BJP activists protest, demand settlement of people's problems on IB

SAMBHA, June 13: The BJP activists held a demonstration here today in protest against the callousness of the State Government towards them.

The protesters raising slogans against the Government demanded settlement of their problems at an earliest.

The BJP leaders with banners and placards in their hands warned to intensify agitation in case the Government continues its discriminatory policies towards the border people of Jammu region.

The protesters led by senior BJP leaders Ranjit Singh, Chander Parkash Ganga and Sat Sharma (CA) submitted a memorandum to Deputy Commissioner Samba seeking immediate redressal of the demands.

The memorandum demanded that the area falling on International Border (IB) from Phaharpur to village Chamb in tehsil Akhnor be also declared as RBA on pattern of the people living on LoC as these people face the same hardships and problems due to aggressiveness of the Pak Army as are being faced by the people of LoC.

The memorandum also demanded compensation for the land of farmers occupied by the armed forces on IB from Phaharpur to village Chhamb in Akhnor tehsil for construction of morchas, ditches, road, barbed wire, bunkers etc. These people were not given any compensation since 1947 till date and the same be paid immediately as the land has been taken under Land Acquisition Act by the State Government.

The memorandum alleged that the BADP funds sanctioned by Union Government are spent in entire Kathua district while Hiranagar Constituency including Ghagwal block are situated on IB. It demanded removal of ban on

Avail benefits of new industrial package: Kichloo

SRINAGAR, June 13: A high level meeting held under the chairmanship of Minister of State for Industries and Commerce, Sajjad Ahmad Kichloo today discussed issues related to Rs. 296 crore new industrial package sanctioned by the Centre for J&K and its effective and efficient implementation on ground.

Mr. Kichloo said in the new industrial package units under both organized and unorganized sectors are eligible for incentives and subsidies. He said the earlier package was confined to the industrial estates only, which has now been extended to tourists sector, and food processing units as well.

Mr. Kichloo said that under the new industrial package 8 new industrial units in Jammu division and 12 in Kashmir division will be developed.

He said that the Central Investment Subsidy Scheme, Central Interest Subsidy Scheme, Central Comprehensive Insurance Scheme and Transport Subsidy Schemes have been approved under the new package.

The Commissioner Secretary Industries and Commerce Shantmanu while briefing the meeting about the new features of the new industrial package.

"Now all the new and existing industrial units would be eligible for Capital Investment Subsidy (CIS) of 15% whereas small and medium enterprises would be eligible for CIS of 30%", Mr. Kichloo added.

87 bovines rescued, 8 held

JAMMU, June 13: Police today rescued 87 bovine animals and arrested eight smugglers from Nagrota and Jhajjar Kotli.

Police spokesman said that, on specific inputs, police parties from Nagrota and Jhajjar Kotli police stations laid naks and intercepted eight trucks bearing registration number JKO2AF-9327, JKO2AD-3375, JKO2AD-3643, JK14C-3833, JKO2AW-0773, JKO2T-3375 and JK08A-8858.

During checking, police rescued 87 bovine animals and arrested eight smugglers, who have been identified as Liyaqat Ali of Rangoor, Khalid Hussain of Juda, Mahore, Shabir Ahmed of Batote, Junaid Ali of Dabler, RS Pura, Javed Ahmed of Kukernag, Showkat Ahmed of Doru, Mohd Rafiq of Kathua and Nazakat Ali of Bajalta.

Cases under FIR numbers 175/13 and 78/13 have been registered at Nagrota and Jhajjar Kotli police stations and investigation started.

Police parties led by SHOs OP Chib and Parvez Sajjad made the arrests under the direct supervision of SDPO Khalik Choudhary.

Dos and Don'ts for booking e-tickets through Agents

Dos

- Check if it is an authorized agent outlet:
 - The details of authorized agent outlets are available on the IRCTC website www.irctc.co.in.
 - Verify that the photo-id and the authorisation certificate of the agent is prominently displayed at the agent outlet.
- Please fill up the booking/cancellation request slip, available with the agent, for the booking/cancellation of the e-tickets:
 - Insist on your mobile number being fed into the system correctly.
 - You will receive an SMS (with details of your booking including fare and Service Charges), on the above mobile number, from the IRCTC immediately as confirmation of the booking.
 - This SMS serves as a valid ticket (you may show it to the TTE along with your proof of identity during travel). You do not have to carry a printout of the e-ticket. SAVE PAPER FOR A GREENER ENVIRONMENT.
- If you take a printout of the ticket, check that the name of the agent outlet booking the ticket, along with his address, contact number and name of the Principal Agent are printed on the e-ticket.
- Ask for a receipt for all your bookings/cancellations.
- Please carry your proof of identity, in original, during the journey. (Voter Identity Card; Passport; PAN Card; Aadhaar Card (UID); Driving License; Photo ID Card having serial number issued by

Don'ts

- Do not buy e-ticket if the agent refuses to issue money receipt for all the charges paid.
- Do not pay more than the approved Service Charges. Service Charges per e-ticket, irrespective of number of passengers on the ticket, are:
