

Cabinet note being prepared: Govt

Parliament paralysed on Telangana

NEW DELHI, Aug 5: The first day of Monsoon session of Parliament today was marred by uproarious scenes over the decision to form Telangana even as the Government said substantive and procedural issues related to the new State would be dealt with in a Cabinet note being prepared.

There were also demands for creation of new States, including Bodoland out of Assam. Two members from Bodo areas also staged a protest outside Parliament building to press the demand in the wake of Telangana decision.

Both the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha could not function normally as they witnessed slogan-shouting by members from Andhra Pradesh against the proposal to form Telangana and demanding justice to the people of the Seemandhra region.

Due to the uproar, both the Houses were adjourned repeatedly without transacting any substantial business. The Lok Sabha was then adjourned for the day at 3 pm and the Rajya Sabha just 15 minutes later.

In the Rajya Sabha, Finance Minister P Chidambaram said the Home Ministry will "bring a comprehensive note for the Cabinet containing both substantive and procedural issues for the decision of the Cabinet."

Chidambaram, who spoke after demands by MPs for a statement from the Government and a debate on Telangana, said, "In the matter relating to the separate State of Telangana, the Constitution of India lays down a procedure for formation of new states. Besides, a number of substantive matters have to be addressed with the formation of new State. These matters are

under consideration of the Government."

The issues, he said, "will include, but (will) not (be) limited to, sharing of river waters, generation and distribution of electricity, safety and security of all residents of all three regions, guarantee of fundamental rights of all residents, etc."

He said once the Cabinet takes decisions on these matters, there will be an opportunity for the House to have a structured discussion on the subject. "The Government will welcome such a discussion at an appropriate time," he said.

Trouble started in both the Houses soon after they met for the day.

In the Lok Sabha, soon after new members took oath and obituary references were made, TDP members and Congress MPs opposed to Telangana walked into the Well and shouted slogans.

TDP members were heard shouting "we want justice" and protesting against TRS Chief K Chandrasekar Rao's reported remarks that officials who hail from Seemandhra and work in Telangana region will have to go back.

Congress MPs from Andhra Pradesh, opposing Telangana, walked into the Well to press for their demand. They carried placards which said, "We want justice for Seemandhra area" and "We want united Andhra Pradesh".

At one point, TDP member N Sivaprasad walked up to one of the protestors from the Congress with a threatening gesture but was stopped by his party colleagues.

Bodoland People's Front (BPF) member S K Biswamuthiari walked into the Well with a banner that read: "Bodoland MPs strongly stand for a separate state of Bodoland".

Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kamal Nath tried to

pacify the members but could not be heard in the din.

Speaker Meira Kumar asked the agitating members to go back to their seats but her request went unheeded. After one starred question was taken up amid din, she adjourned the House till noon.

Similar scenes were witnessed when the House re-assembled, prompting adjournment till 2 pm. The House was again adjourned till 3 pm and then finally for the day.

In the Rajya Sabha, soon after the House paid obituary references, two TDP members entered the Well opposing creation of separate Telangana State.

Biswajit Daimary (Bodoland People's Front) too entered the Well carrying a placard.

While TDP members raised banners against division of Andhra Pradesh, Daimary held banner that read: "If Telangana, Why Not Bodoland?"

Chairman Hamid Ansari asked them to go back to their seats. "I am sorry you can't do this. No banner shall be shown," he said.

Upset with members not listening to his appeal, Ansari adjourned the House for 10 minutes.

When the House reassembled, similar scenes were witnessed, Ansari once again asked the three members to return to their seats. However, the members kept shouting slogans in the Well.

Amid slogan shouting, the Chairman adjourned the House till noon. With uproar being witnessed again, the House was again adjourned till 2 pm.

The House then took up discussion on recent devastation caused by floods in Uttarakhand. It was repeatedly disrupted by slogan-shouting on Telangana and Bodoland.

In the midst of this, Chidambaram made the statement.

