

Harshdev lambastes Govt for making DDBs redundant

JAMMU, June 18: Member Legislative Assembly (MLA) and Chairman, National Panthers Party (NPP) Harshdev Singh lambasted the Government for making the District Development Boards (DDBs) redundant by dishonoring their decisions and resolutions passed in such meetings.

In a statement, Singh said that DDBs were conceptualized in the past with the objective of ensuring holistic and balanced development of various districts of the State by bringing all Government Departments on a common platform with active association of elected representatives of people.

He said that the concept of DDBs envisaged formulation of plans and proposals for various Government Departments in respect of works to be executed during the relevant financial year.

The plan proposals required the authentication of Board members including MLAs to be followed by accord of formal approval of Chairmen of DDBs, he added.

MLA said that the DDBs were supposed to hold threadbare discussions on the working of various Government Departments and suggest measures for betterment together with their priorities in respect of works to be executed during the concerned financial year.

Harshdev Singh further expressed concern over the surrender of Rs 2100 crore by the State Government which was declined by the Planning Commission of India due to utter negligence of the State Government in utilization of available funds.

According to police two groups of people having an old rivalry over the eight kanals and eleven marlas of land clashed this morning when one of the group led by Munawar Hussian, son of Faqir Mohammed of Gohlad tried to remove the encroachment made over the land by the another group headed by Mohammed Zabir, son of Bagh Hussian also of Gohlad.

The two groups pounced upon each other with axes and lathis resulting into serious injuries to ten people from both the groups.

After coming to know of the incident, the Mendhar Police team led by SHO Mendhar rushed to the spot and SDPO shifted the injured to Sub District Hospital Mendhar for treatment.

Accusing the administration for its failure in settling the dispute for years together the members of Munawar Hussian group also resorted to dharna and shouted slogans against the tehsildar Mendhar saying that after measuring the land twice the Revenue officials failed to demarcate the same resulting in today's clash.

Surankote Police rescues 15 bovine animals, arrests 3 smugglers

POONCH, June 18: Surankote Police rescued 15 bovine animals and arrested three smugglers at Buffaliaz today which were being smuggled to Kashmir valley.

A police team led by SHO Surankote, Bashir Ahmed DySP under the supervision of SDPO, Surankote Javed Ahmed Mir and on the overall directions of SSP Poonch Shamsar Hussian laid a naka on the road and rescued 15 bovine animals and arrested three smugglers.

The police said the animals were being smuggled from Surankote to Kashmir via Mughal road. But after the Poonch Police on the directives of SSP installed three nakas on the road at different places the smugglers have changed the modus operandi.

To avoid the police Naka the smugglers brought down the animals from the vehicles and started journey by foot. But after getting the information Police team laid a naka in the way and caught hold of the smugglers and rescued the animals.

The arrested bovine smugglers have been identified as Mohammed Rashid son of Mohammed Aziz of Gouni Chak Buffaliaz, Shabir Ahmed, son of Abdul Qayoom and Manzoor Ahmed, son of Ghulam Ahmed both residents of Thanamandi Rajouri.
