Speaker, 2 Cabinet Ministers to reach Leh tomorrow to discuss strengthening of PRIs

Speaker Om Birla, Jal Shakti Minister Gajender Singh Shekhawat and Heavy Industries Minister Mahendra Nath Pandey will be visiting Leh on August 27 to discuss strengthening of Panchayati Raj Institutions in the Union Territory of Ladakh.

They will address function on the PRIs in which Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh Radha Krishna Mathur, CEC-cum-Chairperson Leh Hill Development Council Tashi Gyalson and CEC-cum-Chairperson of Kargil Hill Development Council Ferz Khan will also be present.

Describing visit of the Lok Sabha Speaker and two Cabinet Ministers along with him as very significant, sources said their presence and study of situation in the Union Territory of Ladakh will definitely give push to overall development of the UT besides strengthening the Panchayati Raj Institutions.

Sources expressed confidence that visit of the Speaker and two senior Cabinet Ministers will help in further empowerment of the Panchayati Raj Institutions in Ladakh.

Meanwhile, National Board for Wildlife Welfare has given clearance for construction of 10 roads in Ladakh.

This was announced by Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh Radha Krishna Mathur in a tweet.

Extending gratitude to Minister for Environment, Forests and Climate change and Labour and Employment Bhupender Yadav for clearance of roads, Mathur tweeted: "this will speed up pace of development activities in the region".

Union Minister for Tourism, Culture and Development G Kishan Reddy will be virtually addressing a function for tourism promotion in Ladakh tomorrow.

"The objective of the event is to promote Ladakh as a tourist destination with focus on aspects of adventure, culture and responsible tourism. Any terror activity from Taliban will be firmly dealt with: CDS

The Quad comprises India, the US, Japan and Australia.

Gen Rawat said New Delhi was concerned about the possibility of terrorist activities from Afghanistan impacting India and contingency plans were put into place to deal with such a challenge.

"From India's perspective, we were anticipating a Taliban takeover of Afghanistan. We were concerned about how the terrorist activities from Afghanistan could overflow into India," he said.

"And to that extent, our contingency planning had been ongoing and we are prepared for it. Yes, the timelines certainly surprised us. We were anticipating this thing happening maybe a couple of months down the line," he added.

Gen Rawat said the Taliban has not changed in the last 20 years and only its partners have changed.

"It is pretty much the same; it is the same Taliban that was there 20 years ago. News reports and reports from the expats who have come from there are all telling us the kind of activities the Taliban is into. All that has happened is that the partners have now changed. It is the same Taliban with different partners," Gen Rawat observed.

His comments came in the backdrop of mounting concerns

over the possibility of rise in activities of various terror groups including the Lashkar-e-Toiba and Jaish-e-Mohammed from Taliban-controlled Afghanistan.

Admiral Aquilino largely talked about challenges facing the Indo-Pacific, noting that it is the most consequential region for the future.

"The attack on the rules-based international order that allows freedom of navigation for all is certainly one of the most critical challenges," he said.

"That freedom of navigation allows two-thirds of the world's economy to flow through the South China Sea. One-quarter of the world's liquid natural gas flows through the area. It is critical for the prosperity of all the nations and when it is challenged and potentially confronted, that will negatively impact all the nations in the region," Admiral Aquilino said.

He described the challenges as the "foundational security concern".

"There are many more. There is economic coercion, there is corruption. There are challenges that the Indians, specifically with regard to sovereignty on the Line of Actual Control...There are rules against the people of Hong Kong," he said. (PTI)

J&K not paying serious attention towards transparency audit of RTI Act disclosures

Authorities should proactively disclose the names of the third-party auditors on their websites. For carrying out third-party audit through outside consultants also, Public Authorities should utilize their plan/non-plan funds".

"Not only before the bifurcation of erstwhile State of Jammu and Kashmir into two Union Territories even after that no serious attention has so far been paid towards ensuring transparency audit of the disclosures under the Right to Information Act", official sources told EXCELSIOR, adding "the most shocking aspect is that even majority of the Public Authorities in this Union Territory are completely unaware of the DoPT order".

They further said, "this is mainly because neither the Public Authorities themselves took any initiative nor the General Administration Department of J&K, which has a key role to play in this regard, came forward to guide the Public Authorities in order to ensure compliance of DoPT order".

