

# PM expected to address UN Sustainable Development Summit

UNITED NATIONS, Aug 4: Prime Minister Narendra Modi is expected to address a high-level summit on sustainable development hosted by the UN on September 25 when the new and ambitious post-2015 development agenda will be adopted.

The United Nations summit for the adoption of the post-2015 development agenda will be held from September 25 to 27 here and will be convened as a high-level plenary meeting of the General Assembly.

Slated to be one of the largest ever gatherings at the UN, more than 150 world leaders are expected to attend the Sustainable Development Summit to formally adopt the outcome document of the new agenda.

Modi is expected to address the gathering on September 25 after which he will head to the West Coast to visit San Francisco, sources said.

The 70th session of the General Assembly will open on September 15.

The annual high-level General Debate will begin on September 28 and will run through October 6.

Since Modi is likely to return to India around September 28, External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj is expected to represent the country at the General Debate.

According to the first provisional list of speakers for the General Debate, released by the UN, India will be represented by its "Minister" who is scheduled to address the gathering of Heads of State and Foreign Ministers in the morning of October 1.

Pakistan Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif is expected to address the UNGA on September 30, according to the UN provisional list.

It remains to be seen if Modi and Sharif meet at the sidelines of the Sustainable Development Summit, depending on when Sharif arrives in New York.

However, since the speakers' list released is still provisional, the country representatives and the date and time when they address the debate could change in the weeks ahead.

Modi is expected to travel to San Francisco after his address to the Sustainable Development Summit on September 25, becoming the fourth Indian Premier to visit US' West Coast. He had given his maiden address to the UN General Assembly last year and had then travelled to Washington.

As is the tradition, Brazil will open the General Debate on the morning of September 28, followed by an address by US President Barack Obama and Chinese President Xi Jinping.

The 193 Member States of the United Nations reached agreement on August 2 on the outcome document that will constitute the new sustainable development agenda that will be adopted this September by world leaders at the Sustainable Development Summit.

Concluding a negotiating process that has spanned more than two years and has featured the unprecedented participation of civil society, countries agreed to the ambitious agenda that features 17 new sustainable development goals that aim to end poverty, promote prosperity and people's well-being while pro-

tecting the environment by 2030.

Welcoming the agreement, UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon said it "encompasses a universal, transformative and integrated agenda that heralds an historic turning point for our world".

This is the people's agenda, a plan of action for ending poverty in all its dimensions, irreversibly, everywhere and leaving no one behind.

It seeks to ensure peace and prosperity and forge partnerships with people and planet at the core.

The integrated, interlinked and indivisible 7 sustainable development goals are the people's goals and demonstrate the scale, universality and ambition of this new agenda.

The September Summit, where the new agenda will be adopted, "will chart a new era of sustainable development in which poverty will be eradicated, prosperity shared and the core drivers of climate change tackled", he said.

The new agenda builds on the success of the Millennium Development Goals, which helped more than 700 million people escape poverty.

The eight Millennium Development Goals, adopted in 2000, aimed at an array of issues that included slashing poverty, hunger, disease, gender inequality, and access to water and sanitation by 2015.

Ban said the new agenda will also contribute to achieve a meaningful agreement in the 21st session of the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP21) in Paris in December. (PTI)

# 'Govt shouted, threatened and ran off', Rahul on land bill

NEW DELHI, Aug 4:

Taking a swipe at Government over its U-turn on land bill, Rahul Gandhi today said it "ran off" after "threatening" and shouting "in the face of resistance by Congress and vowed that the party will similarly keep up pressure for resignations in Lalit Modi and Vyapam issues.

"On the land issue, Congress stood in front of them. They (Government) shouted, made too much noise, threatened and later made a U-turn and ran off," the Congress Vice President said, a day after BJP members in a parliamentary panel moved amendments to restore provisions of the UPA's land law.

"Similarly, on the issue of corruption, Vyapam, on the issue of Rajasthan Chief Minister and Sushma Swaraj,

we will not minimise the pressure on them even if they throw us out of Parliament or do not let us enter Parliament," Rahul said.

He made the remarks while agitating with party MPs in Parliament House complex in protest against suspension of its 25 members from Lok Sabha.

The Congress MPs faced action after they did not allow the house to function demanding the resignation of External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj and Rajasthan CM Vasundhara Raje for allegedly helping Lalit Modi and Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan over Vyapam scam.

Rahul said the Congress will 'gherao' the Government on these issues in the entire country.

