NIA again conducts raid; seizes cross-LoC trade record in Poonch

in Jammu and Kashmir. "This was allegedly being done in-league with the terror networks of Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT), Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) and Hizbul Mujahideen (HM), who have their cadre in both parts of the divided States i.e. Jammu and Kashmir and PoK," sources said. They added that the NIA had earlier seized entire record of 303 firms, dealing in cross-LoC trade on Poonch-Rawalakote route, which would be used to identify the traders, who had misused cross-LoC trade facility and generated funds for the anti-national activities. Entire record of the cross-LoC trade since 2009 has been seized by the NIA team. The investigators reportedly have inputs that some fictitious firms have been floated by the traders, whose accounts would be searched in the banks. The banks are likely to be approached for bank account statements. The NIA during earlier raids had recorded the statements of some of the officials dealing with cross-LoC trade and could take statements of more officials and traders during their current

visit to Poonch district, sources said. "There were reports that some of the traders in Jammu and Kashmir have grown rich manifold with their banking transactions and assets multiplying after they started dealing with cross-LoC trade," sources said, adding there were very genuine concerns that the trade was misused by some of the traders to pump funds into the militancy. Sources said the modus operandi being looked into the cross-LoC trade at both the centres was that under the barter system, some of the traders exported less quantity of goods but, in return, were given high quantity of good items from PoK traders on the directions of the militants. The part of extra amount generated by the traders on this side of Jammu and Kashmir from additional goods was pumped into militancy while rest was kept by the traders for them as reward for helping militants. Under the barter system, the traders had to import goods of the same amount which they had exported to other side.

Kashmir including some based on recommendations of Dineshwar Sharma were reportedly discussed during the meeting," sources said, adding that the Chief Minister wanted the Centre to take more steps to help restore peace in the Kashmir Valley, which was being shattered with the civilian killings. Food in mess, canteens to attract GST

regarding rate of GST applicable on supply of food and drinks in educational institutions, it is clarified that GST rate on supply of food and drinks in a mess or canteen in an educational institution attracts GST at 5 per cent without Input Tax Credit (ITC).

The GST, which subsumes over a dozen local taxes, was rolled out from July 1. Under the new indirect tax regime, various goods and services have been placed in four tier tax bracket - 5, 12, 18 and 28 per cent. (PTI)

CB records 22 statements in Rassana case

appeared in an examination in Meerut and showed the attendance sheet allegedly bearing his signatures. The Crime Branch sent the attendance sheet for forensic examination and it was found that the signatures had been forged. 4 civilians killed, 60 injured in Kulgam

among the injured youth, Adil Ahmad, 25, from Anantnag is stated to be critical. At least eight injured persons were admitted in the SMHS hospital Srinagar. Among them, 50-year-old Abdul Salam Dar son of Abdul Rahim Dar of Havoora had a serious firearm injury in his neck. His condition is critical and he is on the ventilator. Ten injured were brought to District hospital Anantnag and eight of them who had multiple eye, head and face injuries were referred to Srinagar hospitals. Two injured are still admitted in the hospital. One of them has minor head injury while another has multiple pellet injuries. At least 45 injured were brought at Primary Health Centre, Qoimoh. Among the injured some were discharged after first aid, and some were shifted to other district hospitals in South Kashmir and few others were referred to Srinagar hospitals. Eight injured were admitted at the district hospitals Pulwama and Kulgam. Around a dozen minor injured were treated upon at Kulgam hospital and were discharged. Meanwhile, thousands of people participated in the funeral prayers of the slain civilians. They were raising slogans against Government and security forces. A police spokesman said that three civilians were killed in "crossfire" while investigations were underway to ascertain death of Palla. "In the said encounter three civilians identi-

