Sagar for timely completion of beautification, development projects

SRINAGAR, June 11: Minister for Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Ali Mohammad Sagar has directed the concerned to ensure completion of all developmental projects for beautification and development of Srinagar City within the shortest possible time.

The Minister was interacting with the officers during his extensive tour to personally oversee the status of implementation of various developmental projects undertaken for ensuring beautification and development of the Srinagar city. He was accompanied by senior officers of different departments like SMC, UEED, PHE, PDD, R&B, etc.

While asking the officers to speed up the pace of work on the community hall being constructed at Duralatabad, Khaniyar, the Minister directed them to ensure its completion by the year end. He said that the hall would go a long way in providing the much needed facilities to the people of

the area for carrying out their social functions.

The Minister also directed the PDD authorities to ensure that the electric facilities are properly augmented, so that the people of the areas like Khawajaopora, Saidpora, Rainawari, Dualatabad, Miskeenbagh etc. do not face any un-necessary inconvenience due to due to lack of the infrastructure. He also said that he would provide the necessary funds out of his constituency development fund for the upgradation of electric facilities.

Mr. Sagar also directed the concerned officers of UEED to ensure that the drainage system of the area functions properly so that the water logging does not take place in the areas which are in the catchment of the water bodies.

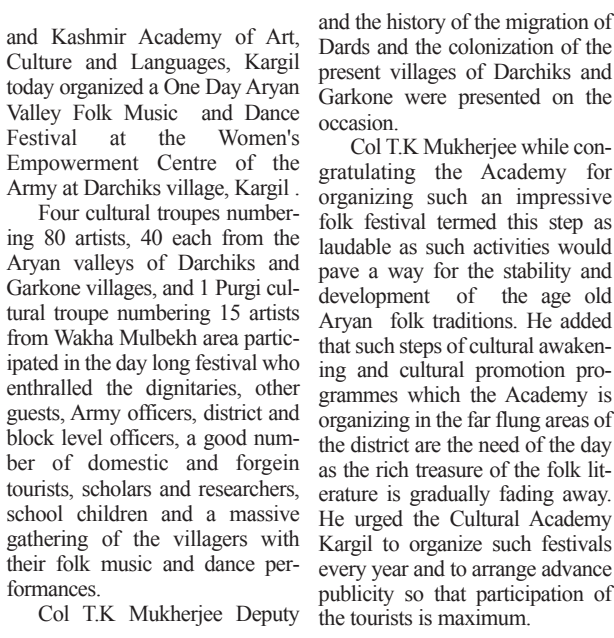
The Minister also directed the R&B officers to undertake the requisite macadamization of areas where the roads are in a dilapidated condition for the general convenience of the people.

Ajaz for expeditious disbursement of land acquisition amounts

SRINAGAR, June 11: Minister of State for Revenue, Relief & Rehabilitation, Ajaz Ahmad Khan today asked the collectors of land acquisition across the State to finalize all pending cases of land acquisition at the earliest and ensure that the compensation amount is disbursed within the shortest time.

Addressing a meeting of all the collectors of land acquisition for widening and expansion of National Highway in the State, the Minister directed expeditious processing of cases so that the land donors are awarded compensation at the earliest.

The meeting was told that in Kashmir province 7676 kanals in 59 villages are required to be taken over for extension of various National Highway Authority of India (NHAI) road projects out of which 6500 kanals have been handed over to the user agency and in case of rest proceedings are on Rs. 418 crore have been received from NHAI out of which Rs. 350 crore have been disbursed among the land donors while as Rs. 179 crore are required to clear the balance, the meeting was told.

Similarly in Jammu

province, 13700 kanals in 188 villages are required to be taken over by NHAI out of which 13100 kanals have been handed over to the agency. The meeting was told that Rs. 233 crore were received from NHAI as compensation out of which Rs. 213 crore were disbursed and a balance of Rs. 200 crore is required to clear the liability.

The Minister advised the collectors to comply with the provisions of Land Acquisition Act and complete the process of land acquisition without any lacuna. He asked the collectors to re double their efforts in this regard.

He asked the collectors to submit their red accounts regularly for an updated status of projects. He advised them to make rehabilitation a part of acquisition process so that the land donors are properly compensated.

Mr Ajiaz asked the Revenue officers to respect the deadline of issuing PRCs, fards, extracts etc as put in the Public Services Guarantee Act.

Secretary, Revenue, Vinod Kaul, Project Directors of NHAI, all the collectors including Additional DCs, ACRs and SDMs were present in the meeting.

