

## Babri demolition verdict in 9 months

NEW DELHI, July 19:

The Supreme Court today asked the special judge conducting trial in the Babri Masjid demolition case, involving BJP veterans such as L K Advani, M M Joshi and Uma Bharti, to deliver the verdict within nine months.

A bench of Justices R F Nariman and Surya Kant said the recording of evidence in the politically sensitive case should be complete within six months.

The bench also directed the Uttar Pradesh government to pass appropriate orders within four weeks to extend the tenure of the special judge, who is set to retire on September 30.

The top court said the extension of tenure of the special judge will only be for the purpose of concluding the trial and delivering the verdict in the case.

During the extended tenure, he will remain under the administrative control of the

## Man ran over by car borne youth

POONCH, July 19: A man was severely injured when a person allegedly ran over him with a car in Mendhar area of Poonch district over some money dispute.

Reports said one Mushtaq Ahmad, son of Mohd Razaak hailing from Pharamanar in Gursai went to collect Rs 8000 on his motorcycle from one Waseem Aslam at Jaran Wali Gali on Friday. There was some heated exchanges between the two over money issue.

The Waseem allegedly hit Mushtaq with the car as a result of which he fell down and suffered serious injuries. Waseem then sped away from the spot. The injured was shifted to SDH Mendhar and later referred to GMC Jammu for advanced treatment.

SHO Gursai Sanjay Gupta said that police received a complaint and a case has been registered in this connection. A Police party has been dispatched to nab the accused," he added.

Allahabad High Court, it said.

The special judge had on Monday moved the apex court seeking six more months to conclude the matter.

Besides Advani, Joshi and Uma Bharti, the accused against whom conspiracy charge was invoked in the case by the Supreme Court on April 19, 2017, include former BJP MP Vinay Katiar and Sadhvi Ritambara.

Three other high-profile accused Giriraj Kishore, and Vishva Hindu Parishad leader Ashok Singhal and Vishnu Hari Dalmia died during trial and the proceedings against them have been abated.

The top court had held that Rajasthan Governor Kalyan Singh, during whose tenure as chief minister of Uttar Pradesh the disputed structure was razed, is entitled to immunity under the Constitution as long as he remains in gubernatorial position.

The top court on Monday sought assistance of the Uttar

Pradesh government to devise a mechanism to extend the tenure of the special judge to enable him conclude the trial in the case.

"The special judge after two years of virtual day to day hearing is at the flag end of the hearing of the case and requires little more than six months to complete the trial together with the delivery of the judgement".

"However, in his letter to us dated May 25, 2019, he has indicated that he will be super-annuating on September 30, 2019. We are of the view it is important for the special judge to conclude the proceedings and pronounce the judgement in the case. Given the facts and circumstances, we call upon the state of Uttar Pradesh to assist us on this behalf. List on Friday," the court had said.

On April 19, 2017, the top court had ordered day-to-day trial to be concluded in two years in the Babri Masjid demolition case. (PTI)

## LMD imposes Rs 73500 fine on defaulters

SAMBA, July 19: Continuing with their efforts to ensure mandatory declarations are printed on all the pre-packed goods for the information of consumers, the department of Legal Metrology, Samba fined seven traders for violating the provisions of the law enforced for the purpose.

According to Rajesh Heera Assistant Controller Legal Metrology Samba all the pre-packed goods which are being packed in absence of consumers must declare Net Weight, Max Retail Price along with packing date, address of the packer/importer and consumer care number. He said that on inspection of various hardware

stores, provisional stores, sweet shops, ration depots etc at Samba, Bari Brahmana and adjoining areas, it was observed that the packages of crockery items, Rice bags, flour bags etc were offered for sale to the consumer without declaring all these declarations.

Some of the deceptive packages were seized by the inspector Legal Metrology Samba Mohsin khateeb from the defaulter traders.

After hearing the traders, Assistant Controller recovered a fine amounting Rs 73500 as composition sum with the assurance that the offences will not be repeated in future, failing which their cases will be sent to the court of law for stringent action.

## Unknown man dies in road mishap

JAMMU, July 19: A male pedestrian of age about 35 years was killed today after hit by some unknown vehicle in Channi area on city outskirts.

According to a police official, the deceased man is yet to be identified. "However, he appears to be a labourer from outside the State," said, adding the body has been shifted to mortuary room of Government Medical College and Hospital, Jammu for identification/post-mortem.

The official said that the mishap occurred today at about 1:30 AM on Bypass Road at Channi near Army Gate. The deceased labourer was in inebriated condition when accident happened, he further said, adding that a case under relevant section was registered at police station Channi Himmat and investigations started.

## New graft case against Zardari

ISLAMABAD, July 19:

Pakistan's anti-graft body today filed a new case of corruption against former President Asif Ali Zardari for allegedly being involved in transfer of billions of rupees to a company, co-owned by him and his son Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari, through fake bank accounts.

