### Govt fails to deliver promises made to Panchayat Ghar land donors

his village. But, he said, the Government's attitude has let him down, "it has been 15 years since the donation of land but I am yet to receive the promised benefits."

Regretting his decision, Hajam said, the land would have fetched him good money because of its proximity to Pahalgam, a famed tourist destination. "The Government lured me with a fake promise and if they continue the same attitude I will look down the building," he said.

**Director of Rural Development, Qazi Sarwar, when contacted said the process of transferring the land is underway. "Donors with one kanal of land have been asked to transfer it to the Government. Once the land is transferred the other things will follow. The process has already been initiated," he said, adding the cases would be considered for employment under SRO 520 after land gets transferred.**

Mohammad Shaban, another land donor from South Kashmir, said the transfer of land is taking time because of trust deficit between authorities and the donors. "Authorities have broken several promises. We told them to

give us written orders regarding our employment and compensation," he said. Taking a dig at the Government's reluctance over the issues, he added: "let them issue orders to the people who have already donated their land. What is stopping them to issue orders in their favor?" he asked.

An official, however, said it took department time to scrutinize the list of donors as a number of donors turned out to be fake. "Only after verifying the cases properly we have prepared the list and dispatched it to the civil secretariat for further action," he said.

Not only has Government used the donated spaces but roped in the owners to "watch and ward" the structures. "We are taking care of these buildings for last several years but authorities have not regularized our services. We have not been paid even a single penny for our services over the years," Gulam Nabi Khayari from Pattan said, adding they are risking their lives for nothing.

Ever since authorities announced the civic and panchayat polls in the State, unknown arsonists have set over a dozen Panchayat Ghars on fire.

### IAF moots joint planning with Army, Navy

nations are capable of inflicting upon each other," he said

"Thus it is imperative that the three services promote joint planning and exploit the strengths of sister services to help win a war in the shortest possible time. India by itself is one theatre," he said.

There have been deliberations within the Government and the three forces on whether India should go for integrated theatre commands where all the manpower and assets of the three services will be under the command of one officer. The US as well as several western countries follow this model.

There were voices within the defence establishment who were in favour of setting up at least two theatre commands -- one in western sector for dealing with Pakistan and other in eastern sector for dealing with any eventuality along the frontier with China.

Though there is no clear indication of whether the Government was serious about setting up the theatre commands, in April, it formed a Defence Planning Committee (DPC) headed by National Security Advisor (NSA) Ajit Doval to prepare a national security strategy with a focus on ensuring convergence among the three forces.

"What we require is an institutionalised structure for joint planning. Incidentally, IAF is the only service that deputes senior officers who serve alongside principal

fighting formations of the other two services so as to improve and enhance their combat potential in achieving desired outcomes," said Air Chief Marshal Dhanoa.

He said the IAF enables the Army and the Navy to achieve laid down objectives set by the political leadership.

At present, India has 17 single-service commands. The country's only tri-services command was set up in 2001 in the strategically located Andaman and Nicobar.

Nearly two years back, China reorganised its military into five theatre commands to enhance the overall capabilities of the forces.

Asked about the IAF's long-pending modernisation initiative, Air Chief Marshal Dhanoa said his force has a capability-driven modernisation plan with an aim to achieve full spectrum capabilities. "It is the IAF's endeavour to achieve self-sufficiency through a focused, sustained and evolved modernisation programme by supporting the 'Make in India' initiative. Rest assured, IAF is prepared to respond to future challenges and safeguard the Indian skies," he said.

The IAF chief said the government was pursuing multiple initiatives to achieve higher levels of indigenisation and self-reliance in the defence sector.

This, he said, was sought to be achieved by harnessing the capabilities of both the public and the private sector industries, thus increasing the defence industrial base in the country.