fied as Sarjeel Sheikh of Khudwani, Bilal Ahmad Tantray of Frisal and Faisal Ilahi of Melhoora Shopian who were injured in the crossfire have also succumbed to their injuries. Moreover, 12 persons have also received injuries in the process and are being treated at different hospitals. They are stated to be stable", police said. The police also requested citizens not to fall prey to any speculations and rumours which are intended to disturb the peace. "J&K Police seeks your cooperation for maintaining peace," the spokesman added. The killing in Kulgam sparked off massive protests amid clashes at several places in Kashmir Valley. Students of Kashmir University, NIT Hazratbal, Islamic University Awantipora and the Central University of Kashmir staged protests against the killings. Students of schools and colleges protested in several parts of Valley including Handwara, Bandipora, Baramulla, Sumbal, Islamia College Hawal, Degree College Ganderbal, Degree College Pulwama, Women's College Srinagar and Degree College Kupwara and Pampore. Other than clashes at Khudwani and its adjoining area, the reports of stone-pelting clashes were received from Sumbal, Bandipora, Handwara, Baramulla, Drangbal, Pulwama and Shopian. At Baramulla, SHO Police Station Baramulla Khalid Ahmad was hit by a stone at his head during protests. He has skull bone fracture and was shifted to SKIMS hospital in

Srinagar. His condition is stated to be stable. Authorities directed mobile companies to reduce internet speed in Srinagar and snap it in South Kashmir parts. This afternoon internet services were snapped in parts of South Kashmir while as the speed of the mobile internet has been reduced in district Srinagar as a precautionary measure. Sources said police sent a communication to the cellular companies wherein it has directed them to snap down the mobile internet (2G/3G/4G) data in Pulwama, Shopian and Awantipora with immediate effect. The communication also directed the cellular companies to reduce the 3G/4G speed into 2G speed in Srinagar district with immediate effect. The internet has already been blocked in Kulgam district since midnight. Authorities today decided to suspend the class work in schools and colleges in most parts of the Kashmir. Kashmir University and Islamic University cancelled examinations and also suspended the class work. "In view of concerns expressed by students, all Kashmir University examinations scheduled to be held on April 12 (Thursday) and April 13 (Friday) are postponed. Fresh dates will be announced separately later," a PRO of the varsity said in a statement. The Public Service Commission (PSC) has postponed the examination of range officers scheduled on Thursday. "The exams scheduled on Thursday have been postponed and will be conducted on Monday (April 16) afternoon," said a PSC official. Islamia College of Science and Commerce has cancelled all the examinations scheduled on Thursday. "Fresh dates for the deferred examinations shall be notified separately. Please check the college website regularly," an official said. A Government official said that the class work in all the schools and colleges in South Kashmir districts shall remain suspended on Thursday. The decision was taken as a precautionary measure to maintain law

Jammu observes total bandh

Purani Mandi and City Chowk. At City Chowk, they removed the poster of MLA Jammu East, Rajesh Gupta and a virtual clash with his PA was averted with the intervention of the members of business community. From City Chowk a group of lawyers in the form of rally went via Kanak Mandi while another passed via Dogra Chowk where already the members of Team Jammu led by Zorawar Singh Jamwal and activists of Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) and Panthers Party had reached to enforce the bandh. They had burnt the tyre tubes on the road to stop the movement of vehicular traffic. Later some activists of Bar Association, NPP and Team Jammu marched through other markets of Jammu including Jewel Chowk, Canal road, Talab Tillo, Janipur, Roop Nagar, Chinore, Bantalab etc to enforce the bandh. Besides, the work in High Court Complex and subordinate courts remained suspended for eighth consecutive day today as lawyers abstained work in support of their demands. Strong protest was also held at Bohri Chungi led by Vikas Dewan and Ashok Kangan. The protesters raised slogans demanding deportation of Rohingyas. Reports coming from Kathua and other towns said that total bandh was observed in Kathua, Hiranagar, Jatwal, Chadwal and Samba townships with shops and other business establishments remaining closed with transport also remaining off the roads. The response to bandh call was spontaneous. The lawyers in Kathua also held a protest which was led by Bar president Advocate Kirti Bushan Mahajan. They torched the effigy of Government in front of Court Complex Kathua. All private schools remained closed in Kathua town. There was heavy deployment of police to avert any untoward incident. Reports said that mob held protest demonstrations at Hiranagar, Chadwal, Chan Morian, Koota More and Lodhi Morh and blocked National Highway for about 20 minutes at every place. The traffic on the Highway was restored only after the intervention of police which forced the mob to disperse. Over half a dozen posts of Admn Secys among 9 key positions lying vacant

