

Zol's ton takes India U-19 to 333/2 on day-1 Jammu boy Shubham Khajuria slams cracking fifty on debut

DAMBULLA, July 23: It was Jammu-boy Shubham Khajuria who smashed 10 boundaries in his 61-ball knock of 52 runs and made an opening partnership of 79 runs alongwith Akhil Herwadkar (71) to send the bowlers on a leather-hunt in the first U-19 Youth 'Test' match, here today. He, however, was the only batsman to be dismissed in the first session. It was left-arm spinner Lakshan Jayasinghe who dismissed Khajuria caught by Sadira Samarawickrama.

Skipper Vijay Zol continued with his brilliant form as his unbeaten century helped India reach a commanding 333 for two at stumps on the opening day.

Sri Lankan captain Kusal Mendis's decision to field back-fired badly as Zol (129 batting) along with Sanju Samson (74 batting) added 169 runs for the unbroken third-wicket stand after openers Shubham Khajuria

The second-wicket partnership between Zol and Herwadkar was also fruitful one which yielded 85 runs.

Left-handed Zol, who has been a star performer at the colts level, started from where he had left during the recently concluded tri-series in Australia as he faced 213 balls hitting 14 fours and a six. He was in a mood to punish the spinners using his feet to perfection.

IPL star Samson also got his first significant score at this level after a moderate tour Down Under. Samson had 11 hits to the fence en route his 147-ball knock.

The only wicket that fell in the second session was of left-handed Herwadkar who tried to cut an off-break from Ramesh Mendis only to edge it to Kusal behind the stumps. Herwadkar faced 125 deliveries and hit nine fours in the process.

India seek revenge for 2-year-old humiliation in Zimbabwe

HARARE, July 23: With most of their top stars rested, a depleted Indian cricket team will seek revenge for the humiliation it suffered two years ago when it takes on minnows Zimbabwe in a five-match ODI series starting tomorrow, well aware of the perils of taking the home side lightly.

On their previous trip here, another depleted Indian team, captained by Suresh Raina, lost both its matches to Zimbabwe in a tri-series which also featured familiar foe Sri Lanka.

The Indians, being led by Virat Kohli this time after Mahendra Singh Dhoni was rested, would do well to revise the lessons of that trip before taking the field tomorrow.

Zimbabwe may not be too big a force to reckon with in international cricket but can be a handful for an under-strength team.

And India can be called a depleted side given that top spinner R Ashwin, and frontline pacer Ishant Sharma, Bhuvneshwar Kumar and Umesh Yadav would also be missing from action apart from Dhoni.

"All along we've prepared and hoped we might surprise them in one of the games," Zimbabwe coach Andy Waller has stated.

"You've got to be realistic, but as long as we're competitive and do the best we can. Our guys are hugely excited about this. It's a great experience for them, and we've been preparing knowing that the best side in the world are coming," he added.

The Indian batting would revolve around the likes of Kohli, Rohit Sharma and Shikhar Dhawan. Rohit has blossomed in the opening role and would look

to strengthen his position with some good knocks here.

In fact, Shikhar and Rohit average 57.72 in partnership and have put together three century stands so far.

Cheteshwar Pujara would lend stability to the middle order where Suresh Raina will also have an important role to play. Raina would look to wipe off the memories of the previous tour's debacle under his captaincy.

India's bowling attack has an all-new look to it with the duo of Shami Ahmed and rookie Mohit Sharma comprising the pace department, aiming to earn some brownie points for themselves. Vinay Kumar and Jaydev Unadkat are the other speedsters in the squad.

The spin attack would feature debutant Parveez Rasool, the first cricketer from Jammu and Kashmir to get the national selectors' nod, and the experienced Amit Mishra. Dinesh Karthik would don the gloves behind the stumps in Dhoni's absence.

The Brendon Taylor-led Zimbabwean team, which has been training for the series for the last two months, is devoid of any major stars.

Taylor is their star in the batting department and has the best

record against India in ODIs, with 184 runs at an average of 46 in four games.

The squad features five seamers, including Kyle Jarvis, Tendai Chatara, Brian Vitori, Elton Chigumbura and the uncapped Michael Chinouya.

A look at overall record would make India the favourites as Zimbabwe have only beaten them 10 times out of the 51 ODIs played between the two sides.