However, uproar continued after which Deputy Chairman P J Kurien adjourned the House for the day. (PTI)

Pak yet to grant MFN status to India

NEW DELHI, Aug 5:

The Government today said Pakistan has not adhered to the deadline for according the Most Favoured Nation (MFN) status to India.

"It was expected that the complete phasing out of the negative list before the end of 2012 would complete the transition to MFN status to India by Pakistan. But this deadline of MFN status has not been adhered to by Pakistan," Minister of State for Commerce and Industry D Purandeswari said in a written reply to the Lok Sabha.

On the other hand, India has granted MFN—status to Pakistan way back in 1996.

Under the negative list regime, Pakistan has permitted imports from India of all but 1,200 items.

However, Purandeswari said that both sides have made considerable progress in improving bilateral trade ties.

"Pakistan has moved from a positive list regime to a negative list regime, which substantially increases the tradable items from India. India has similarly liberalised its earlier restrictions on inward/outward investment flows to Pakistan," she added.

The bilateral trade between the nations stood at USD 2.35 billion in 2012-13, as against USD USD 1.93 billion in the previous fiscal. (PTI)

A motorcycle rider was killed when a Maruti-800 hit two motorcycles JK01F/7156 and Chasis number 07943 at

Chattergam, resulting in injuries to both the motorcyclists. The spokesman said the injured were shifted to Chattergam hospital where one of the injured identified as Reyaz Ahmad Sheikh succumbed to his injuries.

In another accident, a motorcycle JK01G/4204 met with an accident at Kangan, Ganderbal, resulting in injuries to motorcyclist Uroje Ahmad Bagwan son of Mohammad Shafi and a pillion Mohammad Saleem Kaka. The injured were shifted to Hospital for treatment. The spokesman said police has registered cases in this regard.

2 drug peddlers arrested, 20 kg poppy straw recovered

Food Security Bill likely in Parliament tomorrow

NEW DELHI, Aug 5:

The ordinance on Food Security bill is expected to come up for consideration in the Lok Sabha on Wednesday, sources said here today.

The ordinance on the ambitious scheme was signed by President Pranab Mukherjee exactly a month ago.

The bill seeks to give nation's three-fourth population the right to get 5 kg of foodgrains every month at highly subsidised rates of Rs 1-3 per kg.

Samajwadi Party chief Mulayam Singh Yadav said earlier in the day that his party was ready to support the food security bill if the Government promises to protect the interests of farmers and ensures that they get profit over their produce.

His remarks come against the backdrop of reports that the issue of suspended IAS officer Durga Sakthi Nagpal could cast a shadow over Congress' bid to secure SP's support on the food measure.

Meanwhile, Food Minister K V Thomas laid a copy in the Lok Sabha today showing reasons for immediate legislation by promulgation of the National Food Security Ordinance, 2013. (PTI)

Misuse of red beacon a menace: SC

NEW DELHI, Aug 5:

Misuse of red beacon and siren, granted by Government to VIPs, is a menace to society and it must be stopped, the Supreme Court observed today, asking the Centre to frame rules to restrict its use to only persons holding constitutional posts.

A bench of justices G S Singhvi and V Gopala Gowda asked the Government to impose heavy and exemplary fine on its wrong use and granted two weeks time to Centre to respond to it.

"How can citizens be treated differently," the bench said while referring to the problems faced by people when VIPs with high security cover move in vehicles with red beacon and siren.

"It is a menace to society," it said, adding such misuse "should be dealt with heavy hands and exemplary fine be imposed".

The bench was hearing a PIL filed by a Uttar Pradesh resident on misuse of red beacon.

Earlier, the bench had said the red light has become a status symbol and had said that police personnel, who are put on duty for giving security cover to VIPs, should be deployed for better purposes like making the roads safe for women.

It had also directed Centre and all the States for giving the list of persons being protected either by the Central Government or by the State administration.

The bench had said that it would consider forming a new mechanism for assessing security threat to people on the basis of which protection is given to them. (PTI)
