Police registers FIR in negligent death

KATHUA, July 12: Police today registered a FIR against the doctor on duty in District Hospital Kathua whose alleged negligence led to the death of Punjab Singh, 50, an ex-serviceman from village Chak Ram Chand near Bagyal in Kathua district yesterday.

According to police the FIR was registered on the basis of complaint of relatives and people of the village that Punjab Singh died due to the negligence of doctor in the District Hospital Kathua.

The Police has registered the FIR number 255, under Section 304 against the doctor on duty. It may be recalled that the Directorate of Health has also constituted a Board of Doctors to probe the matter.

Youth dies in truck-bike collision

RAJOURI, July 12: A youth was killed while his associate critically injured after their bike collided with a truck near Manjakote on Jammu-Poonch Highway late this evening.

A police spokesman said that the mishap took place at around 8 pm when the truck No. JK02R/1149 was on way to Poonch from Jammu. Two youth were travelling to Rajouri from Surankote on a motorcycle. At Deri Langiot village in Manjakote area, their bike met head on collision with the truck coming from the opposite direction.

While Basharat Qazi, son of Mushtaq Hussain, resident of Rajouri was killed on the spot, his associate Aqib, son of Abdul Rehman, resident of Rajouri town was critically injured. The police shifted him to Rajouri Hospital where doctors referred him to GMC Hospital, Jammu. The body of other youth was also removed to Rajouri Hospital for postmortem. The police seized the truck while its driver and cleaner escaped from the spot after mishap. A case was registered in this connection by police.

Acting swiftly, Miran Sahib Police arrested the thief from Railway Station Jammu, when he was about to flee, he said, adding that the stolen cash was also recovered from his possession.

A case under FIR number 75/13 under Section 380 RPC has been registered at Miran Sahib Police Station and investigation started.

Illicit liquor seized, woman drug peddler among 2 held

REASI, July 12: In separate cases, Reasi Police seized illicit liquor from the two bootleggers at holy town Katra and Talwara, here today.

The accused persons have been identified as Sanjay of Chak Bhagta in Katra and Bimbla Devi wife of Kamal Singh of Dugga tehsil Mahore.

Reports said that during checking at holy town Katra where the liquor is totally banned, police recovered 15 nips of 250 mls of J&K Excise liquor from the possession of Sanjay who was selling the same in the market on exorbitant rates. A case U/S 48 (a) Excise Act has been registered at Police Station Katra against the arrested accused.

In other case, Police recovered 53 nips of 180 mls of J&K Excise liquor from the possession of woman drug peddler who was selling the same in the Talwara market.

Court stays expulsion of founder member from JKDPN

Couple held for murder

DODA, July 12: Bhaderwah Police today worked out a murder and arrested a couple within short-est possible time.

Police spokesman said that following recovery of dead body of one Abdul Latief, son of Ghulam Mohd of Chinar Mohalla, Bhaderwah from the fields this morning, police started investigation.

During the course of investigation, it came to fore that deceased was frequently visiting the 'Jhuggi' of a brick kiln worker namely Salak Ram Manohwar, son of Sadhu Ram of Jarwa of Chhattisgarh. Accordingly, police took Salak Ram into custody and put him to sustained interrogation. During questioning, Salak

Ram revealed that Abdul Latief had come to his 'Jhuggi' late last night and tried to molest his wife over the trifle issue, which led to scuffle between them. During the course of fight, Salak Ram and his wife Pinki Devi hit Abdul Latief with wooden log leading to latter's death on the spot.

In order to dodge the police, Salak Ram and his wife Pinki Devi threw the body of Abdul Latief in the fields. However, their designs were foiled by Bhaderwah Police under the direct supervision of SP Doda, Arif Rishu.

Salak Ram and his wife Pinki Devi have been arrested and a case under Section 302 RPC has been registered against them at Bhaderwah Police Station.

Cong meet to discuss strategy for early rollout of Food Bill

NEW DELHI, July 12: Strategy for an early rollout of the Food Security Bill in Congress-ruled states will be deliberated at a meeting of party chief ministers called by Sonia Gandhi here tomorrow.

The meeting is being held at a time when the party is projecting the scheme seeking to provide cheap foodgrains to 82 crore people as a game changer in the 2014 Lok Sabha polls.

Delhi, where assembly polls are due by the year-end will be the first state to roll out the scheme on August 20, the birth anniversary of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi.

As many as 34 party leaders, including chief ministers of 14 Congress-ruled states, AICC general secretaries and members of Congress Core Group, have been invited for the meeting tomorrow.

Prime Minister Manmohan Singh, party Vice President Rahul Gandhi and Food Minister K V Thomas will be present during the deliberations.

The idea is to ensure that the scheme is implemented in the best possible manner with Congress-ruled states becoming role models in implementation of the food security measure.

The meeting has been called days after the Government rushed through an ordinance on the key measure, which is an indication that the party is keen to pull out all the stops in propagating the food security scheme that will provide right to cheap foodgrains to 82 crore people.

Sujata Singh to be OSD MEA

NEW DELHI, July 12: Foreign Secretary designate Sujatha Singh has been appointed Officer on Special Duty (OSD) in the External Affairs Ministry till she assumes the new charge after Mr Ranjan Mathai retires on July 31.

"The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet has approved the appointment of Ms Sujatha Singh, Ambassador of India to Germany, as Officer on Special Duty in the Ministry of External Affairs in the rank and pay of Secretary with effect from July 15 and till her assumption of charge as Foreign Secretary," an official statement said today.

In other appointments announced by the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC), Anup Wadhawan, Joint Secretary in the Department of Economic Affairs has been posted as Joint Secretary, Department of Financial Services, in place of Mr Umesh Kumar.

Also, K P Krishnan, at present in the cadre, has been appointed Director General and Additional Secretary, Directorate of Currency, Department of Economic Affairs, by reviving the post to its original level and in relaxation of cooling-off requirement. (UNI)

Gagan new spokesman of Young Panthers

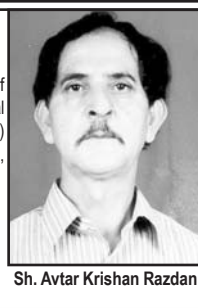
