asked to seek fresh registration from Srinagar which is a cumbersome and time consuming exercise for them. Instead of asking these pilgrims to go to Srinagar the fresh registration counters be opened at Pahalgam and Baltal to facilitate them hassle free pilgrimage, sources added.

Sources said that the rush is considerably less this year than last year when record number of pilgrims numbering from twenty to twenty five thousand used to perform darshan in cave shrine daily.

A fresh batch of 2,168 pilgrims left Bhagwati Nagar base camp for the holy cave early this morning under security cover in a cavalcade of 81 vehicles.

These yatis included 1,525 male, 460 female, 35 children and 148 Sadhus. They left in 48 buses and 33 LMVs. The convoy, had crossed the Jawahar tunnel by this evening and were on their way to the next destinations.

This was the fifth batch of pilgrims to holy cave from Bhagwati Nagar base camp.

Meanwhile Shri Amarnathji Shrine Board (SASB) has yet again appealed to all those who intend to undertake the pilgrimage to ensure that they complete the necessary registration formalities and obtain a valid yatra permit before they embark on the pilgrimage to avoid inconvenience on arrival in the State, as no yatri who does not possess a valid Yatra Permit shall be allowed to cross beyond Nunwan and Baltal base camps under any circumstances.

Navin K. Choudhary, Chief Executive Officer, SASB, reiterated the importance of strictly

enforcing the Board's decision against any unregistered pilgrim being allowed to undertake the Yatra and stated that this is all the more important keeping the recent Uttarakhand tragedy in view.

It is pertinent to recall that for this year's Yatra, the Shrine Board has fixed a ceiling of 7500 yatis per day per route and, besides, the 1000 plus pilgrims who travel by the Helicopter services up to Panjtarni.

Mr Choudhary stressed the directions of the Governor N N Vohra who is also the Chairman of SASB that this number must not be exceeded under any circumstances and urged the intending pilgrims to take note of it. He also stressed that the pilgrims must embark on the Yatra strictly as per the dates and the routes specified in their Yatra Permits, clarifying that the Yatra Permits for this year's pilgrimage are of different colour, for each day of the week and route, to facilitate Police personnel deployed at the Access Control Gates at Domel and Chandanwari in determining whether a yatri possesses Yatra Permit valid for the relevant date and route.

In this context, he cautioned the intending yatis against undertaking this arduous yatra without first securing a valid Yatra Permit. He said that for ensuring effective security arrangements along the difficult tracks, only those yatis who are in possession of a yatra permit, which is valid for a specified date and route, will be allowed to proceed beyond the base camps, and cross the Access Control Gates at Domel and Chandanwari.

Two more drugs found spurious

ous drug scam early April this year leading to registration of cases against suppliers and manufacturers of Maximizane-625 drug that was supplied to hospitals across Kashmir valley. The anti-biotic tested negative for Amoxicillin while the company had claimed that it contains 500 milligram of Amoxicillin.

The drug, Maximizane 625 milligram, along with several other drugs were chosen in random sampling for laboratory testing by the Drug Controller Kashmir during winter. The drugs were sent to the laboratory for testing and the anti-biotic tested negative as the laboratory report revealed that it contains "NIL" Amoxicillin. The drug contained Zero milligrams of Amoxicillin tri-hydrate while the company claims that it contains 500 milligrams of Amoxicillin tri-hydrate + 125 milligrams clavulanic acid.

Following the expose and outcry across the State, the Union Health and Family Welfare Minister, Ghulam Nabi Azad sent an 11-member team from the CDSO to the Jammu and Kashmir to investigate the quality of drugs being supplied to the Government run hospitals and those available in the open market.

A team of experts from CDSO headed by Deputy Drug Controller (North Zone)

Dr K Bangarurajan visited various hospitals of the State and collected samples of 131 drugs as part of the investigation ordered by the Union Health Ministry into the spurious drug scam.

In the meantime the Assistant Solicitor General of India (ASGI), S A Makroo today filed status report of the CDSO before the Jammu and Kashmir High Court.

Makroo told the court that the CDSO has received samples of 25 drugs and two of them were found spurious.

The Division bench of the Jammu and Kashmir High Court comprising Chief Justice M M Kumar and Justice Yaqub Mir while hearing the case, directed the ASGI to update the status report before the next date of hearing of the case on July 12.

The Advocate General of the State, Mohammad Ishaq Qadri, sought 4 weeks time from the court as the Government has to accord sanction for the prosecution of the government employees who are involved in the drug scam.

Qadri told the court that the State has filed its status report in which it is mentioned that 25 persons were challaned in the drug scam case. He told the court that six persons have not yet responded to the charge-sheet.

Over 2 years elapse, fate of Bill to prohibit conversion of agri land hanging in balance

may not arrive at a consensus on the vital issue keeping in view the enormous exercise it has to carry out before arriving at any conclusion".

It is pertinent to mention here that the bill has proposed complete ban on the conversion and alienation of agricultural land except with the written permission, which may be granted to the extent of 2 kanal for residential, commercial, industrial and public utility purposes.

