

### 2 boys commit suicide

NEWSHERA, Aug 3: Two boys committed suicide by consuming some poisonous substance in Dhramsal and Nowshera area today.

One Avinash, son of Kewal Krishan, resident of Bareli in Dharamsal area was hospitalized at Sunderbani after he also made similar bid on life. As his condition deteriorated, he died in the hospital. Police was investigating.

### Vikar for close check on power theft

JAMMU, Aug 3: Minister of State for Power, CAPD and Information, Vikar Rasool today visited Gladni Grid Station, Narwal and took stock of the situation of power scenario in Jammu division. He inspected the grid station control room and also reviewed the progress of work on the Data Recovery Centre.

While reviewing the progress on Data Recovery Centre, the Minister directed the executing agency to gear up their men and machinery to complete the construction work within month's time.

The Minister laid special emphasis on maintaining power supply and repairs of damaged transformers on priority basis. He directed PDD to keep close

check on power theft which result in power breakdowns to the much inconvenience of the consumers. He called for minimum curtailment of power so that people may not suffer in the hot summer conditions.

To take stock of availability of food grains in the stores of Food Corporation of India (FCI) and Consumer Affairs and Public Distribution (CA&PD), the Minister also conducted visit of godowns of CAPD at Jammu city and took stock of the availability of essentials.

While inspected CAPD food godowns at Jammu city, the Minister was apprised that there is buffer stock of ration in the stores.

During the inspection, the Minister directed to prepare the estimate for the repair of godowns of CAPD. He also

directed for ensuring timely distribution of essential commodities to the ration holders.

The Minister was informed about the availability of stock position in various godowns of CAPD.

He said that Government is committed to provide adequate necessary required essentials particularly to the consumers of the hilly and far-flung areas and in this connection, the divisional administration is totally alert. However, he asked the CAPD officials to be cautious while lifting the essential commodities from the FCI godowns and there should be no compromise on quality.

The Minister was accompanied by Chief Engineers Ajay Gupta, Shenaz Goni, Director CAPD and other senior officers of CAPD and PDD.

Holi may be celebrated only once in India, but in Britain it is fast catching on as a new rage in the party and clubbing circuit with thousands flocking Holi-themed festivals in the country.

Mass paint fights, where people hurl bags of brightly coloured powder over each other, are being hosted up and down the country.

Thousands of Britons are expected to flock to more Holi-themed festivals in London and Manchester over the next few weeks of the English summer.

Around 15,000 people are expected at Battersea Power Station in London for the Holi One festival today followed by

another event at the same venue next weekend. Another 10,000 are expected to attend an event at Heaton Park, Manchester, later this month.

Britain's Hindu community has also welcomed the new trend. "We are not particularly concerned if people want to have some fun time and enjoy, as Hindu tradition always stands for universal happiness," said Swaminathan Vaidyanathan, the secretary-general of the Hindu Forum of Britain.

Last month, thousands took part in a 5-km fun run here in which they were covered in powdered paint with each passing kilometre.

"The Independent" newspaper reported on a paint-throwing ses-

sion at the Secret Garden Party festival in Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire, last weekend.

### Young girl murdered, body thrown in fields

POONCH, Aug 3: A young girl was murdered by some unknown assailants and her body thrown into maize fields in Mandi-Loran area of district Poonch last night.

Reports said that 24-year-old Shamsad Bi, daughter of Fayaz Mohammed, resident of Danna Duiyan village in Loran had gone to the fields last evening. She went missing and family started searching for her till late evening. The family said that she had gone to attend nature's call and did not return home. They got worried and started searching.

During searches by the family and the villagers her body with marks of violence could be traced in the maize fields away from her house early morning. She was believed to be gagged and some marks were also visible around her neck.

The villagers informed Mandi police about the matter. The police party led by SHO Mandi reached and after examining spot, the body was shifted to Mandi hospital for postmortem. After conducting all the legal formalities and autopsy on the body, it was handed over to the family for last rites.

The police said it would not be fair to say at this stage, whether she was sexually assaulted or not. The postmortem report was yet awaited. The police said that inquest proceedings have been launched. The investigation was in progress. Some people were today detained for questioning in this connection, the police said.

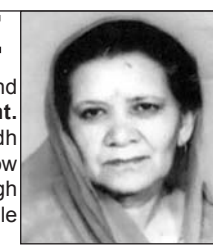

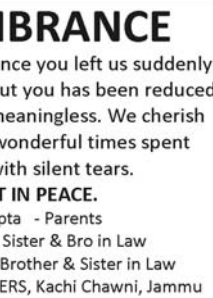
