

## New hospital building sealed after cracks develop

RAJOURI, July 30: A newly constructed building in Darhal hospital complex was sealed by the Administration after it developed some cracks and water seepage was witnessed in several rooms from the roof top.

Constructed by JKPC with the cost of Rs 4.50 crores, this 4-storey building was completed hardly three months back. The JKPC wrote to the Block Medical Officer to take over the building and also release the pending amount of Rs 1.13 crore. The Health department officials found substantial

work done by the agency engineers and contractor and refused to take over the building. It was found that water seepage was there in several rooms and walls had developed cracks. The matter came to the notice of CMO Rajouri who further took up the issue with the Deputy Commissioner F C Bhagat. On the directions of DC, Tehsildar Darhal along with SHO went to the spot and sealed the building. He also initiated an inquiry into the matter, seeking action against the JKPC men involved in the construction of the 'unsafe' hospital building.

## 21 kg poppy straw seized

UDHAMPUR, July 30: Continuing its drive against drug smuggling, District Police today seized a truck near Main Bazar Kud and recovered 21.300 kgs of poppy straw (bhuki) besides arresting the drug peddler. The seized contraband was being smuggled from Kashmir to Jammu. Giving details, Anil Magotra, SSP Udhampur said that Kud

Police while conducting routine checking near Main Bazar Kud intercepted a truck bearing registration number JK02W/3317. During thorough search of the truck, 21.3 kgs of poppy straw (bhuki) was found concealed in the tool box and recovered. The accused driver namely Nazarat Ali of Gura Suraj Kathua and his associate smuggler Mumtaz Ali of Mohani Bakhta Rajbagh Kathua were arrested on the spot while the vehicle was also seized. In this connection, a case FIR number 91/2013 U/S 8/15 NDPS Act stands registered in Police Station Kud against the said accused persons. Further investigation of the case is going on.

## No Kashmiri cross to PoK, 24 guests arrive

SRINAGAR, July 30: No Kashmiri crossed over to other side of the Line of Control (LoC) while 24 people from Pakistan occupied Kashmir (PoK) arrived here, official sources said here today. They said 16 people also returned to their places by crossing sides at the Kaman post, the last Indian military post on this side of the LoC in Uri sector. They said due to Holy month of Ramzan, no Kashmiri resident crossed over to the PoK in the weekly Karvan-e-Aman bus. However, 16 PoK residents, who had come here in previous buses returned to their homes after completing stay in Kashmir. The sources said 24 PoK residents, including eight women and six children, arrived at Kaman post after crossing the Aman Setu, peace bridge on foot, to meet their relatives in Kashmir.

## UK coalition

LONDON, July 30: Britain's plan to introduce a controversial scheme of demanding a whopping 3,000 pounds visa bond from visitors from certain countries, including India, has divided the country's coalition government, with a senior minister terming the move as "very disappointing". Business Secretary Vince Cable, a member of coalition partner Liberal Democrats, admitted the proposed scheme which has already triggered worldwide outrage would send out the "wrong message". "It is very disappointing and it has not been agreed across the coalition and it seems to send the wrong message that Britain is closed for business," Cable told 'The Financial Times'. "The operation for the visa scheme, together with the bonds on these Commonwealth countries is simply having the effect of driving bona fide visitors who want to spend and to do business in the UK to France and Germany," he added. Cable, known for his business-friendly stance, had also assured his Indian counterpart Anand Sharma during a visit here last month that such a scheme had not been given the go-ahead. The Conservative-led government has been keen to cut immigration figures into the country and crack down on visa over-stayers. Coalition partners Lib Dems had been in favour of a visa bond


