

IAR, AVM demand abolition of reservation

JAMMU, June 21: India Against Reservation (IAR) and Aarakshan Virodhi Manch (AVM) has demanded total abolition of reservation and implementation of Supreme Court's Judgement in the petition of Mr. Nagraj, which termed reservation in promotion as illegal and unconstitutional.

Addressing the joint meeting of IAR and AVM held here today, AVM president, Ram Paul Seth strongly opposed religion based reservation in the light of Sachar Committee Report, which he alleged is 25 years old and quite irrelevant today. He termed religion and caste based reservation nothing but political exploitation and blackmailing.

General secretary of the Manch, Yash Paul, alleged that increase in the ceiling of income of creamy layer is political fraud. He stressed that it should be Rs 2 lakh annually. He emphasized that all the private educational institutions should be brought under Government control to provide uniform education to all.

The meeting condemned

unwanted political influence in the working of School Education Department due to which he said educational standard of Government schools has been deteriorated. He said that various officers as well as teachers, attached in the office of Director School Education, Jammu, are getting lakhs of salary for no work.

IAR president, Sat Paul Sharma, stressed for the need of unity among people of General Category to constitutional right of equality. He demanded the Government to take special support measures to safeguard the interests of the poorest among poor, irrespective of their caste, creed, colour, religion and region.

He also strongly voiced for providing better health, educational and other amenities to the people, who are paying huge taxes to the Government. He strongly opposed the introduction of FDI local investment in retail by the Government, alleging that it is likely to snatch the employment opportunities of small retailer and increase unemployment in the Country.

Bridge over Jhelum in Rajbagh to be completed on time: JKPC

SRINAGAR, June 21: After facing controversy over construction of the skewed bridge over river Jhelum, Jammu and Kashmir Project Construction Corporation, the executing agency of the project, officials said that after reducing its skew work on the bridge is going on and it will be completed within its stipulated time of three years, which is December 2014.

"The skew of the bridge was actually 24 per cent but it was decreased to 7 per cent by increasing its width," said a JKPC official.

Since taking up the work, two side abutment foundations across the two banks have been completed and the work on foundation of two piers-that support the bridge-which are 24 meters deep from the river bed level is going on.

"Piers will be completed within three months. Once they are completed, it will take few months to complete the bridge and dedicate it to public. We are

working on it and hopefully it will be completed within target time of three years," said Ishiyah Hussain, the site engineer of JKPC.

A top official of the agency said that Government has sanctioned an approximate amount of Rs 12.37 crore for its construction.

The 120-metre-long bridge having three spans will connect the busy Polo View road with Raj Bagh near Presentation Convent Higher Secondary School across the river and will reduce the traffic load on Abdullah bridge where long traffic jams are witnessed at the peak hours in the morning and evening.

The three-lane, 18 meter wide bridge will ease off the pressure from the congested roads running through the busy Lal Chowk.

JKPC has started the construction work in May last year after a high level Government team visited the site and gave nod for its construction despite criticism.

CRPF jawan shoots himself dead

UDHAMPUR, June 21: A CRPF Jawan ended his life by shooting himself with his service rifle at 137- Battalion Omara Morh, Udhampur, this morning.

Identity of the deceased was established as Dev Prashad Bhadra of West Wengal, who was allegedly upset over the issue of leave, Police said.

The CRPF Head Constable of 137 Battalion shot himself with his service rifle Insas around 11:35AM. He was immediately rushed to District Hospital Udhampur where doctors declared him as brought dead.

This is the second such incident in 137 Bn Omara Morh Udhampur where another CRPF jawan namely Manoj Kumar of Haryana had shot himself on April 2 even as he survived.

Meanwhile police registered the case and started investigation.

Pensioners' concern over non clearance of GP Fund, other liabilities

SRINAGAR, June 21: The Pensioners Welfare Association Kashmir has expressed concern over non clearance of the bills of GP Fund and other liabilities of the employees by the treasuries in the State.

In a statement issued here today Mir Gulam Rasool patron of the Association said that bills of GP Fund of the employees and retirees worth crores of rupees are pending in the treasuries for months together.

He said at Sadar Treasury Srinagar the payment of the GP

fund amount of the employees and pensioners has not been released for months together and every time when the concerned employee or pensioner approaches the authorities or the staff they are told that the funds have not reached so far.

He said it is not known whether the staff is deliberately denying the payment or the funds have not been released. He urged the Government that in case it has not released the funds to treasuries to clear the GP Fund and other liabilities it should do the same at an earliest failing which the pensioners of the State will resort to agitation.

Rajapaksa says no violation of 1987 Indo-Lanka Accord

COLOMBO, June 21: Sri Lankan President Mahinda Rajapaksa today dismissed reports that his Government had flouted agreements reached in the 1987 Indo-Lanka Accord which created devolved administrative units, saying there had been no violation.

"We have not violated anything on the Indo-Lanka accord", Rajapaksa said, while responding to questions during a media interaction. He added that New Delhi had not raised any concerns with Sri Lanka on the thirteenth amendment to the Sri Lankan constitution.

The 13A and the provincial councils entered Sri Lanka's statutes in 1987 as part of the India-Sri Lanka Peace Accord which envisaged devolution of powers to the island's provinces in an effort to end the Sri Lankan civil war involving the LTTE (Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam) and the government forces.

The LTTE was crushed in 2009, ending its three-decades-old fight to create a separate Tamil homeland in the northern and eastern provinces.

Media reports suggested that the Indian government was planning to raise concerns with Colombo over Rajapaksa's plan to tinker with the thirteenth amendment.

The Government has proposed an amendment to the 13A which is to be presented in Parliament as an urgent bill.

It seeks to repeal provisions in the 13A which empower two or more provinces to merge.

Also a parliamentary select committee (PSC) is to look at other amendments needed.

The move came amidst calls by his majority Sinhala nationalist allies to scrap the 13A ahead of the northern provincial council elections in September. (PTI)
