

Samiullah guides Khazir Royals to big win
Vimarsh slams gutsy fifty in
Sachdeva Leopards victory

SRINAGAR, July 15: Gritty opening batsman Vimarsh Kaw slammed power-packed half-century to help Sachdeva Leopards trounce Surya Risers by a narrow margin of 13 runs in the ongoing Big-GK Jammu and Kashmir Corporate Premier League (JKCPL) at Bijbehara today.

Earlier, winning the toss and batting first, Sachdeva Leopards, rode on a magnificent knock of 58 runs by Vimarsh

Kaw scored a decent total of 175 runs in the stipulated 20 overs. Putting rival bowlers on a leather-hunt, Kaw took just 29 balls for his brisk knock, hitting 10 superbly timed boundaries and 2 towering sixes. Mohsin Ramzan and Mudasir Gojri contributed 28 and 22 runs to the total respectively. Mudasir in particular was explosive, who hit 3 fours and one six in his 6-ball knock. For Surya Risers, Nitin Mehra and Rompy Sharma took 2 wickets each, while skip-

per Ian Dev Singh and Abhishek Slathia claimed one wicket each.

In reply, Surya Risers managed to score 162 runs for the loss of 7 wickets in the allotted overs, thus falling short of 13 runs to lose the match by the same margin. Nitin Mehra scored 42 runs off 23 balls with the help of 4 fours and 2 sixes, while Bansi Lal and Ashwani Bhat contributed 34 runs to the total. For Sachdeva Leopards, Asif Rasool, Kumail and Javid Mir claimed 2 wickets each, while Ajaz Hajam bagged one. Vimarsh Kaw was adjudged HDFC man of the match, while Mudasir Gojri was awarded for hitting maximum sixes.

In another match played at Kashmir University Grounds, Khazir Royals defeated Centac Stars by 51 runs in an easy contest.

Batting first, Khazir Royals scored 153 runs in the stipulated 20 overs. Jahangir Bhat and Sameer Haroon contributed 45 and 36 runs to the total respectively. Wasim Raza was the pick of the bowlers for Centac Stars who claimed 2 wickets.

In reply, Centac Stars, bundled out for 102 runs in 19.4 overs, thus lost the match by 51 runs. Aamir was the top scorer with 24 runs. Skipper Samiullah Beigh was the wrecker-in-chief for Khazir Royals, who clinched 3 important wickets, while Rahil Singh bagged 2 wickets. Samiullah Beigh was adjudged man of the match, while Sameer Haroon was awarded for hitting maximum sixes.

Indian boxers win
nine medals in Serbia

NEW DELHI, July 15:

It turned out to be a field day for India's young pugilists as they punched their way to an unprecedented nine medals, including four gold, in the Golden Glove of Vojvodina – an international boxing tournament being held in Kikinda, Serbia.

A Silambarasan (52kg), who was declared the 'Best Fighter of the Tournament', and Manish Solanki (69kg) bagged the yellow metal in the men's section while Rajesh Kumari (48kg) and Chanda Udanshive (51kg) did likewise in the women's division.

Youth World Championships bronze medal winner Lalitha Prasad (49kg) and reigning national champion Neeraj Parashar (64kg) had to be content with silver medals after losing their respective title bouts.

Also winning silver were Marthamma Sattivada (64kg), Diksha (91kg) and Pema Chotan (+91kg).

Silambarasan, a silver medallist in the 2012 Agloray Cup, continued his form in the tournament as he

edged past Scotsman Stephen Boyle in the flyweight division. Both the pugilists played a very similar style of boxing and started off with an electric pace with neither ready to back down.

Action continued in a similar vein in the second and third round with not much separating the two. In the end though the relentless attacking of the Indian paid off as he was declared the winner, the two-time silver medal winner at the Junior Nationals winning on a unanimous decision.

Welter weight boxer Solanki also displayed great class as he beat local lad Stanoevic Lazar. His technical superiority coupled with nimble footwork was the difference between the two. The 2012 Junior Nationals bronze medallist went on to claim his first international medal with a victory on a unanimous decision.

Up against Russian Perminov Iliia, 17-year-old Prasad put up a strong show with his counter attacks and piercing jabs before going down on a split decision. (PTI)

India captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni was extending all possible help to the inventor of his famous helicopter shot and one of his close childhood friend Santosh Lal, who has been diagnosed with acute pancreatitis and was airlifted to Delhi today for treatment.

"Former Ranji cricketer Santosh Lal was taken to Delhi by air ambulance and admitted to a hospital there. Besides Dhoni, all his friends have come forward in helping him fight his disease. Dhoni is in touch and helping in making all necessary arrangements for the treatment," said a close friend of Dhoni.

Lal, a Ranji player, has been identified with acute pancreatitis and was admitted in a unconscious state at a Ranchi hospital before being airlifted to the

national capital.

Jharkhand State Cricket Association secretary Rajesh Verma said the JSCA has donated Rs one lakh to Lal for his treatment and Rs 39,500 was collected among the association members and handed over to his family.

"Lal has played Ranji Trophy with Dhoni," Chanchal Bhattacharya, Dhoni's coach during his formative years, said. Suraj Mohan, another friend, was with ailing Lal for the last three days and saw him off at the airport here.

Dhoni, who is out on a tour of the US, reportedly credited his helicopter shot to Lal, who used to execute the stroke in Ranji Trophy matches with style.

Camp for Indian hockey team
for Asia Cup from today

BANGALORE, July 15:

Players have started arriving for a month long preparatory Camp for Senior Indian Hockey Men's Team in preparation for Asia Cup at Sports Authority of India (SAI) Southern Centre here from tomorrow.

SAI incharge of the Camp M H Kumar said, " we are well prepared for the Camp to begin tomorrow and go on upto August 16, the turf has been cleaned up and accommodation is no problem."

When asked about the turf condition in particular as former Coach Micheal Nobbs had complained about damage and authorities had shifted the camp to Patna three years back, Mr Kumar said "we have cleaned the turf and there is no accommodation problem since Hostels with air-conditioned and non-airconditioned rooms are available and water is also sufficiently available for watering the turf."

About rain which may pose problem for the camp, he said the Coaches will have the timings adjusted and the rain water also help in cleaning the turf. "We have cut off the branches whose leaves were falling on the turf and stage is all set for the camp," he added. (UNI)