Rather for sustained recovery drive against tax defaulters

SRINAGAR, June 11: Government has given revenue target of Rs. 1345 cr. to the Commercial Taxes Department (CTD) during the current financial year. The department has realized record revenue of Rs. 1162.10 cr during the last fiscal against the target of Rs.1110 cr as compared to last year's revenue of Rs.1035.61 cr thus surpassing the target by Rs.126.49 cr.

This was stated at the Annual Performance Review meeting of the Commercial Taxes Department, Kashmir Division held here today under the chairmanship of the Minister for Finance and Ladakh Affairs Abdul Rehman Rather.

The Commissioner, Commercial Taxes, Kifayat Hussain Rizvi, Additional Commissioner Commercial Taxes Kashmir, Hakim Rafiq Ahmad, Additional Secretary Finance, Showkat Ajiaz and Commercial Taxes Officers (CTOs) of 24 circles of Kashmir Division were present in the meeting.

Speaking on the occasion, the Minister said that since the Commercial Taxes Department is the main revenue collecting agency of the State, which gives major support to the Government's plan and programme implementation mechanism, the officers should exhibit their utmost proficiency and ability for further improving the performance of the department. He asked the officers to maintain friendly relations with the

trader's community, which, he said was imperative for better working as well as revenue realization.

He said business community is the respectable segment of the society so in no way should there be any inconvenience to them. "We all should strive to provide a congenial, customer friendly and transparent atmosphere to the traders," he added.

Mr. Rather also called for an effective and strict monitoring mechanism for tax realization adding that any kind of gross negligence on this account on the part of CTOs would be viewed seriously. He also urged for regular inspections and assessments to ensure disposal of different pending cases. He called for conducting regular internal audits adding that CTOs should conduct regular assessments at least twice in a month.

Sakina reviews public service delivery system

JAMMU, June 11: Minister for Social Welfare, Sakina Itoo today reviewed public services delivery system besides taking stock of ongoing development works in Jammu region.

Sakina, who is here on the rotational weeklong tour to attend Summer Secretariat, had a detailed review of essential services like power and water supply, irrigation, CAPD, Agriculture, RDD and other civic amenities especially in view of summer days.

Divisional Commissioner, Jammu, Pardeep Gupta, IGP, Jammu, Director Rural Development Jammu, Director Agriculture Jammu, Chief Engineer, PHE Jammu, Chief Engineer M&RE, Joint Commissioner, JMC, Deputy Director Health Services Jammu

and other senior officers of various departments attended the meeting.

The Minister also reviewed the arrangements for upcoming Shri Amarnathji Yatra being put in place in Yatri Niwas Jammu and enroute, scheduled to be commenced on June 28.

The meeting was informed that all foolproof arrangements including supply of power and drinking water, cleanliness, medical facilities and issuing of health certificate to yatries have been made. She was also informed that enroute Kathua, Samba, Udhampur and Ramban, the concerned Deputy Commissioners will ensure sanitation in the halting stations as well as arrangements of adequate tents and toilets for the convenience of yatries.

The Minister asked the Director CAPD to make sure that timely ration supply is ensured in Jammu region especially in far off parts and earthquake affected districts like Doda, Kishtwar and Ramban. In this regard, she called for holding regular inspection of the sale depots to check quality of ration supply.

Reviewing the power and water supply scenario, the Minister asked the concerned Chief Engineers to activate their field functionaries and ensure immediate repair of damaged feeder transformers on priority basis. She also directed them to apply uniform methods for power curtailment and publish the curtailment schedule in electronic and print media for convenience of the public.

Itoo also took stock of progress of ongoing development projects being taken up by ERA, NBCC and PWD in Jammu city besides reviewing MGNREGA and law and order situation in the region.

Bovine smugglers flee after breaking naka

KATHUA, June 11: The bovine smugglers once again broke the police Naka and managed to flee with animals from Rajbagh area in Kathua district today.

According to reports the bovine smugglers who were on their way to Kashmir from Punjab broke the police barrier at Banyari Police Post under the jurisdiction of Raj Bagh Police Station and escaped police arrest despite the two rounds were fired by men in khaki in the air as warning shots.

According to sources this has been a routine affair for the bovine smugglers who have a good networking with other smugglers enroute and they often succeed in breaking the police naka or giving it a slip to reach Kashmir Valley with animals for slaughter.

The police has registered a case under section 188 RPC against the Roshan Din gang whose men it suspected were involved in today smuggling incident of bovine animals and breaking of the naka. However no arrest was made so far.
