

Red-hot India a step away from second straight world title

BIRMINGHAM, June 22: will have little significance in a match, where skill and mental toughness face an acid test at the Edgbaston.

England, who have lost in the finals of both the World Cup and the Champions Trophy over the past two decades, will aim to exploit home conditions against a new breed of carefree Indian cricketers who have taken the tournament by storm.

While India have breezed through to the final, England have shown their die-hard character by lifting themselves several notches in key matches.

The hosts thrashed South Africa by seven wickets in the tournament's first semifinal at The Oval on Wednesday but more than the margin of victory, the team's ability to bowl out a decent batting line-up in less than 39 overs would have given the English bowlers a big shot in the arm.

India's batting has been in ominous form. Except for the tournament opener against South Africa on June 6, India have never batted beyond No. 4. (PTI)

In the men's 100-metre event, Pakistan, Windies not to play T20 Internationals

KARACHI, June 22: Pakistan and West Indies Cricket Boards have failed to reach an agreement on playing two T20 Internationals in Florida, United States next month.

The two Boards had discussed having the two T20 games in Florida due to the large number of South Asian and West Indian expatriates community in the USA.

"The two T20s were part of Pakistan's revised tour to the West Indies which also includes five one-day internationals. But due to time constraints and other issues the matches will now be played in the Caribbean," a senior PCB official told here.

He said that talks were held to have the matches in the USA in order to promote the sport in North America and also due to the close proximity between the West Indies and Miami, Florida.(PTI)

Boxer Manjeet settles for silver at China Open

NEW DELHI, June 22: However in the final round the Chinese boxer was more dominant with his precise attacks, which kept the Indian on the back foot. Manjeet lost on a split decision in the end.

The Indian men's team returns from the event with one silver and three bronze medals - Sunil Kumar (52kg), Ajay Kumar (56kg) and Jaideep (75kg) had to be content with a bronze medal performance after losing out in the round of four.

The tournament has been a good exposure for the young Indian team, especially for the likes of Manjeet, Ajay and Jaideep, who were all making their international debut in Guiyang. (PTI)

Manjeet Singh had to content with a silver medal at the 3rd China Open boxing tournament after going down to local lad Akepeer Yusuf in the final of the super heavy weight category (+91kg), in Guiyang.

Making his international debut, the 21-year-old Indian boxer put up a sterling show in what was a fight to the finish yesterday.

Yusuf made an aggressive start making full use of his long reaching arms. But Singh, a two time Youth National Championship bronze medallist, displayed some good ring movement and in-fighting to land a few telling blows on his opponent in the second round.

Indian paddlers crash out of Japan Open

KOLKATA, June 22: The Indian paddlers crashed out of the ongoing Japan Open Super Series event at Yokohama as both Achanta Sharath Kamal and Soumyajit Ghosh bowed out in the men's singles events on Saturday.

Though Sharath Kamal managed to enter the pre-quarterfinals, beating Lee Chia Sheng of Taipei 4-2, he went down to World No. 9 and second-seeded Wang Lihua of China in straight games of 5-11, 7-11, 3-11, 2-11 in less than 20 minutes.

Earlier, Ghosh lost in the round of 32 to Taipei's Chen Chien-An 1-4. The Taipei paddler, ranked 28 in the world, beat the Indian 9-11, 11-3, 14-12, 11-4, 11-4.

The doubles pair of Soumyajit Ghosh and Harmeet Desai failed to progress beyond the quarterfinals stage as the duo lost to the Japanese pair of Jin Ueda and Maharu Yoshimura 6-11, 6-11, 9-11. (UNI)

Lahiri stays in contention at Worldwide Selangor Masters

SELANGOR (MALAYSIA), June 22: Riding on a brilliant front-nine, Anirban Lahiri closed the gap between him and leader Pariya Junhasavasdikul of Thailand with a four-under 67 in the third round of the Worldwide Holdings Selangor Masters here today.

Lahiri started the day seven shots behind the leader Pariya and carded a four-under 67 to reduce the deficit to just three shots.

Lahiri is now five-under 208 in sole fourth position and is seeking a fourth Asian Tour victory and his first outside of his country.

Abhinav Lohan (72), 10th overnight, looked like further improving his position before hitting a rough patch with three bogeys over last four holes and dropping to tied 22nd.

C Muniyappa, playing on a medical exemption, carded a 72 and moved up from 60th to tied 49th at six-over 219. Abhijit Chadha (77) stayed in tied 60th place.

Pariya was eight-under 205 and one shot behind him was Korea's Baek Seuk-hyun after shooting a level-par 71 in the third round. Malaysian amateur Gavin Green (70) stayed in third spot at six-under 207.

Lahiri improved from sixth to fourth, while Thai Thanyakon Khroongpha of Thailand shot 67 and moved from tenth to fifth.

Lahiri was all smiles as he said, "I'm happy with the way I played. I got off to a great start. I think I have to combine my two back nines together because I played well on the backside and good on the front today."

"Four-under (67) is a pretty good score out here. It was a little bit easier because it was a bit cooler. I was hitting the ball solid and placing my ball well especially on the front nine," he added. (PTI)