further said. Not only of seven Administrative Secretaries, the posts of Commissioner Commercial Taxes and Excise Commissioner have also been lying vacant because of the inability of the Government to take timely decision and post new officers, sources said. The post of Excise Commissioner fell vacant after serving IAS officer Mohammad Javed Khan was removed from the position for facing departmental enquiry in the much publicized Rajouri Development Authority scam while as the post of Commissioner Commercial Taxes fell vacant following transfer of IAS officer in the recent past. "Moreover, the Government is managing the affairs of six key departments through ad hoc arrangements due to dearth of eligible officers for the posts of Administrative Secretaries", sources said while disclosing that Finance Secretary Navin Choudhary is holding the additional charge of the post of Chairman of Bureau of Public Enterprises during the past quite long time. Similarly, Transport Commissioner Saugat Biswas is holding the additional charge of the posts of Administrative Secretary of Information Technology Department and Chief Executive Officer Jammu and Kashmir Energy Development Agency. Likewise, M Raju, Administrative Secretary of PHE, Irrigation and Flood Control Department is holding the additional charge of Administrative Secretary Transport Department. Khurshid Ahmad Shah, Administrative Secretary General Administration Department is holding the additional charge of post of Director General, J&K Institute of Management and Public Administration. Hilal Ahmad Parray, Administrative Secretary Youth Services and Sports Department is holding the additional charge

of the post of Administrative Secretary Technical Education Department while as Sarmad Hafeez, Managing Director J&K Tourism Development Corporation is holding the additional charge of the post of Administrative Secretary Tourism Department during the past quite long time. As per the rules, IAS officers of up to 2005 batch are currently eligible for the posts of Administrative Secretaries. However, at present the Government doesn't have All India Service officers who fulfill this eligibility thereby leading to the peculiar situation. Stating that deficit in the IAS and KAS cadre has led to the prevailing crisis, sources said, "before 2006 regular recruitment of IAS officers in respect of J&K cadre was very less and the same picked up momentum only after 2009. Moreover, during the period between 1996 and 2006, only few IAS officers made it to the J&K cadre". "During 1996, 1998 and 2000, no IAS officer was allotted J&K cadre which is one of the contributing factors to the dearth of eligible officers for the posts of Administrative Secretaries at present", they added. Similarly, there was no batch of Jammu and Kashmir Administrative Services (KAS) during the period between 1984 and 1999, which is why there is a crisis of inducted KAS officers as well. "Had there been no deficit at this level, officers would have been available for manning the posts of Administrative Secretaries at present", sources said. In the recent past efforts were made to evolve a consensus on posting IAS officers of 2007, 2008 and 2009 batch as Secretaries of departments in major relaxation of rules as this was the only remedy available with the Government to overcome the prevailing crisis. However, the process was stopped abruptly for unknown reasons, sources said.

Sgr-Leh NH closed

Sonamarg in Central Kashmir's Ganderbal district today and avalanches. "Traffic was suspended on the highway after fresh snow caused slippery conditions and slides at few places and avalanches," said a senior Traffic Police official. The Mughal road was also closed in the morning for traffic due to slippery road condition caused by the light snowfall. However, the road was reopened for traffic in the afternoon but due to landslides on Poonch side of Pir Ki Gali disrupted the traffic. The intermittent rains continued to lash Valley since Sunday afternoon. A MeT official said that the wet weather across the Valley would continue till tomorrow morning.

The rains that continued since Sunday afternoon caused water logging at several places in Old City areas including Khanyar, Baba Demb and others resulting in immense hardships to the pedestrians. Srinagar Municipal Corporation (SMC) put its men and machinery on task to dewater the water logged areas in different parts of Srinagar city. Besides sucker machines and mobile pumps the sanitation staff was also pressed into service. Dewatering exercise was carried out in inundated areas which included Hari Singh High Street, Lal Chowk, Batamalo, Bemina, Qamarwari, Rajbagh, Jawahar Nagar, Mehjhor Nagar, Hyderpora, Gogji Bagh and Chhanapora.