Reacting to the remarks, Rural Development Minister Birender Singh said, "Those

who stand at 44 will speak only this language".

Congress was reduced to its least tally of 44 seats in Lok Sabha in the last general elections.

The barbs from both sides came as the Government expressed readiness to accept recommendations of the panel on land, which restored provisions of the UPA law, insisting that it was not a climbdown as it was always open to changes on which there is consensus.

All 11 BJP members moved amendments in Joint Committee of Parliament seeking to bring back key provisions of UPA's land law including on consent clause and social impact assessment by dropping the changes brought by Modi Government in December last year and subsequently revalidated by Ordinance thrice. # Taj Mahal vulnerable to pollution, no study on other monuments yet: Govt

NEW DELHI, Aug 4:

The Government has not carried out any specific study to identify monuments across the country with regards to their vulnerability to climate change and air pollution," Javadekar said.

He said that to protect Taj, a Taj Trapezium Zone (TTZ) has been notified and restrictions have been imposed.

The existing industries have to strictly comply with the 1996 directions of the Supreme Court, and no new or expansion in the existing units is allowed within TTZ.

"The Government has established Taj Trapezium Authority under the Environment Protection Act, 1986 for mitigation of pollution in TTZ area and to minimise adverse impact

of pollution on Taj Mahal," Javadekar said.

Amidst reports pointing at the discolouration of Taj Mahal, a parliamentary panel had recently recommended that a "multi-pronged" strategy must be adopted to preserve the "pristine beauty" of the monument.

Noting that diesel generators in the area around Taj Mahal are a major source of pollution "adversely" affecting the monument, the parliamentary panel has urged Uttar Pradesh Government to implement the Supreme Court's directive for 24-hour power supply in the area, besides giving a host of other recommendations. # Over 450 projects being considered for environment clearance: Govt

NEW DELHI, Aug 4:

More than 450 projects in various sectors are presently being considered by the Government for environmental clearance while more than 200 are awaiting forest clearance, Lok Sabha was informed today.

"The number of projects under consideration for environmental clearance in the Ministry (of Environment) are 475 and for approval under Forest (Conservation) Act 1980 are 240," Environment Minister Prakash Javadekar said in a written reply.

As per the details, 168 projects in the non-coal mining sector are under consideration for environmental clearance while

there are 102 projects in the infrastructure and CRZ sectors which are awaiting a decision.

Javadekar said that more than 140 projects are under consideration for environmental clearance in various industrial categories while eight thermal projects are under such consideration.

Similarly, 21 coal mining projects are awaiting environmental nod while 22 river valley projects (HEP) are under consideration. Six projects under nuclear defence strategic sector are also under consideration for environmental clearance.

Altogether 37 projects seeking approval of the central Government under the Forest Conservation Act, 1980 for

diversion of forest land are pending, which include 12 in the mining sector, eight in hydel, two in defence and five in irrigation sectors amongst others.

203 proposals under the Act are pending in regional offices of various states which include 131 in the road sector, 14 in hydel and eight for transmission lines.

He said that a total of 1567 proposals were given environmental clearance in the last three years and the current year. This year till June, 81 projects in infrastructure and construction sectors have been given environmental nod while 68 proposals in the industry sector have been cleared. (PTI)

# Coal scam: Naveen Jindal, other accused face court's ire

NEW DELHI, Aug 4:

Congress leader and industrialist Naveen Jindal and other accused, chargesheeted by the CBI in a coal scam case, today faced special court's ire for delay in completing the process of scrutiny of documents supplied to them by the agency along with its final report.

"It is too late now. By when you will complete scrutiny of documents," Special CBI Judge Bharat Parashar said after the counsel appearing for Jindal and other accused sought time to complete scrutiny of documents saying the case records were voluminous and some of them were not legible.

"I have got the certified copy (of documents) checked thrice. Atleast 50 times you all have been allowed to inspect the court record. I will then hear the matter on a day-to-day basis," the judge said.

Initially, the judge was reluctant to give time to the accused to complete the process of scrutiny of documents and said they would have to sit in the court today and do it.

"Let the accused sit here and do scrutiny of documents. You (accused) all be here and complete it today," the court said, adding, "investigation officer (IO) will also sit here and will handover the documents to the accused as sought."

Senior advocate Ramesh Gupta, appearing for Jindal and some other accused, said they have received certified copies of the documents and their scrutiny was going on.

