

'Don't send package employees to Valley under prevailing conditions'

JAMMU, Oct 21: A meeting was held at Muthi today where perturbed by the recent killing of civilians in the Valley, Parents of Kashmiri Pandits working under PM Package for Relief and Rehabilitation have demanded that the Central Government should chalk out ways to ensure that every employee of the community should be in safe hands, they should not be sent back to Kashmir under these prevailing conditions where there is continuous threat to their lives.

Parents have quoted these incidents as "failure" of security agencies. Parents of the employees have strongly condemned the recent killings of package employees and other target based attacked and further they have urged and appealed Government of India, UT Government and local administration not to pressurize their kids to resume the services under such pathetic conditions as in 1989-90.

"These conditions turned out a nightmare to all of us when we had to flee from Kashmir to save our lives, the situation are somewhere same and our kids should not be used as scapegoats", they added.

As per the statement by one of the parents "Politicians only use for propaganda purposes, and nothing else.. A community must stand united; for 31 years we have been unable to do that..

The Muslims that were killed in Kashmir were also our people, the other dimension has to be shown," he said, adding that the biggest danger is the incidents leading to communal violence.

The most disturbing part about the school attack was not the audacity with which killers entered the busy premises in broad daylight. What shocked people the most was that two non-Muslim teachers including the female Principal, Supinder Kour, were selectively targeted after their religious identity. The bullets were not poured into Kashmir's eternally lacerated body, but into its soul.

Target killings have been a favourite operational strategy of the terrorist groups in Kashmir to achieve short-term tactical goals. It was through the target killings in the 1990s that the insurgency mounted a powerful offensive against the social, political and intellectual assets of Kashmir.

Snatcher arrested within 24 hrs

JAMMU, Oct 21: Bus Stand Police arrested a snatcher within 24 hours and recovered snatched cash from his possession.

As per police sources, a complaint was lodged by a man identified as Bashir Ahmed Bhat, son of late Abdul Sattar Bhat of Brah, District Anantnag with Police Station Bus Stand stating that when he was taking his grandson to Chandigarh for treatment, Umar Ahmed Hajam, son of Nissar Ahmed Hajam of Jalsa Maholla, District Baramulla, at present Bagh-e-Bahu, Last Morh District Jammu along with another unknown person cut his pocket and snatched Rs 43,000 which he had kept for the treatment of his grandchild.

Acting over the complaint, a

case FIR Number 68/2021 under Section 382 IPC was registered at Police Station Bus Stand and investigation started.

During the course of investigation, a team from Police Station Bus Stand led by SHO Inspector Deepankar Singh under the supervision of SDPO City Sharad Kalu and SP City Mohita Sharma acted swiftly and arrested the accused Umar Ahmed Hajam. Police also recovered Rs 38,000 from his possession. Hunt is also launched to nab the associates of this arrested accused.

It is pertinent to mention here that a case FIR Number 16/2021 under Section 8/21/22 NDPS Act stands registered against Umar Ahmed Hajam at Police Station Bagh-e-Bahu and was recently bailed out.

Five arrested with Rs 39,800 stake money

Cop injured after hit by Tata Mobile during checking

The injured SPO was shifted to Government Medical College and Hospital (GMCH) Jammu from where he was later discharged after first aid.

A case FIR Number 340/2021 under relevant Sections including 307 IPC has been registered at Police Station Satwari and hunt has been launched to nab the accused driver.

Absconder arrested after 19 yrs

Need of popular Govt being felt desperately in J&K: PC

SRINAGAR, Oct 21: Peoples Conference, senior vice president Abdul Gani Vakil today expressed dismay over the situation prevailing in Jammu and Kashmir, urging the Government of India to initiate confidence-building measures to end the widening wedge between the people and the Government.

Vakil in a statement issued here has said that it is a worrisome trend being witnessed at present that the administration has turned inaccessible to the people in its entirety leaving masses across the state of Jammu and Kashmir in distress at large. He said that the bureaucratic setup has become unaccountable in an outright manner, giving a deaf ear to people's miseries and hardships they face in getting even their basic needs fulfilled.

He added that never was the need being felt for the peoples' government so desperately as is being felt today in Jammu and Kashmir and that if the Government of

India intends to strengthen the institution of democracy in the state, it must end the 'Babu Raj' prevailing here and allow the popular government to function without delay.

Vakil further highlighted that in order to regain people's trust and win back their hearts, the Central Government must restore statehood for Jammu and Kashmir and release political prisoners, regularise casual workers so that same could pre-empt the larger democratic process to flourish in an otherwise crisis ridden place.

The PC vice president further termed the mass arrests, seizure of bikes, randomization of security measures that are doing no good on the ground and are rather contributing to a large extent in alienating people. Vakil has suggested that the knee-jerk reaction to the present situation will yield no positive results and that the government must revisit its approach vis-à-vis the security scenario of Jammu and Kashmir.

- If you notice that your fake account has been created, you can immediately inform social media service provider so that the account can be blocked.
- Use passphrase instead of passwords, change password regularly.
- Include capital/small letter/No's in the beginning and in the end/special character etc. to build a 'strong password'.
- If your social media account is hacked/compromised, send an alert e-mail or message to all your contacts. Immediately ask your social media service provider to temporarily block your account. Try to retrieve your password and change your password immediately.
- If someone is bullying you or cyber-stalking or posting in appropriate inform Police/Parents
- Always remember to sign off from your account after using it.
- You must change the privacy setting of your social media account.
- If you find that your bank account or card details are compromised /stolen by someone or lost, call the bank immediately and block your card/ account immediately.
- Make a habit to review the monthly statements of your bank account and credit cards.
- Always check the website URL starts with HTTPS.
- Always make a habit to type bank website yourself when trying to login to your bank account.
- Update PIN of your Debit/ Credit cards.
- Ensure two factor authentications for login.

DONT'S

- Don't accept friend request from unknown people on social media platforms.
- Don't share your personal information. Try to restrict access of your profile to your friends only.
- Never install unwanted software and App, online gaming etc. from unknown sources.
- Never share mean comments or hurtful messages or embarrassing pictures /videos online.
- Never turn your webcam on while your chat partner does not connect to the webcam.
- Don't meet a person whom you met online only.
- Never share your credit/debit card details with anyone when you are playing online games.
- Never install pirated software on your mobile or computer.
- Avoid making online transactions using a public Wi-Fi or a computer in software.
- Never share your password.
- Don't click yes on "remember password popup" which generally comes when you login from a new computer.
- Never share CVV, Expiry date, PIN, OTP etc.
