

On this occasion, I pay my homage to the firemen of Fire & Emergency Services who have attained martyrdom while rendering their services for the safety of their people.



**PM calls for united global efforts
to defeat COVID pandemic**

NEW DELHI, Apr 13:

Prime Minister Narendra Modi today stressed the need for united global efforts to deal with the coronavirus crisis, saying mankind will not be able to defeat it unless everyone comes out of it.

In an address at the Raisina Dialogue, the Prime Minister said India tried to protect its 1.3 billion nationals from COVID-19, and, at the same time, tried to support pandemic response efforts of others.

"We understand fully, that mankind will not defeat the pandemic unless all of us, everywhere, regardless of the colour of our passports, come out of it. That is why, this year, despite many constraints, we have supplied vaccines to over 80 countries," he said at the conference, held virtually.

The Prime Minister further

said, "We will continue to share our experiences, our expertise and also our resources with humanity in the fight against the pandemic."

While we may be used to having 'Plan A' and 'Plan B' but there is no Planet B and only Planet Earth, he said and added so, we must remember that we hold this planet merely as trustees for our future generations.

The Prime Minister also said that during this pandemic, in our own humble way, within our own limited resources, we in India have tried to walk the talk.

Organised by the Observer Research Foundation (ORF), a think-tank, in partnership with the Ministry of External Affairs, Raisina Dialogue is India's premier conference on geopolitics and geo-economics, and its sixth edition is being held from April 13 to 16. (PTI)

Monsoon to be 'healthy normal'

NEW DELHI, Apr 13:

The Southwest monsoon, which brings more than 75 per cent of the country's rainfall during June-September, will be normal this year, Skymet Weather, a private weather forecaster said today.

The north India plains, along with a few parts of the northeast region, are likely to be at risk of being rain deficient through the season, the Skymet said.

G P Sharma, President (Meteorology) of the Skymet Weather said the Long Period Average (LPA) of the rainfall during June to September will be 103 per cent with an error margin of plus or minus 5 per cent.

"That is the healthy normal," Sharma said.

He added that there is 60 per cent probability of a 'normal' monsoon and 15 per cent probability of 'above normal' rainfall.

Monsoon in the range of 96-104 of the LPA is considered to be normal and 103 per cent of the LPA is on the higher side of the normal range.

On a monthly scale, June is likely to receive rainfall of 106 per cent of LPA, while July is expected to record 97 per cent of LPA. August and September

are expected to receive 99 per cent and 116 per cent of the LPA, the Skymet said.

Sharma said 2021 will be the third consecutive year of a good monsoon. Last two years have recorded above normal rainfall.

In terms of geographical risk, the plains of north India along with a few parts of the northeast region are likely to be at risk of being rain deficient through the season, the Skymet said. (PTI)

Sushil Chandra assumes charge as Chief Election Commissioner

NEW DELHI, Apr 13:

Sushil Chandra assumed charge as the 24th Chief Election Commissioner today.

Chandra was appointed as the CEC on Monday, the day Sunil Arora demitted office.

Chandra was appointed as an Election Commissioner on February 14, 2019, ahead of the Lok Sabha elections. He would demit office on May 14, 2022.

Under him, the Election Commission (EC) will hold Assembly polls in Goa, Manipur, Uttarakhand, Punjab and Uttar Pradesh.

The term of the assemblies of Goa, Manipur, Uttarakhand and Punjab ends on various dates in March next year.

The term of the Uttar Pradesh assembly ends on May 14 next year. Chandra belongs to the 1980 batch of the Indian Revenue Service.

He is also an ex-officio member of the Delimitation Commission since February 18, 2020 looking after the process in

the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

Having held several posts in the Income Tax Department for nearly 39 years, Chandra was appointed the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) Chairman on November 1, 2016.

He spent considerable time as Director of Investigation and Director General of Investigation, Mumbai and Gujarat, respectively followed by his stint as Member (Investigation), CBDT and thereafter assuming the post of Chairman of this apex body.

"Transparency and purity of political finance are of vital importance for free and fair electoral process and the creation of a level playing field. Continuing the crusade that he started as CBDT Chairman against the menace of black money, Chandra was proactive as the erstwhile Election Commissioner in curbing the use of money power that vitiates the electoral process," the Commission said on today.(PTI)

'Ensure essential commodities at affordable prices during Ramadan'

BANIHAL, Apr 13: National Conference (NC) District Ramban president, Sajjad Shaheen today demanded that J&K administration should take measures to ensure the supply of essential commodities, vegetables and fruits at affordable prices during the month of Ramzan beginning from tomorrow.

In a handout he stated that people have started facing shortage of several essential commodities due to various factors like frequent road blockade and traffic jams on National Highway.

"This shortage leads to price escalation impacting common man," he said adding that the Government should take immediate measures to control the situation.

The NC leader said that ration scarcity and defunct utility services are posing enormous problems to the people of entire Ramban district especially in areas of Banihal like Mahu, Mangit, Khari, Nadika, Trigam, Kumbala, Buzla, Srachi, Hinjhal, Fagow, Tethar, Chachal, Neel, Chaknarwah, Chamalwas, Shagan, Hingni, Zonchwas, Sumar, Harog, Pogal, Maligam, Paristan, Gagarnag, Sarachi, Chaka, Sarbagni, Amkot, Thachi etc.

He also expressed concern over the huge rise in the prices of chicken and mutton.

5 injured in accident

DODA, Apr 13: Five persons were injured when the Maruti car they were travelling in rolled down into deep gorge in Forewan area here.

Notorious drug peddler arrested

JAMMU, Apr 13: Gharota Police arrested a notorious drug peddler and recovered heroin from his possession.

As per police sources, during checking, a team from Police Station Gharota led by SHO Inspector Khayati Maan Khajuria arrested a notorious drug peddler along with heroin like substance.

The arrested person was identified as Gulshan Kumar, son of Ashok Kumar of Jampur, at present Kot tehsil Bhalwal.

Pertinent to mention here that the same person was earlier booked in cases registered under FIR Numbers 21/2021 under Sections 332 and 34 IPC and FIR Number 24/2019 under Section 8/20/21/22 NDPS Act with Police Station Gharota. There were reports of him being involved in sale of drugs in Jammu and was evading police.

A fresh case under FIR Number 26/2021 under Section 8/21/22 NDPS Act has been registered at Police Station Gharota and investigation started.
