PDP leader arrested on attempt to murder charge

Police today arrested a People's Democratic Party (PDP) leader in Budgam district on charges of attempt to murder an official of the Wildlife Department on Wednesday.

"Engineer Nazir Ahmad Itoo has been arrested under Section of 307 RPC registered at Chadoora police station," a police spokesman said.

Itoo, general secretary of PDP youth wing, had allegedly try to shoot an official of the Wildlife Department at the house of a five-year-old girl, who was mauled to death by a wild animal on Wednesday, he said.

"The accused person had allegedly taken the weapon from his PSO and tried to shoot the wild life official present at the

house of the deceased girl," the spokesman said. Earlier, Itoo was detained as he was planning to visit riot-hit Kishtwar town, he said.

Condemning the arrest of Itoo, PDP demanded his immediate release and an explanation from the Government for his "illegal confinement".

In a statement, the party chief spokesperson Naeem Akhtar said Itoo was first confined the morning in his house at Badipora and later whisked away to the police station Charisharief where he has been lodged.

"No formal case has so far been registered against Itoo neither has he been informed formally of the reasons for his illegal arrest," Akhtar said before police clarified the grounds of arrest for the PDP leader. (PTI)

Declare Pakistan a terrorist State: BJYM

JAMMU, Aug 16: Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha (BJYM) today protested strongly against the resolution passed by the Pakistan's National Assembly against India on 13th of August.

Despite heavy rain, large number of BJYM activists took out procession from Party Headquarters by raising slogans against Pakistan and burnt Pakistani Flag at Kachi Chawani Chowk.

Addressing the media BJYM State president, Ravinder Raina demanded that India should immediately suspend all its talks with Pakistan.

He said that the entire State of Jammu and Kashmir, including the territory forcibly and illegally occupied by Pakistan is an integral part of India and Government of India should take all steps to vacate the areas of PoJK and the Gilgit-Baltistan from the illegal occupation of Pakistan immediately. Raina said that the resolution passed by the Pakistan's National Assembly vindicated that Pakistan is patronizing the terrorists and pro-

viding them arms training and all other aids to target India. He held it responsible for the killings in Jammu and Kashmir for last 23 years.

He urged the Government of India to declare Pakistan a terrorist State as even after Osama's death, Pakistan continues to shelter people like Hafiz Sayeed, Sheikh Salah-ud-Din, Maulana Azar Massud etc and it explains itself that the country is sponsoring terrorism to bleed India with thousand cuts. He said India should stop all the CBM with Pakistan immediately and should declare Pakistan a terrorist and a rouge State. Prominent among those who took part in the protest were senior BJP leader Yudhvir Sethi, Chander Mohan Gupta, BJYM State Vice President.

Meanwhile BJP held protests at Samba, Vijaypur and Bari Brahmana against Pak resolution and torched the Pakistani flags. At Bari Brahmana the demonstration was led by Chander Parkash Ganga senior vice president BJP, while at Vijaypur it was led by Som Dutt Verma. The protest at Samba was led by Subash Bhagat.

Army man accused of killing wife acquitted

JAMMU, Aug 16: Principal Sessions Judge Jammu, Kartar Singh today acquitted Jasbir Singh, an Army jawan who was allegedly involved in the murder of his wife as prosecution miserably failed to prove the case.

According to the police case, on April 7, 2008 an information was received that the accused Jasbir Singh, who was serving in the Army, inflicted injuries on the face, neck and head of his wife Chinta Devi with the Khokhri with the intention to commit her murder.

On this information, FIR for the commission of offence falling under Section 307 RPC read with Section 425 Arms Act was registered. Later, Chinta Devi succumbed to the injuries. After completion of investigation, police presented challan in the court.

After hearing Advocate O P Sharma appearing for the accused

person whereas PP Shabir Choudhary for the State, Principal Sessions Judge observed, "the statement of the accused was recorded under the provisions of Section 342 CrPC in which he has taken a defence that on the day of the occurrence he was not at home and had gone to Pathankot in connection with his temporary duty".

"Prosecution has miserably failed to prove its case against the accused beyond any reasonable shadow of doubt. The circumstances relied upon by the prosecution connecting the accused with the commission of the alleged offence have not completed the chain so as to exclude the innocence of the accused", the Court said.

"The court is left with no other alternative except to acquit the accused", Principal Sessions Judge said while acquitting the accused of the charges framed against him.

Traders fined

The ADM, who is Adjudication Officer under Food Safety and Standard Act 2006, imposed the penalty on the retailer, Prop M/s Mehra Ice Cream Suresh Kumar S/o Paras Ram R/o W No 7 Ramgarh for selling mis-branded and substandard Ice cream product.

Two criminals held with sharp-edged weapons

JAMMU, Aug 16: Police today arrested two criminals along with sharp-edged weapons in RS Pura area of the winter capital.

A police spokesman said that, on specific inputs, police party from RS Pura Police Station laid a naka at Main Chowk Baspur and intercepted a motorcycle bearing registration Number JKO2AA-3081.

During checking, police recovered two sharp edged weapons (tokka and Khokhri) and arrested two persons, who have been identified as Davinder Kumar, son of Janak Raj of Rangpur Malanya, RS Pura and Rohit Gupta, son of Yashpal, resident of Ward No 5, RS Pura.

A case under FIR number 139/13 under Section 4/25 Arms Act has been registered at RS Pura Police Station and investigation started.

As per the charges, Food Safety Officer took the samples and sent the same to Laboratory for quality test. The test report found the products sub-standard and mis-branded.

The Additional District Magistrate, after hearing Rajan Kapoor, Designated Food Safety Officer and Daleep Singh, Food Safety Officer pronounced the judgment imposing Rs 3000 fine on defaulter.
