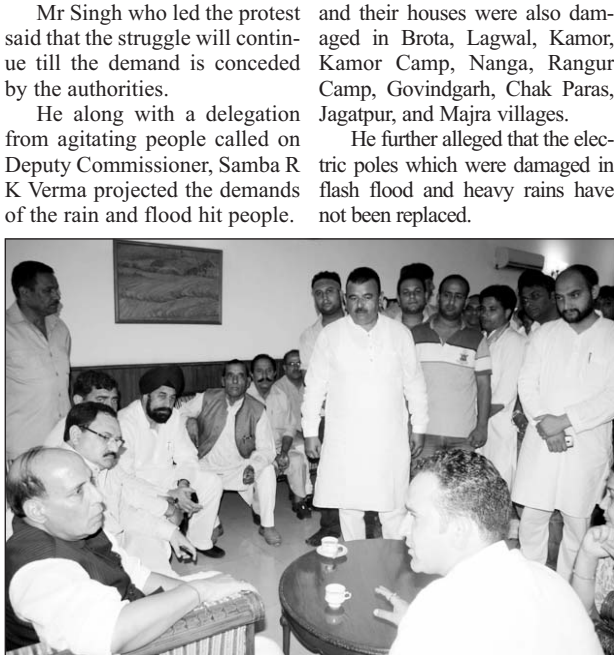


Former Minister Manjit Singh discussing flood victims problems with DC Samba on Monday. —Excelsior/Gautam

Manjit leads protest at DC office Samba

SAMBHA, Sept 2: Former Minister and senior Congress leader Manjit Singh today demanded time bound assessment and compensation for the flood hit areas of Samba district. Mr Singh who was addressing a protest demonstration in front of Deputy Commissioner's Office here demanded adequate compensation of the losses they suffered in the recent flash flood caused due to heavy rains in Ramgarh and other areas of the district.

The DC Samba assured that their demands would be assessed within a day or two and the team of officials would be sent to the affected areas of the district. The deputation led by Manjit Singh demanded that the officials should be directed to prepare list of the affected families in special places. The former Minister said that the people have suffered badly as their life has been hit due to the deplorable condition of link roads leading towards the fields, the crops were damaged due to floods and their houses were also damaged in Brota, Lagwal, Kamor, Kamor Camp, Nanga, Rangur Camp, Govindgarh, Chak Paras, Jagatpur, and Majra villages. He further alleged that the electric poles which were damaged in flash flood and heavy rains had not been replaced.

Kishtwar delegation leaves for Delhi

JAMMU, Sept 2: On the directions of the BJP national president Rajnath Singh, senior party leader from Kishtwar Sunil Sharma constituted a delegation from Kishtwar consisting of five representatives who left for Delhi today to interact with Members of Parliament from different political parties and to explain them the factual ground realities of the situation in Kishtwar following the violence on August 9.

Sunil Sharma said that the National President Rajnath Singh gave a patient hearing to what was narrated to him and expressed serious concern over the developments. He said that Rajnath Singh has issued instructions to the party leaders in Delhi to hold meetings with MPs from different political parties and apprise them of the plight of minorities in Kishtwar and high-handedness of Omar-led Government in dealing with the situation. He also said that Rajnath Singh has given them an assurance that if BJP is voted to power it will further strengthen the VDCs.

Sharma informed Mr Singh that none of the demands put forward by the minority community has been fulfilled so far. These included compensation based on assessment of losses, transfer of police officers including DIG against whom there is evidence of having instigated riots and violence against minority community. Prof BL Bhardwaj said that OBC castes and communities residing in the State have remained main sufferers as their census has not been done since 1931 due to which the State Government is pretending this plea and not giving them 27% reservation in State Government services as per Supreme Court Verdict-1992 on Mandal Commission Report-1980.
