

Govt committed to protect rights of labour class: Sadhotra

SRINAGAR, June 28: Minister for Labour, Employment and Planning, Ajay Sadhotra today reiterated Government's resolve to protect the rights of labour class and also to extend all possible facilities for their welfare and growth. The Minister was addressing Jammu and Kashmir Building and other Construction Workers Welfare Board meeting here today. The meeting was among others attended by Commissioner Secretary, Labour and Employment, B. A. Runiyal, Secretary Law, Farhat Tasneem Labour Commissioner, Shahid Inayatullah, Chief Executive Officer/Secretary, JKBOCWBB, Syed Muriad Hussain, MD, JKPC, T. R. Bhagat and Chief Architect, V. K. Pant, Accounts Officer, JKBOCWBB, Farooq Ahmed Shah and several members of the Board. Mr. Sadhotra asked the officers to ensure documentation of the achievements of the Board and highlight the labour related best practices through power point presentation. He said that

the labour class is the backbone of the society who put in their energy in building the infrastructure like hospitals, schools, Government buildings as well as private residential colonies. He said that it is the duty of every individual to be affectionate and sympathetic towards this community. The meeting discussed various issues related to JKBOCWBB and the registered construction workers. The issues include creation of staff for the Board, delegation of powers for sanctioning of the cases, computerization of the details of construction worker across the State and binding of the record. Threadbare discussions were held for according approval to the issues related to Board. The Secretary of the Board Syed Muriad Hussain informed the meeting that till date 184294 workers have been registered while as Rs. 37.64 crore were spent on the welfare schemes of the Labourers till ending March this year, covering 49749 beneficiaries. He said that Rs. 220 crore was collected as Cess amount up to ending May this year.

Diabetes awareness programme held

UDHAMPUR, June 28: A Diabetes awareness programme cum detection camp held at village Bhanara in Block Majalta here today. The programme was organized under the aegis of Govt of India's National Programme for Control of Diabetes and Non-Communicable Diseases in collaboration with Diabetes Care Foundation (DCF), a registered NGO. Free medical consultation as well as medicines were provided to the villagers by a team of specialists led by Dr Jitendra Singh. Also present on the occasion were Dr Bhavana, Dr Nagpal, Prog Director Ms Ronica, DCF activist Varun Malhotra and prominent local activist Chandra Prakash Gupta. Dr Jitendra Singh said that the camp is a part of the DCF campaign to reach out to people in remote areas which are usually deprived of easy access to health care facilities, he added. Speaking on the occasion, Dr Singh said that in rural areas the symptoms of Diabetes remain undetected for several years as a

result of which the village and rural patients succumb to kidney, heart and eye complications besides foot amputations which leave them incapacitated. Lack of specialized medical help coupled with lack of diagnostic or screening facilities contribute to this dismal rural health scenario, he added. Referring to spurt of Diabetes in rural areas, Dr Jitendra Singh said that people living in villages and semi-urban areas are also now gradually switching over to dietary habits and life style culture of city folk. The level of stress has also tremendously gone up in traditionally peaceful rural areas while the level of physical activity has gone down, he added. Dr Jitendra Singh said the DCF will also arrange for future follow-up treatment and investigation of newly detected cases of Diabetes from the rural areas where it holds camps.

DC directs banks to hike CD ratio in Leh

LEH, June 28: Deputy Commissioner Leh, Simrandeep Singh today directed the banks to hike credit-deposit ratio in the district. He was chairing the District Level Bankers Committee meeting in which representatives of all the 28 banks operating in the district, representatives of RBI from Kashmir and the District Officers participated. The DC took a detailed review of the performance of the banks and passed specific directions to various participants. Taking a serious note of abysmally low CD ratio in the district, he directed all the banks to strictly adhere to the directions of the RBI Governor of achieving 40% CD ratio. He particularly directed the Lead Bank (SBI) to improve its CD ratio, which was reported to be the lowest in the district. The DC gave emphasis on the 100% coverage under the Kissan Credit Card and took a detailed account from individual banks and the Chief Agriculture Officer, Leh. The DC also showed concern at the private banks not sanctioning a single case under the KCC and passed specific directions to include two private banks (Axis and HDFC) under the target for KCC coverage. Further, the DC observed that Leh is the most suited district to achieve 100% KCC coverage because of its population and having the benefit of both PRIs and Councilors. He directed the Agriculture and the Revenue Departments to work in tandem to ensure the district achieve this target. He also laid stress at the Financial Inclusion Plan (FIP), which is also a precursor to the Electronic Benefit transfer (EBT), for which Leh figures as