"Self-reliance is a major cornerstone on which the military capability of any nation must rest. Our country has immense potential to leverage the manpower and engineering capability within the country for attaining self-reliance in design, development & manufacturing in defence sector," he said. And security forces have launched massive operations in South Kashmir against the militants responsible for the killing of two persons and abduction of four others.

Sources said that security forces have identified the militants who slit throat of Huzafi Ashraf after his abduction. They have been identified as Abu Maaz of Pakistan and Shoukat Ahmad of Harmain, Shopian, who belonged to Jaish-e-Mohammad militant outfit.

They said that Shuja Magray and Abbas of Hizbul Mujahideen are responsible for the killing of Nadeem Manzoor of Nikloora village of Pulwama district. Nadeem was killed four days ago after abduction.

Militants yesterday abducted five persons in Shopian district of South Kashmir and slit

one's throat and let off others. Earlier they had killed a man in the area four days ago.

The abducted men were Shahid Ahmad Ganie son of Mohammad Amin of Saidpora Payeen, Farooq Ahmad Thoker son of Abdul Aziz Thoker of Saidpora Payeen and Huzafi Ashraf alias Raja Qandur son of Mohammad Ashraf of Manngam Kulgam. However, in the evening, two among the three abducted were released while as one among them Huzafi Ashraf, son of Mohammad Ashraf alias Raja Qandur of Manngam Kulgam was killed. His throat slit body was recovered from village Hermain in Shopian.

Two more persons, Akib alias Raja son of Javid Ganie of Meemander and Ishfaq Ahmad of Pudo Meemander, Shopian were abducted and later let off by militants yesterday.

### J&K seeks return of 3 senior IPS officers from MHA

likely to accept request of the State Government as at least 20 more IPS officers of Jammu and Kashmir cadre were on the Central deputation, totaling 23 unless three IPS officers are repatriated to the State Government.

"After the return of three, the State Government was likely to ask for repatriation of more IPS officers from the Central Government especially those who have completed their deputation term or their term was nearing completion to fill shortage of the IPS officers in the State," sources said.

They added that the State Government has also mooted proposal to promote two IPS officers in the rank of SSPs as Incharge DIGs in view of shortage of officers in the rank of DIGs.

As per the proposal, SSP Jammu Vivek Gupta and SSP Organization Suleman Choudhary, the IPS officers of 2007 batch of Jammu

and Kashmir cadre, will be promoted as Incharge DIGs. The post of DIG Udhampur-Reasi range is vacant for about a year. Presently, DIG Jammu-Samba-Kathua range, Bhim Sen Tooty is holding additional charge of the DIG Udhampur-Reasi range.

Twenty IPS officers of Jammu and Kashmir cadre, who will be still on deputation with the Central Government even after the return of three officers, included DR Doley, Navin Aggarwal and SM Sahai, all in the rank of Director Generals of Police, Lalat Indu Mohanti, Rashmi Ranjan Swain, Hemant Kumar Lohia and Pankaj Saxena, all in the rank of Additional Director Generals of Police, SS Khandare, T Namgyal, Mukesh Singh, Sunil Kumar, Vipray Choudhary, Gareeb Dass, Vijay Kumar and Nitish Kumar, all Inspector Generals of Police, Uttam Chand, Sunil Gupta, Sujit Kumar, Abdul Jabbar and Udhay Bhaskar Billa.

### Now, Govt officials to pay delay compensation to MGNREGA workers out of their salaries

fixed for completing various processes from the date of closure of muster sheets to the approval of Fund Transfer Officer," read Government Order No.281-RD & PR issued by Sheetal Nanda, Secretary to Government, Department of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, the copy of which is available with EXCELSIOR.

Laying thrust on strict adherence to the timelines by each stakeholder, the Secretary to Government has mentioned in the order that the delay compensation starts generating after the period defined under Section 3 of the MGNREGA and concerned functionaries responsible for delay shall be liable to pay delay compensation out of their salaries. The instructions in this regard will be passed on to the concerned Drawing and Disbursing Officers and Treasury Officers well in time.

