**LG reviews development works in Ramban**

**Yatra and ensure that COVID-19 appropriate behaviour is adopted by the people in the district. He also laid special emphasis on making serious efforts to intensify testing and vaccination.**

He reviewed the status of staff strength of the Health Department, especially doctors and stressed on rationalizing the human resources for providing better healthcare services to all.

Sinha observed that the area being accident prone, directions were already passed for establishment of Trauma centre in order to provide requisite medicare facilities to the people.

Terminating better road connectivity as a key feature in the socio-economic development of any region, he reviewed progress of PMGSY road projects under execution in Ramban and Banihal divisions and directed for completion of all road projects in the district to strengthen the road network. He also took stock of rates of construction material being used in various projects.

He asked the NHAI to provide employment to local youth in ongoing national projects, besides providing them skill development training in required trades.

NHAI authorities were also directed to ensure proper maintenance of existing national highways, besides constructing crash barriers and parapets at all vulnerable locations to avoid road mishaps.

While reviewing the functioning of Jal Shakti department, Sinha directed the department to complete all the projects taken up under languishing and other schemes in stipulated time period.

He observed that under Jal Jeevan Mission, Government is targeting to provide piped water supply (Har Ghar Nal se Jal) to every household and called upon all the stakeholders to complement Government's efforts for its effective implementation on ground.

During the meeting, threadbare discussion was also held on development and growth of the industrial sector in the district. The Lt Governor directed the Deputy Commissioner to submit a comprehensive plan for the establishment of Industrial estate in Ramban.

He also passed specific directions to the district administration to identify suitable land for establishing Solid Waste Management plants.

The Lt Governor directed the functionalities of Rural Development Department to take comprehensive measures for the timely completion of Panchayat Ghars, besides starting the work on newly sanctioned infrastructure to facilitate the PRI representatives.

With a view to extending hand-holding to the young Entrepreneurs who are interested in starting their own business ventures, he instructed the Lead Bank Manager to ensure loan facility being made available to youth identified during the Back to Village programme.

Education and Social Welfare departments were directed to register all eligible students under Scholarship Schemes by ending May. Directions were also passed to Director School Education to rationalize the teaching staff in the district.

Emphasizing on strengthening the e-Governance ecosystem, the Lt Governor called for regular updating of all Government departments' websites with latest information. He further asked the

officers to acquaint themselves with all online services being made available for the ease of the people.

The Lt Governor, while reviewing the Power Sector, directed the Executive Engineer JPDCL to ensure metering of every household, besides collecting pending revenue (Electricity bills) from consumers. He also took stock of transformers repairing and maintenance status in the district.

He also reviewed the preparedness being made by the district administration for Shri Amarnath Ji yatra and passed necessary directions to the administration for ensuring the provision of adequate facilities to the visiting yatris.

Sinha reviewed the security scenario of the district. While presenting a report on security issues, SSP Ramban, PD Nitya apprised the Lt Governor with a security plan besides highlighting the importance of creating new police units in various parts of the district.

Earlier, Mussarat Islam, Deputy Commissioner Ramban gave a detailed overview of the development scenario in the district.

Meanwhile, the Lt Governor interacted with several delegations including DDC Chairperson, DDC members, BDC Chairpersons, Municipal Councils, PRIs, Bar Association Ramban and Political parties and took first hand appraisal of their concerns issues and demands.

Underlining the important role of PRIs in grassroot development, he observed that the Government has doubled the District Development plan (District Capex Budget) for the year Financial Year 2021-22 and asked all the members of three-tier of Panchayati Raj Institutions to prepare a comprehensive development plan for implementing allocated plan/projects to ensure overall development of the district.

Responding to the issue pertaining to development of sports infrastructure, he directed DC Ramban to identify a suitable land for the sports stadium. He also asked the DC to address all genuine issues highlighted by the various delegations and public representatives.

On being apprised of the issue of construction of a bridge over the river Chenab in Maitra, the Lt Governor informed that the funds have been allocated to complete the same for the convenience of general public.

He also directed the NHAI to construct an overhead bridge to facilitate the people, especially students of Government Girls Higher Secondary School, Banihal.

A delegation led by the DDC Chairperson, Ramban, Shamshad Shan and Vice-Chairperson, Rabia Beig highlighted the issues pertaining to establishment of University Campus in Ramban, Women Degree College Banihal, start of work on Sawalakote Hydro Power Project, fire tenders for all blocks, up-gradation of schools, Blood Bank for Banihal Hospital and construction of a new Accident Hospital at Ramsoo.

