

ReT Teachers Forum threatens agitation, demands release of salary

SRINAGAR, June 18: Jammu and Kashmir Rehbar-e-Taleem (ReT) Teachers Forum has threatened to stage district-wide protests and call for 'Secretariat gherao' if the Government fails to release their wages.

State general secretary, JKRETF, Farooq Ahmad Tantry, said that the Government is forcing us to take to streets as it has failed to release salaries of SSA teachers on monthly basis.

Tantry blamed the State Government for delaying their payments. "SSA scheme is funded by both State and Central Government in the ratio of 65:35. As the State Government failed to release funds for our salaries, the Centre also stopped

releasing funds for our salaries," he said.

Earlier, thousands of teachers' observed strike in different districts of Kashmir to press the Government for their regularization of Education Volunteers (EV's) and Rehbar-e-Taleem (ReT) Teachers.

The teachers said that they were selected in every village and Mohallah on merit basis during the PDP and Congress Coalition Government and were promised that EV's will be converted ReTs after two years of service on monthly stipend of Rs 1250. In this regard Government released orders on different terms, viz order number edu/acad/15/2006 dated 16-03-2006; Dsak/plg/up-grd/EGSPS/2007; Edu/spd/ssa/up-grd/7800/902 dated 16-03-2007.

People protest against bovine smuggling

REASI, June 18: Demanding arrest of bovine smugglers, people held a strong protest demonstration here again recent spurt in the smuggling of bovine animals.

The protesters, who comprise mostly youth from Reasi, Arnas, Pouni, Talwara, Salal, Jyotipuram and other areas, also blocked Reasi Jammu road for more than an hour disrupting vehicular movement.

They raised slogans and alleged that bovines were being smuggled in connivance with the corrupt officers.

The protesters dispersed only after Tehsildar and ACR personally reached the spot and assured strict action against the smugglers.

Later, the people also called on DDC Reasi Dr Shahid Iqbal Choudhary and apprised him of the matter. The DDC issued on the spot instructions to SHO and Naib Tehsildar Reasi to take stern action against bovine smuggling. He also directed Chief Animal Husbandry Officer to prepare a roadmap for numbering of the bovine animals in order to curb their smuggling.
