300 terrorists active in J&K, infiltration up: HM

Home Ministry.

In a presentation at the meeting of the Consultative Committee for Home Ministry today, it said efforts from Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir based elements to spawn enhanced level of violence in the State by scaling up infiltration and smuggling of arms and ammunition from across the LoC continue.

"In 2012, 264 terrorists attempted infiltration from across the LoC as compared to 247 in 2011. Also, there was a rise in instances of successful infiltration as compared to previous years with 121 terrorists entering Jammu and Kashmir in 2012 as compared to 52 in 2011," the Home Ministry told the Consultative Committee members.

Meanwhile, ministry sources said there have been increased attempts by militant groups based in PoK to send extremists into Jammu and Kashmir in recent weeks.

Though few militants have been successful to sneak into Jammu and Kashmir, most of the infiltration attempts have been foiled by security forces deployed along the border, sources said citing intelligence

inputs. They said as of now around 250 to 300 militants are active in the state and are waiting for opportunities to disturb peace in the State.

Besides, there were incidents of violation of ceasefire along the Line of Control by Pakistani troops ostensibly to facilitate infiltration into Jammu and Kashmir.

Last fortnight, eight Army soldiers were killed and 11 others injured in a gunfight with a group of terrorists in Bemina on the outskirts of Srinagar.

A Junior Commissioned Officer was killed when Pakistan opened heavy fire with automatic weapons and rockets on Indian posts along the LoC in Poonch sector last month.

Pakistani troops had pounded Indian posts along LoC in the Poonch sector with rockets in May. A Brigadier and two jawans were injured when Pakistani troops opened fire on Indian positions along the LoC in Tutmari Gali sector in Jammu and Kashmir.

On June 26, two militants were killed as Army troops foiled an infiltration bid along the LoC in Rajouri district of Jammu and Kashmir. (PTI)

as of now. "We will be then present also in places where we don't have a general consulate or embassy including Srinagar. So that should be much easier," he said.

"The good news is that we will change the (visa) system. We will outsource huge parts of the system to get visa. This will start in half a year," Steiner said. He admitted that the present system of obtaining a German visa was cumbersome for people living in areas where there is no embassy of consulate of the country.

The German Ambassador during his interaction with students highlighted the importance of Indo-German relations and symbiotic relation between the two countries. "There is deep connection between the German language and Sanskrit, Urdu and Kashmiri language which might not be so apparent to the mind," he said.

Steiner asked the students to avail the opportunities of higher education in Germany as there are number of scholarships on offer to deserving candidates. "I think the Kashmiris should never abandon Kashmir. They should always have in mind that what they learn outside they also learn for their homeland. They should think of coming back to the country and really contribute," he said.

Steiner said number of initiatives have been taken to strengthen the ties between Germany and India which includes introduction of German language in 1000 schools in India. "The results are encouraging for the fact that not only are

No official authority can comment on court orders: CJ

As the proceedings of the case began today, the Chief Justice asked Advocate General for Commissioner of SMC. Qasba immediately stood up before the court.

The CJ asked Qasba: "Are you not attending the academy for training. You have done a blunder which no educated person can do. Don't you know how to deal with the legal proceedings."

The Chief Justice while passing an order said that fault of others can not be passed on to the court. "The Commissioner SMC personally apologized to the Court. The Deponent undertakes that in future no such mistake shall be committed or allowed to happen in future", the order reads.

Yatris face problems, get separate registration dates

afford the exorbitant rates in the hotels.

Same was the story of another group of 46 pilgrims from Jaipur, Rajasthan. Hanumat Sharma, head of the group who is camping at Pahalgam, said they were given different dates of darshan and it was not possible for them to go on three different dates and wait for over one more week. He said some pilgrims of the group were given darshan date of today, others of July 5 and July 7 respectively.

He said the group is camping at Pahalgam in the open for last two days and the authorities are not bothered for them.

These yatris have demanded that the fresh registration counters be opened at Pahalgam and Baltal and the yatris should not be asked to go Srinagar for the registration as it is a cumbersome process for them.

