Top IM terrorist Yasin Bhatkal arrested on Indo-Nepal border

30 people were killed. He was suspected to be the mastermind of these five blasts.

During the probe, his role was traced back to 2004 as for allegedly distributing explosive material from Karnataka. He is also suspected to have played an active role in the 2006 Mumbai serial train blasts that left 187 people dead.

Yasin, who hails from Bhatkal village of Udupi district in North Karnataka, is wanted in a string of terror attacks in Ahmedabad, Surat, Bangalore, Pune, Delhi and Hyderabad.

It is the second major breakthrough for Indian agencies after the arrest of Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT) bomb expert Abdul Karim Tunda on August 16.

Yasin, who is also wanted in the German Bakery bomb blast in Pune on February 13, 2010, that left 17 dead, formed IM with his brother Riaz and associates Riyaz Shahbandri, Abdul Subhan Qureshi, Sadiq Israr Sheikh and gangster-turned terrorist Amir Reza Khan.

The IM, patronised by Pakistan-based LeT, was designated a terrorist group by the government under the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act in June, 2010. The banned outfit was declared by the US as a Foreign Terrorist Organisation in 2011.

Government sources said Yasin was planning to go to Bangladesh from Nepal to meet his contacts there.

In Patna, Additional Director General of Police (Headquarters) Ravindra Kumar told reporters that Yasin and his associate Asadulla Akhtar alias Haddi were arrested near Nahar Chowk in Raxaul sub-division of Bihar's East Champaran district on the Indo-Nepal border, around 100 km from Patna.

This followed inputs that they were plotting a terror strike, he said.

Yasin, also known as Mohd Zazar Ahmed Siddhibappa, along with three aides Tahaseen Akhtar Wasim Aqar Shaikh (23), Asadulla Akhtar (26) and Waqas alias Ahmed (26), was allegedly behind three coordinated bomb explosions at Opera House, Zaveri Bazaar and Dadar West in Mumbai on July 13, 2011, that left 27 dead and 130 injured.

Except Tahaseen, who allegedly planted a bomb in the Dadar blast, the rest three were also suspected to have played a role in the four co-ordinated low-intensity explosions, which struck the busy arterial road in the heart of Pune city on August 1, 2012. Eight accused had been arrested in this connection.

Tahaseen hails from Samastipur in Bihar while Asadullah is from Azamgarh in Uttar Pradesh.

Yasin was spotted on Close Circuit television minutes ahead of German bakery blast in Pune as also in Hyderabad earlier this year.

Former Home Secretary R K Singh said Yasin has been the most active terrorist in the IM. "He himself was a bomb planter, organiser and he was infact one of the most potent terrorists in that (IM) stable," Singh said.

"We have been after him. Catching him, therefore, I think, is a great success," he said.

The former Home Secretary said Bhatkal gave the agencies slip at least twice earlier.

"Once it was said he was arrested in Kolkata but they (security agencies) did not have his identity and he managed to get bail and on another occasion again, our agencies had worked out a plan but he managed to give a slip," Singh said.

In Bangalore, Karnataka police said it will seek Yasin's custody to question him on his role in terror attacks in Bangalore.

Meanwhile, against the backdrop of IM founder Yasin Bhatkal's arrest, India today hoped that the thinking in Pakistan will change as per the assurances given by Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif and also voiced expectation that all those wanted here would be handed over.

The days when those who indulged in terror activities managed to find "safe havens" in other parts of world are over as the thinking of the people is changing. External Affairs Minister Salman Khurshid told reporters outside Parliament.

He was asked if he felt that the thinking in Pakistan also has changed.

"We hope that their (thinking) will change. Their Prime Minister says that the results of the elections just held are an indicator that there is a change in the thinking of people in Pakistan. If this is so, we welcome it," Khurshid said.

"But we have had to wait for a long and testing time for this day...For complete satisfaction, there is a long list, all of them should be arrested and presented to the court. Those who fall in our hands, should be given to us, only then we will feel we are satisfied," he said.

Khurshid said not just in Pakistan, any country from where such elements are being "flushed out" is a welcome development.

"Wherever they are being flushed out, we welcome it. But it is not that this change of heart has happened by itself, it had happened because of our efforts. About the efforts we speak sometimes, but don't give all the details so that the attempts being made are not scuttled," Khurshid said.

