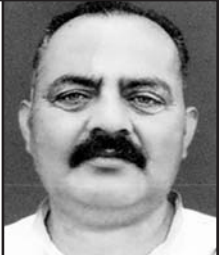

Cong constitutes manifesto implementation panels for 16 States

NEW DELHI, Sept 3: Congress tonight set up manifesto implementation committees for 16 states including poll-bound Delhi, Rajasthan and Mizoram bringing uniformity in their constitution. Senior minister A K Antony is the chairman of the panels for Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Arunachal Pradesh while Jairam Ramesh heads the implementation manifesto committees for Delhi, Haryana and Jharkhand.

Ghulam Nabi Azad has been made chairman of the committee for Assam. Union Minister Girija Vyas is the chairperson for the panel for Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya and Mizoram while Vayalar Ravi heads the committees for Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Jammu and Kashmir and Maharashtra.

M Veerappa Moily heads the panel for Kerala, while Motilal Vora is the chairman of the committee for Rajasthan. According to the new formula, the manifesto implementation committees will have a chairman from Centre, AICC general secretary in-charge for the State, PCC Chief, Chief Minister or CLP leader a senior leader from the State as members. While Chief Minister and PCC chief will be members from Congress-ruled State, it will be both CLP and PCC chief in States ruled by parties in alliance with Congress. "Congress President Sonia Gandhi has approved the proposal for reconstituting/constituting the manifesto implementation committees for Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Assam, Delhi, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Jammu and Kashmir, Kerala, Rajasthan, Maharashtra and Jharkhand," AICC general secretary Janardan Dwivedi said in a party press release. Global postal administrations should think differently: Pranab

NEW DELHI, Sept 3: In the backdrop of rapid changes taking place in the means of communications, President Pranab Mukherjee today said global postal administrations should proactively think of changes to compete with other market players in providing various high quality services. "The changing global scenario calls for postal administrations around the world to think differently. They must be proactive to change. They must leverage their strengths to provide quality service to the people," Mukherjee said while inaugurating the 11th Asian Pacific Postal Union (APPU) Congress here.

He said with rapid changes in technology, other means of communication such as e-mail have become increasingly important and people expect the same standards of quality, accountability and transparency that are being provided by other market players from the postal services. "In the context of a growing digital economy, the changing customer expectation has made it imperative for postal service providers to innovate and develop services suited to their requirements," the President said. Stating that globalisation has opened a great window of opportunity for the postal sector, Mukherjee said, "there is a huge scope for postal services to be engaged in e-commerce, and gain from the rising demand for such business products." He said in 2012, around 60 million migrant workers of Asia Pacific region lived outside their countries of origin and they remitted USD 260 billion to their households. (PTI)

19-yr-old files plaint of rape against Mumbai gangrape accused

MUMBAI, Sept 3: Another case of sexual assault by the five accused in the Mumbai photojournalist gangrape case has come to light with a 19-year-old woman filing a complaint that she too was raped by some of the culprits in the gang at the defunct Shakti Mills compound here.

The victim lodged a complaint at Bhandup Police Station in eastern suburbs yesterday stating that she had been raped on July 31 by some of those arrested in the photojournalist case, Deputy Police Commissioner Vinayak Deshmukh told. According to police, the victim had gone to Mahalaxmi area for some work and was also accompanied by a male friend, when the culprits, in a similar modus operandi to the August 22 gang rape, tricked her and took her to the dilapidated mill.

Her male friend was also tied by the accused before they raped the woman, as they did while committing the offence on the photojournalist, police said. The case was later transferred to N M Joshi Marg police station as the mill falls under its jurisdiction. According to police, two or three men of the gang involved in raping the photojournalist were also part of the group which sexually assaulted the 19-year-old. "For clues on the wanted accused in the case, several persons have been rounded up for questioning and a suspect has been detained," said an official involved in the probe.

On August 22, the 23-year-old photojournalist had been gangraped by five persons at the desolate mill, when she was on an assignment with a male colleague.

All the five accused - Salim Ansari, Vijay Jadhav, Mohammed Kasim, Hafiz Shaikh alias Kasim Bengali and Siraj Rehman Khan and a minor - were arrested in the journalist's case and are currently in crime branch custody.

During interrogation, the gangrape accused had told the police that they made several women their victims in last six months including the young photojournalist, a ragpicker and a commercial sex worker. (PTI)

Babri case: SC allows CBI's plea, prepones hearing to October

NEW DELHI, Sept 3: The Supreme Court today preponed by about two months the date of hearing in Babri Masjid demolition case against L K Advani and 19 others after CBI pleaded for an early hearing which was not opposed by the senior BJP leader. A bench headed by Justice G S Singhvi, before whom the matter was mentioned by the CBI, passed the order and preponed the case to first week of October which was earlier listed for hearing in December.

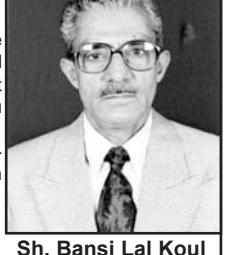
The case was filed by CBI challenging Allahabad High Court's verdict on dropping conspiracy charge against Advani and 19 others in Babri Masjid demolition case. Pleading for early hearing, senior advocate P P Rao, appearing for CBI, submitted that the case was earlier directed to be listed in September for hearing but registry record says that the matter will be taken up by the apex court in December. Senior advocate K K Venugopal, appearing for Advani, also agreed to preponement of the hearing date. The apex court had earlier pulled up CBI for the delay in filing an appeal against the Allahabad High Court verdict. CBI had filed an appeal in the apex court challenging the verdicts of a special CBI court and the Allahabad High Court dropping conspiracy charge against Advani, Kalyan Singh, Uma Bharti, Vinay Katiyar and Murl Manohar Joshi. The others against whom the charge was dropped included Satish Pradhan, C R Bansal, Ashok Singhal, Giriraj Kishore, Sadhvi Ritambhara, V H Dalmia, Mahant Avaidhynath, R V Vedanti, Param Hans Ram Chandra Das, Jagdish Muni Maharaj, B L Sharma, Nriyga Gopal Das, Dharam Das, Satish Nagar and Moreshwar Save.
