

Government has failed to protect migrants: PDP

JAMMU, Aug 6: Deputy Speaker, State Legislative Assembly Sartaj Madni and PDP MLA, Abdul Rehman Veeri have strongly condemned the murder of a migrant by some goons in Jagti township.

The PDP leaders held the Government responsible for the incident and said that despite the demand of the camp inmates to install a police post in the camp the authorities paid no attention to it till date.

They said the migrants who have been forced to flee from the Valley due to turmoil in 1989-90 are already leading a distressed life as they have to leave their all movable and immovable property behind. Instead of settling their problems the Government has added to their miseries by imposing the 16 hour power cuts in this hot and humid summer.

According to the police case, on June 15, 2005 Sarpanch Halqa Dingla, Mohd Din informed Poonch Police telephonically that one Shafayat, wife of Khadam Hussain of Dingla has died after consuming poisonous substance. On this report, proceedings under Section 174 of CrP commenced.
