BJP Kissan Morcha to hold nation-wide Andolan from next month

JAMMU, Aug 7: BJP Kissan Morcha will launch nation-wide Andolan from next month for the rights of farmers of the country. This was stated by Morcha Prabhari of the State, Mool Chand Sharma while talking to reporters here today along with state president of the Morcha Karan Singh.

He said while the Andolan will be held at state level in September it will be organized at national level in October to press for the demands of the farmers of the country who are leading a miserable life due to anti farmers policies of the UPA Government and Congress led Governments in the States.

He said that the farmers should get due remuneration of their produce as they are facing many problems due to anti farmers policies of the Government.

He said that the increasing cost of fertilizers and seeds has broken the back of farmers and they are unable to meet the expenses of farming with the result a large number of farmers are giving up the farming and switching over to other farms of business to earn their livelihood.

Mr Sharma said that though farmer is the back bone of the country but the Congress which ruled the country for maximum period failed to realize his significance and importance with the result he has lost interest in the farming.

He demanded that the seats be reserved in Agriculture Universities of the country for farmers children and the loans given under the credit cards be remitted as the farmers could not pay them due to heavy interest rate.

He also demanded in future these loans be given on one percent interest basis.

Supporting the separate Krishi budget on pattern of Railway budget, Karan Singh said that this will boost the agriculture in the country and many steps can be taken for the welfare of farmers. He said the BJP is committed to it.

He demanded opening of one Mandi in three Panchayats where the farmers can sell their produce and subsidy be given to them on fertilizers and seeds.

He also demanded opening of cold stores in towns and cities so that the farmers produce can be preserved and sold when the market is opportune.

NSAB team visits Kargil, interacts with LAHDC, admn

KARGIL, Aug 7: A team of National Security Advisory Board headed by its Chairman Shyam Saran today had a meeting with LAHDC Kargil and district administration.

The meeting was attended by Advisor to Chief Minister, Qamar Ali Akhooon, Chief Executive Councilor Kacho Ahmad Ali Khan, Executive Councilors Haji Ghulam, Amir Kamran and Syed Kazim Sabere, Deputy Commissioner Kargil Fida Hussain, SSP Kargil Sujit Kumar, Chief Engineer Vijayak Anil Kumar and other district officers.

Mr Saran sought suggestions for development of the border district and also reviewed the progress made in the implementation of Border Area Development Programme. Mr Akhooon projected the demand of air connectivity during winters, speeding up of work on Zojijila

Tunnel both at Z Morh and on the main Zojijila Tunnel from Baltal to Menmarek, diversion of NHID from Gumri from the Mushkow side, construction of 113 Panikhar Pahalgam road, improvement and maintenance of the Kargil Zanskar road etc.

Talking about connectivity other than road, he demanded improvement in BSNL services, satellite phones/ advanced technology for Police Posts situated at far most places like Minaamarg etc and special clothing for the Police Personnel during winter.

To reduce unemployment in the district, he demanded recruitment of unemployed youth of Kargil in various armed forces. Mr Akhooon further demanded induction of 6 new blocks under BADP Scheme.

The CEC handed over a memorandum on behalf of the people of Kargil to the visiting team.

Katra-Reasi road blocked, 5 cattle wash away

JAMMU, Aug 7: The busy Katra-Reasi and Reasi-Mahore roads remained closed for over four to five hours due to land-slides while five cattle were washed away in flash flood in a nallah near Budhal today.

Reports from Reasi said that Katra- Reasi remained closed for about four hours near the proposed tunnel during this morning. Due to heavy rain last night, the road was blocked due to landslides and it could be cleared at around 11.30 am today. The traffic remained suspended on the road for about four hours.

The traffic on Reasi-Mahore road also remained disrupted for nearly five hours due to landslides near Daman bridge and Sallah nallah near Dharmari today. The R&B authorities cleared the road and restored traffic during the mid day. Several link roads were also closed in the area due to rain and land slides.

Another report from Rajouri said that two oxen, two cows and a horse of one Mohd Ismail, resident of Draman in Budhal were washed away in flash flood in a nallah during the day today. The locals noticed the cattle falling victim to the flash flood but could not help.

People stage protest, block Nowshera road

RAJOURI, Aug 7: People from village Garhi and adjoining areas held strong protest against the local administration and disrupted movement of traffic on the road for over an hour today.

Reports said the people, mostly belonging to the SC community, led by local Shri Guru Ravi Dass Sabha leader Master Som Raj assembled at Bus Stand Nowshera during the day and started protest. They were raising slogans against local administration and police. The agitating people alleged that some influential people were not allowing them to collect 'Bazri' (pebbles) for the nallas and had been using their own JCBs for the same activity.

They further alleged that some poor families of this area were doing this activity for the last many decades and feeding their families. Their livelihood has been affected with the activities of the musclemen. They alleged that these mafia men in connivance with the local police and few officers in the administration were carrying on their illegal mining activity despite ban by the higher authorities.

Later, SDPO Nowshera Pardeep Singh and Tehsildar Head Constable Ram Niwas Meena is in the ICU of the AIIMS trauma centre. He was flown in an air ambulance from Jammu last night.

Dr M C Mishra, Chief Trauma centre said, "Meena's condition is very critical as the bullet had hit his liver and other vital organs."

"We did remove his blood packs he was wearing for protection but the bullet is still in his liver and bleeding is still on. He is on ventilator right now battling for life," Mishra said.

On August 5, Meena was injured in the Ramgarh sector of Samba when two rounds were fired from the Pakistan-side. Meena belongs to the 200 Battalion and was manning the border outpost at Narianpur. (PTI)

Husband arrested for murdering wife

UDHAMPUR, Aug 7: With the arrest of husband, Police claimed to have solved murder mystery of young housewife Suman, whose body was found in semi decomposed form from a rented accommodation of the couple in Billan Bowli area near Old Age Home at Udhampur.

The accused Ram Kumar of Jaganoo has confessed that he had killed his wife by hitting on her head with an iron tool and fled from the house.

According to police, on getting information about mysterious death of Suman, inquest proceedings under Section 174 CrPc were initiated at Police Station Udhampur for further investigation. Post mortem report of the deceased established that the woman had died due to head injury. Taking lead from that and based on the statements of other independent witnesses, the Investigating Officer questioned the deceased's husband who admitted commissioning of the crime.
