- The candidates must possess Postgraduate degree in the concerned subject i. e. M.Lib & M.PED, respectively having secured minimum 55% marks (50% in case of Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Physically & visually handicapped candidates).

The recognition of degrees shall be based as per guidelines/policy notified under Govt. Order No.252-HE of 2012 dated 30-05-2012.

The Nodal Principal Kashmir Division shall arrange and conduct a written test for all the eligible candidates. The marks so obtained in the uniform screening test shall only be taken into account for preparation of the merit list. However, the candidates with NET/SLET/Ph.D/M.Phil are exempted from screening test being conducted by the Nodal Principal Kashmir for making academic arrangements in Kashmir Division Colleges.

Terms and conditions:-

- The engagement of Librarians & Physical Training Instructors (PTIs) and Assistants (Librarian/PTI) will be continued 28th of February next year, or till the post is filled up by way of transfer or by appointment of a candidate duly selected by the Public Service Commission whichever is earlier.
- The candidates who are fully qualified and eligible for the post of College Librarians/Physical Training Instructors (PTI) in terms of the existing Recruitment Rules i.e. Postgraduate with NET/SLET or Ph.D/M.Phil are engaged on monthly remuneration of Rs.12,000/-.

Ace shooter Sodhi picked for Khel Ratna, Kohli for Arjuna

NEW DELHI, Aug 13:

Trap shooter Ronjan Sodhi, the first Indian to win two back-to-back World Cup gold medals, was today recommended for the prestigious Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna, while star cricketer Virat Kohli was among the 14 sportspersons picked for the Arjuna award by the selection committee here.

Rising badminton player P V Sindhu, who became the first Indian woman shuttler to clinch a bronze medal at the recent World Championships, was also in the list of 14 sportspersons picked for the Arjuna award, sources said.

Apart from Sindhu, triple-jumper Renjith Maheshwary, who won a bronze medal at the 2010 Commonwealth Games with a national record, and rising golfer Gaganjeet Bhullar were among the sportspersons picked for the Arjuna award this year by the selection committee headed by billionaires legend Michael Ferreira.

Sodhi, who had a disastrous outing at the London Olympics last year, is a former world number one. He was a double trap gold-medallist at last year's Asian Games besides being a silver-medallist at the Commonwealth Games.

Once his name is ratified by the Sports Ministry, the 33-year-old, who was conferred the Arjuna award in 2009, will become the seventh shooter to be honoured with the Khel Ratna.

Interestingly, it is for the third consecutive year that a Khel Ratna award has gone to a shooter. Gagan Narang had been presented the award in 2011, followed by Vijay Kumar last year.

Vijay, a London Olympics silver medallist, was the joint winner along with wrestler Yogeshwar Dutt, who won a bronze at the same event.

This year's Arjuna awardees list features just one boxer, World Championship bronze medallist Kavita Chahal.

The list includes quite a few women with veteran squash player Joshna Chinappa, former hockey

captain Saba Anjum, paddler Mouma Das, wrestler Neha Rathi and shooter Rajkumari Rathore recommended for the award.

Not to forget archer Chekrovolu Swuro, who was part of the silver medal-winning team in the 2011 World Cup.

ICC suspends 7 in BPL fixing scandal

DHAKA, Aug 13:

Cracking down on corruption in the Bangladesh Premier League, the ICC today provisionally suspended seven unnamed individuals for match-fixing-related offences while two others were charged for failing to report "corrupt approaches" that were made to them.

Refusing to divulge the names of the nine individuals, the ICC said disciplinary proceedings have been instituted against them and their identities would be revealed only after the conclusion of the entire process.

"The International Cricket Council and the Bangladesh Cricket Board today announced that following a comprehensive investigation carried out by the ICC's Anti-Corruption and Security Unit, nine individuals have been charged with various offences that are alleged to have been committed under the BCB's Anti-Corruption Code during the 2013 Bangladesh Premier League," the ICC said in a statement.

"The charges relate to an alleged conspiracy within the Dhaka Gladiators franchise to engage in match-fixing and spot-fixing activity during matches in the BPL 2013, as well as failures by individuals to report approaches made to them to be involved in the conspiracy."

Charge letters detailing the allegations have been issued to the relevant individuals. But the ICC

Association (JAA) today lauded the decision to recommended coach Purnima Mahato for the prestigious Dronacharya award and said she was a deserving candidate because of her success with the Indian women's team at the international arena.

Long-serving coach Mahato, along with four others, was recommended for the Dronacharya award this year.

"There is no doubt that Purnima, a former Asian Grand prix gold medallist, deserved the award for her outstanding contribution to promotion and winning medal at international meets for years," L Murthy, Secretary of JAA, said.

Among others, Indian women archery team had won three individual and a team gold in the 2010 Commonwealth games, team bronze medal in last Asian games held in China and silver medal (team event) in World Championship held in Italy under her tutelage. (PTI)