According to the National Accountability Bureau (NAB), Zardari, who is also the Pakistan People's Party (PPP) co-chairman, had acquired Karachi-based real estate firm Park Lane Estate Company (Pvt) Ltd illegally through a front man in 1989.

In 2009, Zardari and Bilawal became shareholders of the company.

The NAB claimed that billions of rupees were transferred to the company through fake bank accounts. The company also took loans of billions of rupees from banks using the political clout of Zardari, it claimed.

The 63-year-old husband of the country's first woman Prime Minister Benazir Bhutto was arrested by NAB officials in the Park Lane case on July 1. He was already in NAB's custody since June 10 after the Islamabad High Court dismissed his pre-arrest bail petition in the fake accounts case.

According to the NAB, Zardari is being investigated for his alleged involvement in extending loans and other misappropriation by Parthenon Private Limited, Park Lane Estate Private Limited and others.

Zardari's sister Faryal Talpur was also arrested in the fake account case.

The 11th President of Pakistan from 2008 to 2013 has denied any link with the fake accounts. He has said the allegation was part of a vilification campaign by Imran Khan-led ruling Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party to malign the Opposition leaders. (PTI)

## 4 drug peddlers arrested with cannabis

JAMMU, July 19: Gangyal police arrested four drug peddlers and recovered 4.2 kilograms cannabis from their possession.

As per police sources, on specific information, a team from Gangyal Police Station led by ASI Sat Pal under the supervision of SHO Inspector Sunil Singh Jasrotia and SDPO South Dr Sunniya Ashkooor Wani laid a naka near Kunjwani Chowk and intercepted a Tata Sumo bearing registration number JK03C-8414.

During checking, police team recovered 4.2 kilograms of cannabis from the possession of four persons traveling in the vehicle and arrested them.

The arrested persons have

been identified as Muzaffar Ahmed Bhat (driver), son of Mohammad Sadiq Bhat of Charkpora, Pahalgam District Anantnag, Umar Bashir Khan, son of Bashir Ahmed Khan of Chak Mohalla, Pahalgam District Anantnag, Ram Kumar, son of Harkesh of Bagrukhard Jind and Joginder Singh, son of Dhaitiya of Dhan Soli, Kurar, Panipat.

A case under FIR Number 69/19 under section 8/20/29 NDPS Act has been registered at Police Station Gangyal and investigation initiated.

Police team led by ASI Sat Pal made the arrest under the supervision of SHO Inspector Sunil Singh Jasrotia, SDPO South Dr Sunniya Ashkooor Wani and SP South Vinay Sharma.

## Karnataka CM, Congress move SC against Governor's interference in Assembly proceedings

NEW DELHI, July 19:

Karnataka Chief Minister H D Kumaraswamy and Congress moved the Supreme Court today accusing Governor Vajubhai Vala of interfering with the Assembly proceedings during the debate on trust vote, and sought clarification on its July 17 order causing hindrance in issuing whip to the legislators.

Kumaraswamy and Karnataka Congress chief Dinesh Gundu Rao filed separate applications on Friday afternoon after the 1.30 PM deadline set by the Governor to conclude the proceedings of the confidence motion was not met.

Both the applications sought clarification of the July 17 order of the apex court by which the 15 rebel Congress-JD(S) MLAs were granted relief that they cannot be compelled to participate in the ongoing Assembly proceedings.

The order "whittles down" a political party's power to issue whip to its MLAs as it has a constitutional right to do so and the court can't restrict that, they said.

While Kumaraswamy questioned the deadlines set by the

Governor one after another for completing the trust vote, Rao submitted that the apex court order was passed without involving the Congress legislature party, which presently has 79 MLAs in the Assembly.

The apex court on July 17 passed the order on the plea of the 15 rebel MLAs in which the Speaker K R Ramesh Kumar and Chief Minister H D Kumaraswamy were made respondents.

Both the applications were filed at a time when the Assembly was debating the confidence motion moved by Kumaraswamy.

The Chief Minister was categorical to state in his application that "the Governor cannot dictate to the House the manner in which the debate of the confidence motion has to be taken up".

"The directions of the Governor are completely contrary to the well settled law laid down by this Court in relation to the Governors powers. The directions of the Governor are ex-facie in contravention of the judgment of this Court," his plea said.

The application of Congress

sought clarification on the order which said the 15 rebel MLAs cannot be compelled to participate in the ongoing Assembly proceedings, saying that the direction compromises with the party's right to issue whip.

"It is respectfully submitted that as a result of the order dated July 17, the constitutional rights of the applicant under the Tenth Schedule are vitally affected and as such the instant Application is being moved," the Congress plea said.

It submitted that under the Tenth Schedule of the Constitution, a political party has a right to issue a whip to its legislators, the ground also taken by Kumaraswamy.

"The exercise of this right under the Constitution is not circumscribed by any condition nor can it be subject to any restrictive orders from the Court even prior to the issuance of the whip.

More importantly, any enquiry for the purposes of the Tenth Schedule is a proceeding of the Legislature of the State within the meaning of Article 212 of the Constitution," both the applications said. (PTI)