Similarly, a delegation of BDC Chairpersons highlighted the issues related to land and damage compensation, enhancement of funds in BDC development plan and Tribal plan.

BVR Subrahmanyam, Chief Secretary; Dr. Raghav Langer, Divisional Commissioner Jammu; Mukesh Singh, IGP Jammu; Abdul Jabbar, DIG DKR range; JS Johar SSP Traffic; Chief Engineers, HoDs of various departments, District and Sectoral officers attended the meeting.

**2 militants, 3 OGWs arrested**

receipt of specific inputs about presence of militants' at different locations, different teams were constituted and the two militants and three OGWs were tactfully arrested.

"On the basis of specific information, police along with 32 RR of Army and 92 battalion CRPF established a naka at Kachloo crossing on Baramulla Handwara highway. During search and checking, three persons riding a motorcycle were found in suspicious condition who on seeing the search party tried to escape from the spot but were apprehended by the search party," the officer said.

They were identified as Mohammad Yaseen son of Mohammad Akbar, Showkat Ahmad Ganie son of Sonaula Ganie and Ghulam Nabi Rather son of Wali Mohammad, all residents of Village Kachloo Qaziabad. "On their personal search, arms and ammunitions and letter pad of Al-Badr were recovered from their possession," the officer said.

He added that during questioning it came to surface that the trio are working with militant outfit Al-Badr as OGWs and were providing logistic support, food and shelter to the outfit.

**Ramadan begins from today**

In the meantime, Improvised Explosive Device material was recovered today in orchards of Kamraazpora area of South Kashmir's Pulwama district.

Police said that during searching explosive material was found by joint forces of police and Army's 53RR in orchards of Kamraazpora. More details will follow.

**Implementation of Supreme Court directions yet to begin in J&K UT**

Department and Additional Secretary to the Government, Finance Department is supposed to ensure purchase and monitor distribution/installation of CCTV cameras and related equipments.

The Terms of Reference also include arranging budgetary allocation; monitoring maintenance and upkeep of CCTVs and allied equipment; carry out inspections and address the grievances received from District Level Oversight Committees (DLOCs) and call for monthly reports from the DLOCs and immediately address any concern like faulty equipment.

Similarly, the District Level Oversight Committees headed by concerned Divisional Commissioner and comprised of Chairperson(s) of the District Development Council(s), District Magistrate(s) and Superintendent(s) of Police is supposed to ensure the maintenance of CCTVs and related equipments.

The Terms of Reference of DLOCs also include seeking inputs from the concerned Station House Officers; send monthly reports to UT Level Oversight Committee about the functioning of CCTVs and allied equipments and to review footage stored from CCTVs in various Police Stations to check for any human rights violation that may have occurred but are not reported.

"The inaction on the part of Oversight Committees clearly indicates that Government is least interested in implementing the directions of the Supreme Court which otherwise are very important in order to keep watch on the functioning of Jammu and Kashmir Police at the Police Station level", sources said.

They stressed that Government should ensure that Oversight Committees start acting on the Terms of Reference in order to implement the directions of the Apex Court.

**CBI nabs Passport Asstt taking graft**

"Dr Ambedkar envisioned a better and just society and fought for it throughout his life," he said.

He wanted to create a modern India where there would be no prejudice on the basis of caste or any other reason; where women and communities subjected to backwardness for centuries would enjoy equity of economic and social rights, Kovind said.(PTI)

**Govt fast-tracks approval for vaccines**

The move is significant as it may make available several vaccines, including those made by Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson, in India with certain conditions.

The first 100 beneficiaries of such foreign vaccines shall be assessed for seven days for safety outcomes before they are rolled out for further immunization programme within the country, the Union Health

Ministry said.

Terming it a significant development and a liberal regulatory step that will increase the access to vaccines manufactured outside, NITI Aayog member (Health) Dr V K Paul said, "we hope and we invite vaccine makers such as Pfizer, Moderna, Johnson and Johnson and others...To be ready to come to India as early as possible."(PTI)

**3 Corona deaths in Jammu, one in Kashmir; 1269 fresh cases**

village Khaitam in Surankote tehsil of Poonch district, who was co-morbid and positive for pathogen, breathed his last in the Government Medical College (GMC) Jammu while a 70-year-old man from Sabjian succumbed to the virus in District Hospital Poonch an hour after his hospitalization.