As per the Standard Operating Procedure, before start of work Gram Rozgar Sahayak will collect e-Muster Roll duly authorized by Block Development Officer or PO, verify the same against the job cards and the wage seekers name, pay visit to the worksite and inform the wage seekers who have applied for the job.

Similarly, on closure of Muster Roll, the Gram Rozgar Sahayak will visit the worksite, check the attendance of the workers filled in the e-Muster Roll, complete the e-MR of the

workers who have worked, submit the Muster to the PO or BDO for authorization.

Within two days after the closure of Muster Roll, Gram Rozgar Sahayak will submit the MR copy to the Data Entry Operator placed in the Block office for entry and Data Entry Operator will receive e-MRs from the GRS, check the completeness of the manual attendance entries made in the e-MRs and handover the copies of the e-MRs to Technical Assistant/Junior Engineer for measurement.

Between 3rd to 5th day from the date of closure of MR, Technical Assistant/Junior Engineer will collect e-MR from DEO, visit worksite, take measurement of the work done for the muster period, calculate the wage to be paid and submit the details further. Likewise, on 6th day from the closure of MR, Data Entry Operator will collect the e-MR from the Junior Engineer and generate the wage list for the muster period and push the wage list for the generation of the Fund Transfer Officer.

On 7th day from the closure of MR, the Accountant will complete all the formalities which include digitally signing the FTO and sending the same to the second signatory for approval. On 8th day, Second Signatory Officer (BDO) will verify the FTO vis-à-vis the wage list and push the FTO to the e-FMS server for payment.

### SC dismisses plea of Kathua rape witness

order. In January, an eight-year-old girl from a minority nomadic community was allegedly abducted and gang raped in Jammu and Kashmir's Kathua district.

Petitioner M A Khan had approached the top court alleging that his relative Hussain was tortured in custody by the State police after being arrested in connection with a separate rape case.

Advocate Shoeb Alam, representing the Jammu and Kashmir Police, had last month denied in the top court the allegations levelled in the petition and had said since Hussain has been granted bail, the plea has become infructuous.

On October 22, the court had asked Khan to appear before it on November 13 to respond to the application filed by his advocate seeking his discharge from the case.

"Despite our order dated October 22, the writ petitioner (Khan) has chosen not to appear before this court to respond to the application for discharge filed by Sunil Fernandes, advocate on record for the petitioner. "In the circumstances, the writ petition is dismissed for non-prosecution," the bench said in its November 13 order.

In his plea, Khan had alleged that Hussain was kept in illegal detention by police and was subjected to custodial torture.

The Apex Court had earlier transferred the trial in the Kathua gang rape and murder case from Jammu and Kashmir to Pathankot in Punjab.

The State police's crime branch had filed the main charge sheet against seven persons and a separate charge sheet against a juvenile in a court in Kathua district in the gang rape and murder case. (PTI)

many women were inside at the time of the incident. No CCTV was installed at the premises, preliminary investigations found, he said.

After the incident, the Bhavan was sealed by the police and security was stepped up at other "Nirankari Bhavans" in the state.

Chief Minister Capt Amarinder Singh said the possibility of involvement of ISI-based Khalistani/Kashmiri terrorist groups could not be ruled out.

Amarinder Singh said the State won't let the "forces of terror" to destroy the hard earned peace.

Notably, Punjab had gone through dark days of militancy in the 1980s and early 1990s and faced few terror attacks in recent years including the one in Pathankot over two years ago.

After the incident, the Chief Minister asked the Home Secretary, DG Police, DG Law and Order and DG Intelligence to immediately rush to Village Adliwal, Raja Sansi, to personally supervise the investigations into the grenade attack at Nirankari Bhawan.

Amrinder Singh has also directed the police to immediately enhance security arrangements at all sensitive places in the wake of the explosion.

