JNPT signs agreement with Nhava Sheva

NEW DELHI, June 22: India's largest container handling port Jawaharlal Nehru Port Trust (JNPT) recently signed an agreement with DP World's Indian subsidiary Nhava Sheva for development of a standalone container handling facility at the port in Navi Mumbai at an estimated cost of Rs 600 crore.

The agreement was signed today in the presence of G K Vasan, Minister of Shipping and HE Sultan Ahmed Bin Sulayem, Chairman, DP World and other senior officers including Pradeep K Sinha, Secretary (Shipping) and S K Kaul, Chief Manager (Admin) and Secretary, JNPT.

The concession agreement entails the development of Standalone Container Handling Facility with the quay length of 330 m at JN Port, Sheva, Navi Mumbai, Maharashtra.

Under the agreement, the terminal will be developed by Nhava Sheva at an estimated

cost of Rs 600 Crore, with an estimated capacity addition of 0.8 Million TEUs per annum.

"By signing of this concessional agreement and development of 4th container terminal, JN Port will cross historic figure of achieving 10 million TEUs by the year 2018-19, creating an array of worthwhile opportunities for shipping lines for maritime trade to ship their cargo to various sectors across the globe," said S K Kaul.

The concession agreement was signed on behalf of JNPT by Chairman NN Kumar and on behalf of the Nhava Sheva (India) Gateway Terminal Pvt Ltd by Anil Singh, senior vice president and managing director of M/s DP World (Subcontinent).

The project would be executed on DBFOT (Design, Build, Finance Operate and Transfer) basis, with a concession period of approximately 17 years and is slated to be completed by December 2015.

2 dead bodies recovered

RAJOURI, June 22: The police recovered two male bodies from Nowshera and Saranoo area of district Rajouri today.

A police spokesman said that dead body of one Ramesh Chander (58), son of Anand Sharma, resident of Ward No. 1 Nowshera was recovered from a nallah about 300 mts away from

his house today. A passer-by noticed the body and informed police. A police party rushed to the spot and shifted the body to hospital for postmortem.

The victim was missing since June 20. The family members said that he had gone for a walk in the evening and did not return. After long search a missing report was lodged with local Police Station. He was an employee of State Health Department and presently posted as store-keeper in Nowshera hospital. The police registered a case and started investigation.

Meanwhile, an unidentified dead body was recovered by police from a nalla in Saranoo area of Rajouri today. A villager found the body lying in the nallah and informed police. The body was later shifted to Rajouri Hospital for postmortem. A message was flashed to other police stations in the district to establish identity of the deceased.

22 bovines rescued, 2 smugglers arrested

Police spokesman said that, on specific inputs, police party from Doda police station laid a naka near Pul Doda and intercepted two trucks bearing registration numbers JK06-4081 and JK06-2696.

During checking, police recovered 22 bovine animals and arrested two persons, who have been identified as Shakeel Ahmed, son of Ghulam Ahmed and Liaqat Ali, son of Ghulam Mohd Khanji, while their third accomplice managed to flee from the spot.

The vehicles used in the smuggling have been seized, while a case under FIR No 150/13 under Section 188 RPC and 3 PCA Act has been registered at Police Station Doda and investigation started.

P N Bhat Trust warns against dilution of Temples and Shrines Bill

JAMMU, June 22: Taking note of the recent developments in the passage of the Kashmiri Hindu Temples and Shrines Bill, P N Bhat Memorial Trust, has made it clear that the community of exiled Hindus of Kashmir, pressing for the early passage of the Shrines Bill would not countenance any dilution in the ambit of the Bill for the protection and preservation of the Hindu shrines and temples in Kashmir.

It reiterated that no exclusion would be acceptable. The nodal organisation noted that the community was seriously distressed by the delay in the passage of the bill, saying that delay of each day in the passage of the Bill results in deterioration of the holy sites and shrines lying in states of serious neglect.

The extended meeting of the Trust was chaired by Harji Lal Jad and was attended by the members of the representative Committee dealing with the Temples and Shrines Bill, including Dr A N Pandita, Dr R L Bhat, Dr B L Handoo, Manmohanji Thaplo, Pyare Lal Bhat, Kashmiri Lal Bhat, M L Ganjo, H L Bhat, Pranji Pandit, M K Raina, Prof P N Trichal, Rajinder Ji, Ramesh Hangloo, Ashok Braro, Shibanji Saraf, H N Pandita. The meeting expressed satisfaction with the efforts being made by the Trust to convince the powers both at the State and Central level about the need for enacting the Bill pending before the State Legislature at an early date.

The meeting was informed that the Trust had sent detailed memos to the Prime Minister and the chairperson of UPA in this regard and was meeting all the leaders to make sure that the hurdles in the early passage of the Shrines Bill were got cleared.

The representative committee welcomed the concern shown by the Congress president Saifudin Soz, Minister of Housing, Horticulture and Culture Raman Bhalla and other leaders for their support regarding the passage of Bill.

Drug Controller team lifts medicine samples

RAJOURI, June 22: A team from the office of Drug Controller, Jammu during surprise inspection lifted medicine samples from at least a dozen Medical shops here today and sent for testing to Laboratories.

Reports said a team from Jammu led by Dy Drug Controller Farida Parveen conducted extensive inspections of nearly a dozen medical shops in Rajouri today and lifted samples of various drugs. Though department has claimed that it was routine inspection yet the sources indicated that in view of the infamous sub-standard/fake drugs scandal in J&K, Drug Controller staff has become active on the High Court directives.

A senior officer when contacted said that it was just routine inspection and the seized drug samples have been sent to the labs for testing. Action would be taken if the medicines are found sub-standard, the officer added.