Gupta sought one more week for completing the scruti-

ny of documents while the other defence counsel said some of the documents supplied to them were not legible.

"I am only saying give us one week more time and we will complete the scrutiny of documents," he said.

The judge said, "No, I will not give any further time."

Meanwhile, special public prosecutor R S Cheema requested the court to grant seven more days to the accused to complete scrutiny of documents.

The court, however, told all the accused that the process should be complete by August 17, the next date of hearing.

The court also asked the IO to ensure that documents now supplied to the accused should

be legible and complete in all respect.

The case pertains to alleged irregularities in allocation of Amarkonda Murgadagal coal block in Jharkhand to two Jindal group companies, Jindal Steel and Power Ltd (JSPL) and Gagan Sponge Iron Pvt Ltd (GSIPL).

Besides Jindal, ex-Jharkhand Chief Minister Madhu Koda, former Minister of State for Coal Dasari Narayan Rao, ex-Coal Secretary H C Gupta and 11 others, including five firms, are accused in the case.

CBI had earlier told the court that it had provided same sets of documents running into 10,398 pages to the accused in CD form.(PTI)

# 'Responsibility practices in environment syllabus a must'

NEW DELHI, Aug 4:

Though existing regulatory requirements mandate the inclusion of environmental studies in school curriculum, there is a need to incorporate responsibility practices beyond a particular subject to make it a living practice, says an expert.

According to Ajith Sankar, professor at PSG Institute of Management (PSGIM) in Coimbatore, it is important to incorporate responsibility practices beyond a particular subject.

Citing the example of the Education Department of a state in India disallowing the sale of junk food within school premises, he says "This decision is laudable. The students should be served freshly prepared meals, which are made from locally sourced ingredients that nourish their body, mind and spirit.

"Facilitating a student to choose, plant and nurture indigenous tree saplings help them to connect with the environment in a better way than forcing them to learn the definition of ecosystem by rote."

He also says that a short-term focus on environmental issues is emerging from a state of partial knowledge and one who has experienced the pain from a needless accident will be careful to create an entire life that is free of accidents, not just a day that is free of accidents.

His book "Environmental

Management", published by Oxford University Press India, attempts to inculcate the need to understand the gravity of environment preservation, on a day-to-day basis while acquiring managerial knowledge at a post-graduate level.

It tries to create awareness about our fragile ecology and ecosystem as well as our rich biodiversity, and raises relevant environmental issues such as pollution, deforestation, global warming, and depletion of scarce natural resources.

Sankar feels that there is a need for creating a facilitating environment that leads to inspiring endeavours and just thinking that reactionary legal instruments alone can contribute to the well-being of the society would be immature.

Asked how important is teaching management professionals the significance of taking environmentally responsible business decisions so as to achieve a balanced business environment, he says the discussion on "balance" between business and environment is misguided.

"Business and economy are fully owned subsidiaries of the natural environment. If the planet is not there, there is no scope for any business enterprise. Ecology in balance is inherently about relationships in balance - inter-species and intra-species. "Interdependent relation-

ships that are in balance gives opportunity for imagination, creativity and innovation in business. Such a balance also expresses the abundance inherent in us, thereby contributing to the well-being of all, including businesses," Sankar said.

He is of the view that the inherent spiritual values make India one of the global leaders in environmental sustainability, despite a large percentage of Indian population not understanding the technical aspects related to environmental issues and its impacts, and the population pressure that we have.

"Our environmental footprint and carbon footprint, on a per capita basis, is lower as compared to the nations that have achieved highest and higher economic growth," he says.

"Few in India know the factors that constitute an ecological footprint, though many Indians experientially know the medicinal value of Amla, Neem and Tulsi. The culture has attempted to respect everything for its inherent nature, not just for its utility for human beings..."(PTI)

# Govt acknowledges irregularities in targeted PDS

NEW DELHI, Aug 4:

Acknowledging irregularities in the targeted public distribution scheme, Government today told Lok Sabha that it has received 60 complaints, including of blackmarketing, from different states this year.

Consumer Affairs and Food Minister Ram Vilas Paswan said during Question Hour that a total of 60 complaints have been received about irregularities, which have been lodged by individuals, organisations and NGOs.

With 14 complaints, Uttar Pradesh leads the list so far this year. Delhi comes second with eight complaints, he said.

Last year, a total of 460 such complaints were received by the Government relating to irregularities like blackmarketing in targeted PDS, Paswan said. (PTI)