With three deaths, Jammu region's Corona toll has reached 755, the maximum 392 being in Jammu district, 64 Doda, 58 Udhampur, 56 Rajouri, 53 Kathua, 43 Samba, 28 Poonch, 23 Ramban, 22 Kishtwar and 16 in Reasi district.

Udhampur district today surpassed even Jammu district in total number of positive cases mainly because of large numbers of BSF jawans deployed at Jaganoo testing positive for the virus. While Udhampur reported 265 new cases, Jammu district recorded 191 positives.

Reasi district was placed third with 62 cases including 48 travelers, mostly tourists who tested positive at the Railway Station. Majority of such positives are either being sent back from Katra Railway Station or being lodged in the COVID Care Centres.

In Udhampur district, 31 more BSF jawans today tested positive for Coronavirus taking number of total soldiers who have been infected during last five days to 586. All of them have been isolated at their Jaganoo based battalion's headquarters.

Fifty five more persons today tested positive at Lakhampur, the gateway to Jammu and Kashmir, in Kathua district. They include 10 each from Punjab, New Delhi and Uttar Pradesh and six from Madhya Pradesh. Rest of the positives include 11 from Jammu, six from Srinagar and two Kathua.

Positives in other districts of Jammu region include 17 in Rajouri, 11 Samba, six Poonch and

two each in Ramban and Doda districts. No fresh cases were reported from Kishtwar district today.

Today, 101 persons recovered from the virus in Jammu, 57 of them in Jammu district, 35 Reasi, four Udhampur, three Doda and one each in Rajouri and Poonch districts.

Jammu region now has 56284 Corona cases. Of them, 3267 are active positives while 52263 have recovered from the virus and there have been 755 casualties.

All 125 fresh COVID positives cases in the UT of Ladakh were today reported from Leh district taking Corona cases to 10905 including 721 active (666 in Leh and 55 in Kargil) as there have been 10053 recoveries and 131 deaths-87 in Leh and 44 in Kargil.

Meanwhile, Kashmir reported 687 cases of COVID-19 today while one person died in the Valley.

One person who was suffering from COVID-19 infection died in Kashmir today taking the Jammu and Kashmir death toll due to Coronavirus to 2037 including 1283 from Kashmir.

Those who tested positive include 423 Srinagar, 98 Baramulla, 42 Budgam, 28 Pulwama, 24 Kupwara, 29 Anantnag, 12 Bandipora, 15 Ganderbal, 9 Kulgam and 7 from Shopian.

With fresh cases, the number of cases in Kashmir division has reached 84,366 including 77,669 recoveries and 1,283 deaths.

The number of active cases in Jammu and Kashmir has surged to 8,681 with spike in the coronavirus cases here for last three weeks.

The number of active cases in Jammu and Kashmir are 8,681 including 5,414 from Kashmir division.

With 493 more recoveries, the tally of total recoveries in Jammu and Kashmir has reached 129,932 which is 92.37 percent of the total cases.

**India records 1.61 lakh cases**

NEW DELHI, Apr 13:

A total of 1,61,736 new Coronavirus infections have been reported in a day today pushing India's tally of cases to 1,36,89,453, while the national COVID-19 recovery rate dropped further to 89.51 per cent, according to data updated by the Union Health Ministry.

The death toll increased to 1,71,058 with 879 new fatalities, the data updated at 8 am showed.

Registering a steady increase for the 34th day in a row, the number of active cases rose to 12,64,698, or 9.24 per cent of the total infections.

The active caseload was at its lowest at 1,35,926 on February 12, 2021 and it was at its highest at

10,17,754 on September 18, 2020.

The number of people who have recuperated from the disease surged to 1,22,53,697, while the case fatality rate has dropped further to 1.25 per cent, the data stated.

India's COVID-19 tally had crossed the 20-lakh mark on August 7; 30 lakh on August 23; 40 lakh on September 5; and 50 lakh on September 16. It went past 60 lakh on September 28; 70 lakh on October 11; 80 lakh on October 29; 90 lakh on November 20; and the one-crore mark on December 19.

According to the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), 25,92,07,108 samples have been tested up to April 12, of which 14,00,122 were done on Monday.(PTI)
