Thousands of Japanese who gathered in Tokyo in the early hours of Sunday erupted in joy, making V for victory signs and shouting "banzai!" (hurrah!), as the result was beamed live from the Argentine capital nearly a dozen time zones away.

At the Tokyo Chamber of Commerce and Industry, crowds shouted "arigato" (thank you) in unison, several television hosts and their guests were lost for words and in tears, while at the Komozawa Olympic Park -venue of several sports at the 1964 Games -- golden tinsel rained down in celebration.