He said in a strange development Kishore Kumar, a pilgrim in their group was given darshan date of July 2 via Nunwan while his wife was given date of July 4 via Baltal. Same way, Mohit, another pilgrim in the group was given darshan date of July 3 via Pahalgam and his 55 year old mother was given the darshan date of July 7.

"This is a big confusion and the yatris feel totally harassed," he said, adding the administration should take immediate steps to put the system in order.

He said in the base camps only those pilgrims are allowed entry who had to leave for darshan next day while those who had reached one or two days in advance have to stay in open or book the private rooms or hotels which are costly as the exorbitant rates are being charged from yatris at Pahalgam.

He demanded that SASB should make arrangements for yatris stay at Pahalgam as well as Baltal who reach there one or two days in advance of darshan.

Meanwhile, a fresh batch of 12, 165 pilgrims performed darshan in holy cave on fifth day of yatra till last reports came in today. With this a total number of 63,457 pilgrims have performed darshan in holy cave since the

yatra started on June 28. Till yesterday 51,292 pilgrims had performed darshan in holy cave.

The weather enroute to cave remained partially cloudy, an official spokesman said.

He said 6,504 pilgrims left for holy cave from Nunwan Base camp via traditional Chandanwari track while 4,906 left via shorter Baltal track and 785 went by air.

He said the yatris who performed darshan in the cave shrine were on their way to Baltal and Pahalgam to return to their homes.

A fresh batch of 1,785 pilgrims left Bhagwati Nagar Yatri Nivas the base camp in winter capital for holy cave early this morning under tight security arrangements.

These pilgrims included 1,395 male, 326 female, 14 children and 50 Sadhus. The cavalcade of 70 vehicles carrying these pilgrims had crossed the Jawahar Tunnel by the evening and were on their way to their next destinations, the spokesman added.

This was the sixth batch of yatris leaving from Bhagwati Nagar since 55 day long yatra started from Jammu on June 27.

At Bhagwati Nagar Base Camp, Ram Sena president Rajiv Mahajan along with other activists of his organization today donated nine blood pressure machines and 1000 Lasix injections to the Medical aid Centre at a simple function.

Mr Mahajan said that this step was taken as the Medical Department was not having adequate BP machines to examine the yatris.

Meanwhile INTUC leader Pushkar Nath Pandita who visited Nunwan camp today said that no proper arrangements of medicare facilities in the camp have been made for yatris. He also demanded opening of fresh registration counters at Pahalgam and Baltal with boarding and lodging arrangements at two base camps for unregistered yatris or those pilgrims who come in advance to the date of darshan to relieve them of the problems being faced by them.

4 students killed, 5 hurt in Leh

Later, six injured persons including driver of the ill-fated vehicle were rushed to District Hospital Leh where one of them succumbed to injuries raising the toll in the accident to four. The condition of five injured was stated to be critical when reports last came in.

All the eight students travelling in the ill-fated vehicle were returning to their native places in the Leh district after participating in the NET examination held at Jammu yesterday.

Rs 100 cr worth cash, gold seized

The cash and jewellery were believed to be unaccounted for. Ironically, the courier consignment was being escorted by the Mumbai police personnel, who claimed that it was a regular practice to provide escorts to 'angadias' (private couriers) carrying cash and high valuables to prevent dacoities.

A senior police official said that it is not the police's responsibility to verify whether the cash and jewellery were accounted for or not.

Kumar said that counting is still on by about 50 Income Tax officers.

An assessment of the total worth of the seized cash, gold and diamond jewellery would be available only after that

"IT officials are investigating the source of funds and where it was meant for. Only if there is a terror angle, the case will be handed over to the Mumbai police," he said.

Kumar said the I-T Department got a tip-off that unaccounted cash and jewellery was being transported in the trucks leading to the raid of the vehicles. Officials will now ascertain whether the seized goods were accounted for or not after the valuation exercise underway.

As per information received by them, the cash seized was unaccounted for, he added. (PTI)