Forensic teams have been rushed to the spot and all angles were being investigated, said the Chief Minister here, adding that "the possibility of involvement of ISI-based Khalistani/Kashmiri terrorist groups could not be ruled out."

Singh said his Government was "on top of things" and would get to the bottom of the incident soon and ensure that the culprits are apprehended and brought to book.

"Nobody will be allowed to get away with trying to disturb the peace and harmony of the State," he warned.

The Chief Minister has also announced a compensation of Rs five lakh each to the kin of the dead and directed the district administration to provide the best possible medical care, free of cost, to the injured.

The Chief Minister said preliminary investigations had so far revealed that two men, one of them with a flowing beard, with covered faces, allegedly forced their way into the hall by brandishing a pistol. They detained the sewadar, lobbed the grenade into the prayer room, and fled on a motorcycle.

A small crater was formed by the impact of the explosion,

and was being examined by the forensic team. The safety valve of the grenade has also been found and was being examined, he said.

The Chief Minister has meanwhile appealed to the people not to panic and maintain peace and law and order.

"Let us remain calm," he said, adding the Government would ensure there is no chaos in the wake of the incident.

Though the State had been hit by a series of cases of targeted attacks since 2015-16, this was the first attempt, in a long time, to disturb the peace in the State through indiscriminate killings, said the Chief Minister, adding it strengthened the belief that Pakistan was continuing with its nefarious activities to disturb the State's peace.

He pointed out that 15 such terror modules had been busted in the past 18 months, with Kashmiri terror links also indicated in some instances, as evidenced in the arrest of Kashmiri students from Jalandhar and in the Maqsdan police station grenade blast case. Earlier, the DGP said that the incident appears to be a "terrorist act".

"It (this incident) appears to be a terror angle. Because it is against a group (of people) and it is not against any individual. There is no reason to throw a hand grenade on a group of people so we will take it as a terrorist act. Till proven otherwise, prima facie we will take it as that," Suresh Arora said.

Notably, the grenade attack took place amid Punjab being on high alert following an input claiming that "a group of six to seven JeM terrorists were in Punjab and were 'planning' to move to Delhi."

Moreover, the security agencies were also on alert after four persons snatched an SUV from its driver at gunpoint near Madhopur in Punjab's Pathankot district a few days back.

On Friday, Punjab police in Gurdaspur had even pasted posters of Zakir Musa, the chief of Jammu and Kashmir based Ansar Ghazwat-ul-Hind terror outfit with reported links to Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM). Army chief Bipin Rawat had recently warned that attempts were being made to "revive insurgency" in Punjab and had even cautioned that people needed to be careful especially during the festival season to prevent anti-national forces from succeeding in their nefarious designs. (PTI)

After lifting of the day-long blockade by agitating farmers near Dasuya on Jalandhar-Pathankot Section, 11 trains to and from Jammu, which were earlier announced to be diverted via Pathankot-Amritsar-Jalandhar and Jalandhar-Amritsar-Pathankot Section, were also restored to proper route.

Similarly, all the trains, which were earlier short terminated and short originated, were also announced to run on proper route upto proper destination.

Earlier, 11 trains were announced to be diverted, six short terminated and seven short originated.

Pertinent to mention that under the banner of the Sugarcanes Struggle Committee, Dasuya, Bharti

Kisan Union, Doaba, Lok Bhalai Insaaf Welfare Society and Majha Struggle Committee, farmers of Punjab laid siege to the national highway and blocked the rail traffic too since yesterday. The blockade started at 10 am yesterday and continued till this evening. Demanding revised sugar cost, they obstructed the Jalandhar-Jammu rail route near Garna Sahib. All up and down trains on the route were stuck and finally diverted to Jalandhar or Pathankot.

Yesterday, 13 Jammu trains were cancelled and 12 others were diverted while short termination and short origination was ordered for the seven each trains thus causing great inconvenience to thousands of commuters, including Mata Vaishno Devi pilgrims.