Smart fence in Jammu to be operationalized

NEW DELHI, Apr 11: The first 'smart fence' pilot project to plug vulnerable gaps along India's borders has been rolled out in Assam on a riverine stretch with Bangladesh, the BSF chief has said. The project is a part of the Modi Government's ambitious plan to completely seal the India-Pakistan and the India-Bangladesh borders in the next few years and is called the Comprehensive Integrated Border Management System (CIBMS). Border Security Force Director General K K Sharma said that the maiden testing of technical surveillance and alarm gadgetry was recently operationalised on the 55-km-long stretch in Dhubri, across the Brahmaputra. "The rolling out of the CIBMS pilot project has been initiated recently in Assam's Dhubri area. This is a riverine border area and hence no fence could be erected here," Sharma said. At present, BSF troops use speed boats to guard this patch, which is highly prone to illegal migration and cattle smuggling due to the changing course of the mighty river. No permanent structure - like border posts - can be erected in this area. The DG said a similar project will be launched this month along the India-Pakistan International Border, in two stretches of 5 km each, in Jammu.

because we would like to be doubly sure. Roughly, about 2,000-plus kilometre length on both the borders has been identified as being vulnerable or as being without fence where we need to implement the CIBMS in the days to come. "This rolling out process for the entire distance of 2,000 km will take about 3-5 years time," he said. When asked if the force was not able to get the "required technology" to plug these vulnerable gaps on the two frontiers, prone to infiltration and smuggling of arms and drugs, the DG said that was not the case. "No, it is not like that. All this technology is available. "The problem lies in integrating all these things. Integration of all these gadgets and bringing all these on the same platform and then taking a common feed to the border out post, that is the challenge," he said. Sharma added that once a software is created which integrates all these things, then the BSF personnel sitting in the border post will have a picture which is shown on a monitor and the gadgets and technology will be "guarding the border for us and if something is amiss, an alarm will be created." "At this juncture, my men will respond," the DG said. Talking about the technology source for this multi-crore project aimed to fortify Indian borders, the DG said most of these are being manufactured abroad but are easily available. "There is nothing unique or scarce about them. The technology is mostly developed abroad but India is fast catching up. There are Indian players also who are trying to develop these technologies within the country," Sharma said. The nearly-2.5-lakh-personnel-strong BSF is the country's largest border guarding force, and the Sashastha Seema Bal (Nepal and Bhutan borders) and the Indo-Tibetan Border Police (China border) being the other two paramilitaries under the command of the Union Home Ministry. of the post of Administrative Secretary Technical Education Department while as Sarmad Hafeez, Managing Director J&K Tourism Development Corporation is holding the additional charge of the post of Administrative Secretary Tourism Department during the past quite long time. As per the rules, IAS officers of up to 2005 batch are currently eligible for the posts of Administrative Secretaries. However, at present the Government doesn't have All India Service officers who fulfill this eligibility thereby leading to the peculiar situation. Stating that deficit in the IAS and KAS cadre has led to the prevailing crisis, sources said, "before 2006 regular recruitment of IAS officers in respect of J&K cadre was very less and the same picked up momentum only after 2009. Moreover, during the period between 1996 and 2006, only few IAS officers made it to the J&K cadre". "During 1996, 1998 and 2000, no IAS officer was allotted J&K cadre which is one of the contributing factors to the dearth of eligible officers for the posts of Administrative Secretaries at present", they added. Similarly, there was no batch of Jammu and Kashmir Administrative Services (KAS) during the period between 1984 and 1999, which is why there is a crisis of inducted KAS officers as well. "Had there been no deficit at this level, officers would have been available for manning the posts of Administrative Secretaries at present", sources said. In the recent past efforts were made to evolve a consensus on posting IAS officers of 2007, 2008 and 2009 batch as Secretaries of departments in major relaxation of rules as this was the only remedy available with the Government to overcome the prevailing crisis. However, the process was stopped abruptly for unknown reasons, sources said.
