultimately destroy the heart.

They found that a new family of genes, called BET bromodomains, cause heart failure because they drive hyperactive stress responses in the nucleus.

Prior research linking BET bromodomains to cancer prompted the laboratory of James Bradner, the paper's senior author and a researcher at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute, to develop a directing-acting BET inhibitor, called JQ1.

In models of cancer, JQ1 functions to turn off key cancer-causing genes occasionally prompting cancer cells to "forget" they are cancer. In models of heart failure, JQ1 silences genetic actions causing enlargement of and damage to the heart - even in the face of overwhelming stress.

"While it's been known for many years that the nucleus goes awry in heart failure, potential therapeutic targets residing in this part of the cell are often dubbed as 'undruggable' given their lack of pharmacological accessibility," said Jonathan Brown, cardiologist at Brigham and Women's Hospital and co-first author on the paper.

"Our work with JQ1 in pre-

clinical models shows that this can be achieved successfully and safely," he said.

Researchers studied mice who develop classic features of human heart failure and for a month administered a single daily dose of JQ1 to the sick animals.

The treated mice were protected from precipitous declines in heart function in a matter of days. Animals who received the compound saw a 60 per cent improvement, as compared to an untreated control group.

"Remarkably, at the end of the experiment, the hearts of many JQ1 treated mice appeared healthy and vigorous, despite being exposed to persistent and severe stress," said Priti Anand, a researcher in Haldar's lab and co-first author on the paper published in the journal Cell. (PTI)

Govt looking at hiving off penalising power from DoT to TRAI

NEW DELHI, Aug 2:

Government is looking at taking away penalising powers from Department of Telecom where officials generally take recourse to imposing the maximum penalty of Rs 50 crore on service providers permissible under licences for even minor violation, and give this authority to sector regulator TRAI.

DoT officials, under fear of allegation of their conniving with telecom operators for lowering penalty, directly impose the maximum penalty that can be levied on service providers.

The maximum penalty on telecom service provider can go up to Rs 50 crore and Rs 5 lakh in case of radiation rules violation.

"It has been around two to two and half years about excessive penalty that department has been imposing on operators. I have been wanting to change their mindset but unfortunately it hasn't changed. May be the best way forward is to give that power to TRAI," Telecom Minister Kapil Sibal said on sidelines of a CII event.

The Minister added that it

is work in progress and government is yet to take a final call on it.

Under the new licensing regime in works, TRAI has suggested imposing a penalty of up to Rs 10 crore for major violation and up to Rs 25 lakh for minor violation.

According to industry estimates, telecom service providers are facing penalty to the tune of Rs 6,500 crore.

Of this, Rs 1,900 crore has been imposed on industry on EMF (radiation) matter where

1.2 per cent of penalty estimated are for actual infringement of norms and 64 per cent for late submission of certificates and issues like improper placing of signages.

Telecom Secretary M F Farooqui said "I think these are issues which we need to address immediately and see if we can have review mechanisms within government. At least in future we do not have situation where there is difference in interpretation leading to litigation." (PTI)

Advani to take up issue of murders of Hindu outfits with Govt

COIMBATORE, Aug 2:

BJP leader L.K Advani today assured leaders of Sangh Parivar that he would take up with the Centre the issue of brutal murder of workers of various Hindu outfits in Tamil Nadu.

Representatives of BJP, RSS, VHP, Hindu Munnani, BMS and ABVP met Advani at Salem and requested him that the issue be taken up with the Government, party sources said here.

Advani told the delegation that he had strongly condemned the attacks and murders on the leaders last night and assured to take up the matter with the government.

Advani had yesterday termed as a "grim tragedy" the murder of Tamil Nadu BJP General Secretary V Ramesh on July 19 and slammed the "rise" in incidents of attacks on members of saffron outfits.

The former Deputy Prime Minister left for Bangalore by a special flight, from where he would go to Pune. (PTI)