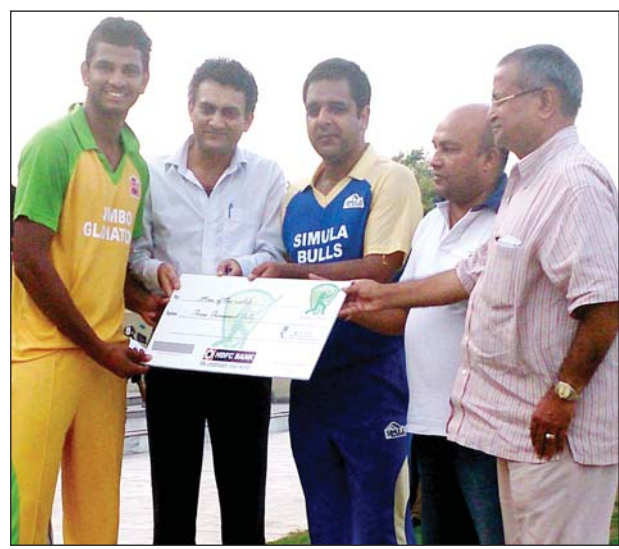

Mumbai Indians face RR in opening clash of CLT20

NEW DELHI, July 23:

The winners of IPL 6 Mumbai Indians will take on Rajasthan Royals, who finished third in the cash-rich tournament, in the inaugural group stage match of the Champions League Twenty20 to be played on September 21 at Sawai Man Singh Stadium in Jaipur.

The CLT20 final will be played on October 6 at the Ferozshah Kotla Ground here, which hosted the first Qualifier and the Eliminator of IPL 6.

The Kotla will also host the second semi-final of the tournament on October 5. The first semi-final will be played at Jaipur on October 4.

The opening group stage encounter will be followed by a double-header at Ranchi's JSCA International Stadium Complex, on September 22.

Brisbane Heat, the winner of Australia's KFC T20 Big Bash League, will play Trinidad and Tobago, the domestic T20 Champion of the West Indies, in the first game.

It will be followed by a duel between IPL 2013 runners-up, Chennai Super Kings and the Titans, South Africa's domestic T20 runners-up side.

Apart from Delhi, Jaipur and Ranchi, the CLT20 matches will also be played at the Sardar Patel Gujarat Stadium, Motera (Ahmedabad) and Rajiv Gandhi International Cricket Stadium, Hyderabad.

The qualifying stage of the tournament will be played from September 17 to September 20 at Hyderabad.

The tournament will follow a format similar to the two previous editions, with the Group Stage preceded by a Qualifier.

A total of 29 matches will be played in the USD 6 million tournament. (PTI)

Jwala, Ashwini hit out at IBL

NEW DELHI, July 23:

Doubles specialists Jwala Gutta and Ashwini Ponnappa were left disappointed with the Indian Badminton League's decision to slash their base price at the last moment in the Player's auction and termed it as "disrespectful" and "absurd".

Commonwealth Games women's doubles champions Jwala and Ashwini were two of the six icon players, who went under the hammer yesterday but just hours ahead of the player's auction, the IBL decided to reduce their base price from USD 50,000 (Rs 29,86,264) to USD 25,000 (14,93,125) after consultation with the six franchisees.

In the auction, Jwala went to Krish Delhi Smashers at USD 31,000 (Rs 18,51,520), while Pune Pistons bagged Ashwini for the base price of USD 25,000.

"I am very disappointed. Me and Ashwini signed the contract as

icon players and we should have been given a better deal. We were not even informed about the reduction of base price. In fact, the news that women's doubles was replaced by another men's singles, I came to know late. What can I say, It is disrespectful and I am deeply hurt and upset by IBL," Jwala said.

Ashwini, who won the World Championship bronze along with Jwala in London in 2011, was equally hurt at this last minute decision by the IBL.

"I didn't get a call regarding this. No one explained things to me. I am really hurt and deeply upset. Until the auction got over I didn't even know about it," Ashwini said. "I heard that since there is no women's doubles competition, so our price was slashed but then how come other women's doubles players got way more than me. That is more absurd. They make you icon players and then they don't treat you with respect," Ashwini said.(PTI)
