**'Govt to fund treatment of terminally ill BPL patients'**

**Azad launches Medical Mobile Unit**

SRINAGAR, June 17: To provide better health care and quality medical facilities in rural areas, Union Minister for Health and Family Welfare, Ghulam Nabi Azad launched Medical Mobile Unit (MMU) here today.

Azad said that the establishment of Mobile Medical Units is one of the innovative schemes which will provide health coverage to people living in the un-served and underserved remote areas in the state.

"In its effort to reach out to the people of far flung areas, we launched high-tech Medical Mobile Units (Ambulances) to treat patients, who, otherwise have to cover long distance to reach to the nearest health centre," Azad said.

Azad said: "There are many belts in the state where it takes a lot of time for the people to reach to the nearest Health Centre to avail medical facilities, especially in times of emergency. These mobile units equipped with lot of modern medical facilities will prove to be a boon in such areas." He said that many precious lives could be saved by these units.

These Medical Mobile Units have all the important facilities like, X-Ray, ECG, Suction machine, Defreezer, Refrigerator, besides some other facilities. There is also a

provision of Ultrasound facility in the Ambulance. "It is a kind of moving hospital in which there will be a doctor, para-medical staff and technicians," he said.

These ambulances would be used in far flung areas of the State from where it is at times difficult to ferry patients to tertiary care hospi-

Minister said, the present government has done a lot to improve the health care facilities in the country.

"The Central Government has included J&K as a special category State under NRHM under which the funding pattern has been eased to 90:10 from the previous 75:25," Azad said.

He also said new components are being added to Janani Suraksha Yojna to give more facilities to pregnant women and new born babies. He said now pre and post natal care and treatment to women at Government run hospitals would be provided free of cost.

"The new-born babies would be treated up to their first birthday free of cost," he said.

Azad said these new features to the scheme would be started from J&K itself.

Outlining the broad features of NRHM, the Union Minister said BPL patients can be funded 100 percent treatment costs of life consuming diseases on the production of relevant papers.

Azad regretted that not many cases from J&K are received and asked the Chief Medical Officers to deploy staff to prepare documents of such patients so that these cases are submitted to Centre for funding.

Earlier, Shabir Ahmad Khan, Minister of State for Health also spoke on the occasion.

These ambulances are part of 2035 National Mobile Medical Units which are to be inducted in 431 districts of the country. J&K would be getting 11 such ambulances.

Out of these 11 Medical Mobile Units, seven have been sanctioned to Jammu region, while four kept for Kashmir division.

**Lawyers should be depicted as socially responsible citizens: CJI**

SRINAGAR, June 17: Chief Justice of India Altamas Kabir today said the image of lawyers, who are depicted as "sharks" in cartoons, needs to be changed to that of a socially responsible citizens.

"Lawyers are shown as sharks in cartoons... that has to change. The lawyers have to show that we are socially responsible citizens," the Chief Justice said in his address to faculty and students of Law Department at Kashmir

The Chief Justice said there has been a sea change in the enthusiasm as well as opportunities available to law students over the past 40 years.

"In 1969-70, legal education meant joining the course for either morning shift or evening shift and paying a fee of Rs 12 per month. Only enthusiastic few would do the hard work of studying in depth. Today the students want to know and participate in moot court (competition) in Washington,

Kumar talked about the opportunities in legal profession and the difficulties a law student faces in his career. He said LLB is a license to start working as an advocate.

The law profession, he said as such looks over crowded but still provides room for everyone to create his place.

He said this profession is full of difficulties and opportunities. Students have to face them, if they want to plunge into this profession.

"Procurement of work is a big

University here.

"You should participate in legal aid work. There is a social commitment (for lawyers). Law is not something you do for only yourself but for the society as well," he said.

Justice Kabir said there were plenty of avenues for law graduates in the changing world but they should also do their bit for the society.

The Chief Justice said among the avenues available to the law graduates are higher studies and the whole corporate world.

The advent of Internet has led to the specialisation of even law courses as the worldwideweb has helped in exchange of ideas, he said.

"The Information Technology Act was started with the intention of highlighting the authenticity of documents. The digital signatures were also included in it. The law had to be altered so as to use the technological advances which has brought professionalism in law," he said.