"There is a long list...We should be able to hold answerable all those in the list...Such efforts on our part have been there...Our intention is not to speak on this issue just for getting cheap publicity. This is a serious issue and we understand our responsibility. Our effort will be to get full satisfaction for the country on the issue," he said. (PTI)

Govt extends Sagheer CSC term till mid-Feb 2014

The Government had reconstituted the CSC on February 18 after the Ministry reshuffle and replaced Qamar Ali Akhoun and Surjit Singh Slathia (both from NC) with Law and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Saifullah Mir and Planning Minister Ajay Sadhotra.

The Committee headed by Finance Minister Abdul Rahim Rather now comprised Rural Development and Panchayati Raj Minister Ali Mohammad Sagar, Mr Mir and Mr Sadhotra (all from NC), Housing Minister Raman Bhalla, PHE Minister Sham Lal Sharma, Urban Development Minister Rigzin Jora and Medical Education Minister Taj Mohi-ud-Din (all from Congress).

Sources said the Congress Ministers were determined to oppose the National Conference move of submitting pro-autonomy recommendations by the CSC. Sources said the Congress Ministers have made it clear to their National Conference colleagues in the CSC that they stand for Indira-Sheikh accord for basis to any solution to Kashmir problem and not autonomy.

However, Sagheer Ahmad Working Group had recommended autonomy as a solution to Kashmir problem.

The National Conference is a strong supporter of autonomy.

Sources said with Parliament and Assembly elections due next year, both the parties didn't want to dilute their stand and there was every possibility that the standoff between two Alliance partners in the CSC would continue during the meetings.

Sources said the CSC in its previous meetings had done a lot of work and reached consensus on some of the issues but the differences persisted on autonomy.

Centre faces SC ire in Coalgate

NEW DELHI, Aug 29:

The Centre today faced ire of the Supreme Court on missing files on Coalgate and for not sharing information with CBI and was directed to hand over relevant documents within two weeks to the agency which would also probe disappearance of certain vital papers.

Holding that the missing documents are "vital" for the probe in the scam, the apex court directed the Coal Ministry to lodge complaint with the CBI if it fails to trace any documents, sought by the agency.

"You (Centre) cannot do like this. Your explanation that files are being searched is not reasonable. This will not help," a three-judge bench headed by Justice R M Lodha said.

The bench slammed the Government for not lodging FIRs on missing files and raised a question as to whether "it is an attempt to destroy the records in the case."

"Four months have passed. Have you filed an FIR for missing files. Is it an attempt to destroy the records. Truth must come out," the bench, also comprising Justices Madan B Lokur and Kurian Joseph, said while noting that missing documents pertain to financial aspects of the allocations.

"This cannot be left as it is. Why a case has not been registered so far? Proper report has to be lodged to find out whether it has been stolen or destroyed. This cannot be allowed. Some investigation has to be done on the issue," the bench said.

"For any reason if files are not available or lost or stolen or destroyed, tell us when will you lodge a complaint with CBI," the bench asked Attorney General G E Vahanvati, who, appearing for the Coal Ministry, assured that the Ministry would do the needful if documents are not traced.

The bench then asked the CBI to give a list of documents, files, information, sought by it, within five days to the Coal Ministry which, in turn, would furnish them within two weeks thereafter.

If any documents remain untraceable, then FIRs have to be lodged by the Coal Ministry with the CBI within a week thereafter, it said.

The Centre had earlier admitted before the apex court that 189 out of 236 documents sought by CBI, which is probing coal block allocations scam, were "not-available".

Giving details of missing documents, the Coal Ministry had said 7 files, 173 applications of coal block allotees/ applicants and nine other documents were being searched by it.

In a hearing that spanned over two hours, the bench said there cannot be any "justification for the missing files" and that CBI probe be done despite an inter-ministerial committee formed by the Centre to look into the issue.

The bench also referred to the disappearance of a PMO's reference letter to the Coal Ministry relating to Congress MP Vijay Darda's alleged recommendations for coal block allocations to some firms.

"It is an external committee. We are not concerned about it. Before the CBI probe into the case, we grant time to the Centre to find out files. If files are not available, then you lodge a complaint with CBI," the bench said.

The bench then took the Government to task for "sitting over" the documents sought by CBI in the case. (PTI)
