600 new SHCs in offing: Shabir

Excelsior Correspondent SRINAGAR, June 29: Minister of State for Health, Shabir Ahmad Khan has said that Government would open 600 new Sub-Health Centers (SHC) soon in the State with priority to those areas that have tough topography, adding in this regard the Union Minister for Health and Family Welfare has given nod during his recent visit to the Valley.

This was stated by the Health Minister today while responding to the demands of the people of Bandipora during his visit to the area. He said that priority would be given to those hilly and remote areas that lack health care facilities and are far away from town hospitals.

The Minister inspected pace of progress on under execution 100 bedded hospital complex and Ancillary Medical Training School, Bandipora and directed concerned executing agency for their time bound completion. He gave the deadline for completion of first two floors of 5 storey hospital complex by October and AMT School by July this year.

Former Minister, Usman Majeed, former MLA, Ghulam Rasool Naz, District Development Commissioner, Bandipora, M. Y. Zargar, Chief Medical Officer, Bandipora were among others who accom-

panied the Minister during the tour. The Health Minister said that work on this hospital project was taken up at a cost of Rs 24.32 crore and delay in its completion has caused cost escalation causing inconvenience to the people. "Further delay in this regard is intolerable", Mr. Shabir said and warned that further delay in the project will invoke stern action against defaulters. He directed the District Development Commissioner, Bandipora to monitor the execution of hospital complex frequently and ensure that first two floors of the hospital are completed in time.

The Health Minister also took stock of the functioning of Sub-District Hospital, Bandipora and directed concerned authorities for ensuring all medicare benefits to the patients. He instructed that free medicare should be given to pregnant mothers till their delivery and infants as per the new welfare scheme launched by the Centre recently throughout the Country. He went round each section of the hospital, inquired about the welfare of patients, directed concerned for proper up keeping of all the units besides displaying of diet charts and duty sheets in the relevant section for awareness of patients.

The Minister also received detailed appraisal from DDC and CMO about implementation of several components of NRHM in the district.

Sagar for speeding up developmental projects

Excelsior Correspondent SRINAGAR, June 29: Minister for Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Ali Mohammad Sagar has asked the officers to speed up the developmental works undertaken for beautification and development of Srinagar on heritage pattern.

The Minister was addressing officers during review meeting convened to discuss the status of implementation of various project undertaken for development and beautification of Srinagar City.

Commissioner Srinagar Municipal Corporation, Dr. G. N. Qasba, Additional Municipal Commissioner, Bashir Ahmad Khan and other senior officers were present in the meeting.

Mr. Sagar directed the officers to work in close coordination for ensuring early completion of various developmental programmes so that people get benefitted from these. He said that the Government has undertaken comprehensive project for the overall and sustained development of the city and in this regard an effective monitoring system has been put in place so that time bound completion

of development works is ensured. The Minister directed the concerned authorities to speed up the work on the city gate and ensure its completion within two months. He said that the information about all the historical places shrines and other important details about the old city Srinagar should be inscribed on it so that the visitors and tourists can get all the requisite information about these historic places.

Mr. Sagar also directed the officers to ensure that the street lights are installed in the City besides requisite measures should also be put in place to ensure proper high genic conditions especially during the ensuing tourist session.

The Minister also directed the concerned to prepare a comprehensive project for undertaking augmentation of various community halls so that the lacuna if any can be addressed. He also asked them to prepare a detailed project reports for construction of community halls at Bul-BulLankar and Nowhatta for the general convenience of the people living in these areas and its catchments.

Medicos to observe July 1 as black day

Excelsior Correspondent SRINAGAR, June 29: The Doctors Association Kashmir today said that they will observe July 1 as a black day to protest against the Government's "callous" attitude towards medical fraternity.

A statement of DAK, quoting its President Dr. Nisar Ul Hassan, said: "We have nothing to celebrate on this day. We are bruised, wounded by the callous attitude of the Government towards our fraternity. Worst of Human Rights Violation was done by police illegally and unconstitutionally arresting him

for showing dissent against fake drug scam which killed hundreds of innocent lives." "Arresting doctors for dissenting and righteous voice speaks volumes about the State and it proves beyond doubt that Jammu and Kashmir is a police State," the statement said.

The statement added that the association will file a writ petition against this unlawful act in the court. "We are writing to all international communities to intervene and force the union and state to refrain from human rights violation in the State against the medical fraternity," it said.