The Chief Justice said he will take up on priority the empannelment of Kashmir University's Law Department students as research assistants and law clerks to the Supreme Court Judges.

"But you will also have to be cooperative. You have to come to Delhi and stay there for at least one year," he said responding to the suggestion of allowing the Kashmir University students the opportunity to work with Supreme Court Judges.

Justice Kabir said a little bit of encouragement to the fresh law graduates can help them go a long way in their career.

He mentioned about a Kashmiri woman lawyer, practising in Supreme Court, saying "initially, she was shy but I encouraged her to argue the case and today she has an identity of her own."

Kumar talked about the opportunities in legal profession and the difficulties a law student faces in his career. He said LLB is a license to start working as an advocate.

The law profession, he said as such looks over crowded but still provides room for everyone to create his place.

He said this profession is full of difficulties and opportunities. Students have to face them, if they want to plunge into this profession.

"Procurement of work is a big

issue which students have to take, by acquiring necessary skills students can overcome it," said Justice Kumar.

Later, Chief Justice of India inaugurated Legal Services Clinic formed by the Department of Law and launched the Kashmir University Law Review, 2012.

**Power shut down**

JAMMU, June 17: In order to carry out the work of isolation/dismantling of SF 6 Circuit Breaker in the 132/33 KV Grid Station Canal, the power supply to various areas would remain affected on June 18, 2013 at different times.

The areas fed from 132/33 KV Grid Station Canal would face shut down from 6 a m to 7 a m, areas fed by 33 KV Satwari feeder from 7 a m to 8 a m and areas fed by 33 KV Chatha and Tope feed from 8 a m 9 a m.

Similarly, in order to carry out the work of 33 KV tap line for upcoming (1x10) MVA receiving station Shastri Nagar, the power supply to part of Shastri Nagar, Ashok Nagar, Sanjay Nagar and its adjoining areas fed from 1x10 MVA 33/11 K receiving station Ashok Nagar will remain affected on June 18, 2013 from 9 a m to 2 p m.

**PoK refugees take out protest rally**

JAMMU, June 17: The PoK displaced families today took out protest rally and staged dhama in front of the office of Deputy Commissioner in support of their demands.

The displaced families under the banner of J&K PoK Refugee Front—1947, 1965 and 1971 gathered at Peer Kho this morning and took out a protest rally towards the offices of Deputy Commissioner and Provincial Rehabilitation Officer where they staged dhama.

Led by president Rachhpal Singh, the protesting refugees raised slogans against the National Conference-Congress Coalition Government for its failure to provide comprehensive settlement package to the families uprooted in three wars between India and Pakistan in 1947, 1965 and 1971.

"The State Government being run by the Valley-based political parties has been playing fox to provide compensation of the home and hearth, movable and immovable properties, social-educational-employment avenues and due share in Assembly and Parliament", they said, adding "the bureaucratic inaction in implementing the decisions of the Central and State Governments is responsible for continuous injustice with us".

They alleged that Deputy Commissioner, Provincial Rehabilitation Officer, Divisional Commissioner and Revenue Secretary were responsible for not getting the directions of the

**Soz meets Governor**

SRINAGAR, June 17: Prof. Saif-ud-Din Soz, President, Jammu and Kashmir Pradesh Congress Committee and Member of Parliament, met N. N. Vohra, Governor, at Raj Bhavan here this afternoon.

During their meeting, the Governor and Prof. Soz discussed several important matters relating to the governance, growth and development of the State.

Government implemented, adding "the silence on the part of the Chief Minister explains his real intentions. It seems that he is not ready to see the refugees of Jammu region financially, socially, educationally and professionally sound".

Despite Divisional Commissioner's directions issued in December 2012 the Provincial Rehabilitation Officer and Deputy Commissioner Jammu have not brought out notification inviting applications forms for grant of compensation in lieu of deficiency of land/plots from the left out families of 1947, 1965 and 1971 refugees.

Referring to the Government order dated May 17, 2013 whereby Additional Commissioner Jammu was nominated as Nodal Officer to consolidate the details of genuine refugees of 1965 and 1971 and

identify the area where such refugees are facing the problems, they said, "it is unfortunate that State Government has not bothered to include DPs of 1947 despite the fact that they have remained unregistered till date and couldn't avail the benefits of their displacement for last 66 years".