"Before proposing new legislation the Government should have kept in mind that it has several laws in force which prohibit conversion of any type of agricultural land for non agricultural purposes", sources said, adding "if at all new provisions were required to be enacted suitable amendments in the existing laws should have been carried out".

"Under Jammu and Kashmir Land Revenue Act there is a complete prohibition

on converting of paddy or vegetable lands, floating fields etc into any other use. Similarly, Jammu and Kashmir Prohibition on Conversion of Land and Alienation of Orchards Act doesn't permit conversion of paddy land into orchards and sale of orchards beyond four kanal without permission", sources said.

They further informed that Jammu and Kashmir Agrarian Reforms Act also imposes restriction on the utilization of orchards for any other use. "Till the fate of the bill to prohibit conversion of agricultural land for non-agricultural purposes is decided the concerned agencies should ensure strict implementation of existing laws so that shrinking of agricultural land could be checked", sources said. "No doubt land is needed for developmental purposes but the land exclusively classified for agricultural purposes needs to be protected from being used for other purposes," sources added.

Strike paralyses life, AGS set afire

Sheikh said around 4.00 am, he and other drivers heard firing shots and after some time they heard wails of women. Asked if army personnel had opened firing, Sheikh said "I did not see it. I only heard the gunshots."

Shops, business establishments, educational institutions, banks and private offices remained closed due to the strike. Public transport was off the roads in most parts of the Valley. Attendance in Government offices was thin due to the strike.

Police and paramilitary CRPF personnel have been

deployed in numbers in Sumbal, Hajin, Naidkhai and adjoining areas to maintain law and order. There were curfew like restrictions in the area to prevent any clashes.

Protesters today tried to set an Army Goodwill School (AGS) on fire in Hajin area of Bandipora district in Kashmir in the wake of killing of two youth.

A police spokesman said: "A group of miscreants tried to set on fire a school building at Hajin but the blaze was put out by fire tenders in time." He said there was no major damage done to the building by the miscreants who were chased away by law enforcing agencies.

However, reports said furniture of two class rooms was damaged in the incident.

Diesel prices hiked by 50 paise a litre from midnight

NEW DELHI, July 1:

Oil Marketing Companies will increase their retail selling price of High Speed Diesel by 50 paise a litre, excluding VAT, from midnight tonight.

The OMCs were authorised to increase retail price by a small range every month until further orders from January this year.

The reason given for the hike in prices was that the under-recovery on sale of

Retail HSD was steadily rising mainly due to depreciation in Rupee value coupled with increasing international crude prices.

Even after this increase, the under-recovery on retail HSD will be of the order of Rs 8.10/litre, an Indian Oil release said.

Last week, the retail prices of petrol had been increased by Rs 1.80 a litre due to the same reasons cited for diesel. (UNI)

December 16 gangrape case: IO denies fabricating evidence

NEW DELHI, July 1:

The trial in the December 16 gangrape case today resumed in a Delhi court after the summer vacation with the investigating officer (IO) rejecting the allegation that she had fabricated evidence.

"It is wrong to suggest that all the accused persons were falsely implicated in the present case," the lady IO, who had initially probed the case, told Additional Sessions Judge Yogesh Khanna.

The officer also refuted the allegation that accused Vinay Sharma was a juvenile at the time of the incident or that he had shown her the clippings of a musical function where he was allegedly present on December 16, 2012 night, when the 23-year-old girl was gangraped by the six persons in a moving bus here.

The six accused have also brutally assaulted the victim's male friend, a software engineer, with a iron rod and later dumped both of them on the road side.

"It is wrong to suggest that accused Vinay was juvenile at the time of the incident or that his parents told me so. It is wrong to suggest that Vinay ever showed me the clippings of a musical show in which he was present on the day of the incident," the officer told the court.

She also denied the allegation that accused Akshay Singh was falsely implicated in the case as he was not present in Delhi at the time of commission of the crime.

"It is wrong to suggest that accused Akshay Singh was not present inside the bus at the time of the incident or that he was not in Delhi on that day," she said in response to the cross-examination by the lawyers for Akshay and Vinay.

Now, device that detects presence of bacteria within minutes

LONDON, July 1:

Scientists have developed a matchbox-sized device that can test for the presence of bacteria in a couple of minutes, instead of up to several weeks.

The device can be used to determine if a bacteria has been effectively treated by an antibiotic, a crucial medical tool especially for resistant strains. It could also prove useful for testing chemotherapy treatment, researchers believe.

It works by a nano-lever that vibrates in the presence of bacterial activity, while a laser reads the vibration and translates it into an electrical signal that can be easily read - the absence of a signal signifies the absence of bacteria.

"This method is fast and accurate. And it can be a precious tool for both doctors looking for the right dosage of antibiotics and for researchers to determine which treatments are the most effective," said Giovanni Dieterl from Ecole Polytechnique Federale de Lausanne (EPFL) in Switzerland.

It currently takes a long time to measure a bacterial infection's response to antibiotic treatment.