As per the DoPT order, the Central Information Commission is required to examine third-party audit reports for each Public Authority and offer advice/recommendations. Moreover, the Commission is supposed to carry out sample

audit of few of the Public Authorities each year with regard to adequacy of items included as well as compliance of the Public Authority with these guidelines.

They further said: There is no justification behind not paying serious attention towards DoPT order as a report titled "Transparency Audit: Towards an Open and Accountable Government" was prepared under the auspices of the Central Information Commission (CIC) in the year 2015 which outlined the framework of conducting disclosure audit to verify and authenticate disclosure of information.

The main objective of this exercise is two-fold. One is to make a thorough assessment of voluntary disclosures and the other is to indicate the areas and directions for increasing transparency in Public Authorities. This exercise is aimed at taking stock of, and to assess, quantitative and qualitative compliance by Public Authorities of the mandated suo motu disclosures under Section 4 of the RTI Act; identifying the areas for improvement in information disclosure by Public Authorities and to suggest measures for improving the content and quality of the disclosures as well as to identify the areas requiring special focus or impetus in terms of disclosures.

Deputationist has no right to remain on deputation: HC

furnished to the General Administration Department of the Government of Jammu and Kashmir with the request that the said surplus staff be adjusted/ deployed in other Government Departments so that the expenditure on account of monthly establishment/ salary cost may be reduced.

The Government, in the General Administration Department, as stated, took up the matter with the Industries & Commerce Department and, after obtaining the requisite 'No Objection' from them, deployed the aforesaid surplus staff in various Government Departments.

It is pleaded that the petitioner-employees are discharging their duties in the said Government Departments to the best satisfaction of their superior officers. However, in terms of the Government Order No. 255-

JK(GAD) of 2021 dated 22nd of March, 2021, they stand repatriated to their parent Organization to which they are aggrieved of.

Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey said there is no merit in the instant petition and dismissed the same accordingly by recording that the application of the provisions of Article 52 of the Jammu and Kashmir Civil Service Regulations, 1956, itself, which, in no uncertain terms, emphasize that the reversion of a 'deputationist' can be at any stage, either by the lending or the borrowing Department.

"That a 'deputationist' has no vested right to remain on the cadre of the Department where deputed. There, thus, is nothing wrong in repatriation of the Petitioners on the cadre posts of their parent Department which they were holding in substantive position", Justice Magrey concluded.

Admn Secys, other officers defy Govt order on Move offices

Jammu to redress the grievances of masses of the two regions but the same practice has not been enforced on ground adding to the woes of common masses of Jammu.

The Administrative Secretaries, as per order, were asked to monitor functioning of their offices both in Jammu and Srinagar as well, sources said.

They said the presence of Administrative Secretaries in Jammu region will ensure the direct access of people to the concerned authorities at the helm of affairs besides improving the work culture in Jammu Secretariat which at present seems lacking on various fronts due to continuous presence of Administrative Secretaries at Srinagar.

Sources said the issue has also generated a lot of resentment among general masses of Jammu region who feel totally cheated.

"Our files concerning various works are pending in Civil Secretariat, Jammu and we have approached many times to the concerned offices in Jammu but every time we were told that concerned Administrative Secretary is in Srinagar and the file has to be seen by him", said Anil Kumar a socio political activist from Dalsara area of Jammu.

He said people were told that Administrative Secretaries will function 15 days of a month at Jammu Secretariat and for rest 15 days at summer Secretariat at Srinagar but this order has remained confined to files only. This way people of this region feel cheated as neither they are able to visit Summer Secretariat, Srinagar in view of COVID nor the officers attend the Secretariat offices in Jammu to clear files and look into the grievances of the people of this region, he added.

Train services restored between Jammu-Delhi

JAMMU, Aug 25: The train service between Katra Mata Vaishnodevi- Jammu and Delhi was restored today after the farmers lifted dharna from the track in Jalandhar and Phagwara last evening.

Station Superintendent, Jammu, Rajeev Sabharwal said that operation of trains including both passenger and goods from Jammu, Udhampur and Katra was restored today after the higher authorities in the Northern Railways gave green

signal last night. The train services remained suspended for five days due to protest of farmers on the rail track in Punjab.

He said after the clearance of the track by the joint teams late last evening, the trains were allowed to move from both sides. Amritsar-Ludhiana-Delhi route has also been made operational. He said except Dhuranto and Uter Sampark Kranti, all the trains operated from J&K today. The rush of passengers has already been cleared by operating a few trains through diverted routes, he added.
