

Assembly polls in Punjab now on Feb 20

NEW DELHI, Jan 17:

Accepting a demand by the State Government and various political parties, the Election Commission decided on Monday to hold the single-phase assembly polls in Punjab on February 20 instead of February 14 in view of Guru Ravidas Jayanti.

Punjab Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi, BJP and its allies, the BSP and other organisations had urged the poll panel to postpone the date of voting as lakhs of followers of Guru Ravidas travel to Varanasi in Uttar Pradesh to celebrate his birth anniversary on February 16.

In a statement, the Commission said polls would now be held on February 20. It coincides with the third phase of polling in Uttar Pradesh.

The parties had said that several followers of Guru Ravidas would not be able to exercise their franchise on February 14 as they would be travelling for the festivities.

Sources in the poll panel said there have been precedents when the EC had rescheduled assembly polls and bypolls after announcing the election schedule.

In October 2013, the EC had tweaked certain dates for the assembly polls in Mizoram to be held in November 2013.

A bye-election, again in Mizoram, in April 2014 was rescheduled and the date of phase one of Uttar Pradesh assembly elections was changed in March 2012 due to similar reasons, including religious beliefs of voters and the then prevailing law and order situation.

The EC statement said that after consideration of all facts made available, it had announced the schedule for Punjab assembly polls on January 8 under which notification for the election was to be issued on January 21.

According to the earlier schedule, single-phase polls in Uttarakhand, Punjab and Goa were to be held together on February 14.

It noted that the Commission has received several representations from the state government, political parties and other organisations drawing attention towards the movement of a large number of devotees from Punjab to Varanasi for Guru Ravidas Jayanti celebrations on February 16.

"They have also brought to the notice that a large number of devotees start moving for Varanasi around a week before the day of celebration and keeping the poll day on February 14 will

deprive a large number of electors of voting. In view of this, they have requested to shift the poll date a few days after February 16," the poll watchdog said. The Commission said it has also taken inputs from the state government and chief electoral officer of Punjab in this regard and its decision is based on new facts emerging out of the representations, matter.(PTI)

Priority-I: Children whose both parents have been killed by terrorists.

Priority-III: Wards of victims with permanent disability and serious injury caused by terrorist operations.
Note : 1. The candidates who have already applied under any of the above priorities shall not apply again.
2. No application shall be entertained after cut-off date (21.01.2022), under any circumstances.
3. The candidates shall have to submit an undertaking on judicial paper to the effect that none of his family member has availed any benefit under Priority I, II & III in which he/she is eligible under Central Pool of Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India.

HOME ISOLATION GUIDELINES FOR COVID-19

- Stay in a well-ventilated single-room, with an attached/separate toilet.
- Don't move out of the room and stay away from elderly people, pregnant women, children and persons with sickness within the house.
- Strictly, no visitors allowed during home isolation.
- Don't share household items e.g. dishes, drinking glasses, cups, eating utensils, towels, bedding, or other items with other people at home.
- Wear a surgical mask all the time. The mask should be changed every 6-8 hours and disposed off by first disinfecting with ordinary bleach solution (5%) or sodium hypochlorite solution (1%) and then disposed off by deep burial.
- Disposable masks are never to be reused, used mask should be considered as potentially infected.
- Wash hands frequently with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use alcohol-based hand sanitizer (70%).
- Follow cough etiquettes. Cover mouth and nose with a tissue/ handkerchief when coughing or sneezing. In case tissue/handkerchief is not available, cough/ sneeze onto your upper arm or elbow. Coughing/ sneezing directly onto hands should not be done.
- Do not spit/blow nose here and there, use a water filled receptacle for collecting sputum, thereby minimizing aerosol generation.
- Disinfect frequently touched surfaces in the isolated person's room (e.g. table tops, door knobs, handles, and toilet surfaces) daily with 1% Sodium Hypochlorite Solution.
- Clean clothes and other linen used by the person separately using common household detergent and dry in the sun.
- Drink plenty of fluids and eat healthy, nutritious, balanced diet, have timely regular meals with plenty of fresh, seasonal fruits and salads.
- Monitor oxygen saturation regularly with Pulse Oximeter. If you do not have Pulse Oximeter at your home, you may demand the same from District Control Rooms. If at any time symptoms like difficulty in breathing, Persistent pain/ pressure in the chest, Mental Confusion, Severe fatigue & myalgia, Unresolved high grade fever (more than 100°F for over 3 days) or Oxygen saturation dips below 92%, Call on below given Districts Control Room Nos.:

This advertisement is to invite applications for the recruitment of Trainee Scientific Officers (TSOs) for the 2022-23 academic session of the BARC Training Schools. After successful completion of the Training Program, the TSOs will be absorbed as Scientific Officers in a Group-A Post of the Government of India.

WHY SHOULD I JOIN THE DEPARTMENT OF ATOMIC ENERGY?

Scope of DAE Activities: DAE offers opportunities for a career in Research in frontier areas of Engineering and Science, Design and Development of Next Generation Reactors and associated Advanced Technologies and State of the Art Manufacturing Facilities. It has expertise and comprehensive capability in all aspects of the Nuclear Fuel Cycle Technologies supported by an excellent infrastructure and unique facilities like the Research Reactors, Charged Particle and Ion Beam Accelerators, ultrashort high power Lasers etc., many of which are made available by DAE to the larger Indian scientific community through various national facilities operated by DAE at different locations across the country.

Benefits on Absorption: After successful completion of the Training Program, the selected candidates will be absorbed as Scientific Officers in a Group-A Post of the Government of India in the Level 10- ₹ 56,100 of 7th CPC Pay Matrix. Total Emoluments, with three increments at the time of joining, will be approximately ₹ 1,05,000/- p.m. at the present Mumbai rate. In addition, the officer would also be availing other benefits such as L.T.C., medical facilities for the Officer and his / her dependent family members, Children's Education Allowance and Professional Update Allowance. Scientific Officers in all units of DAE have ample opportunities for professional development and attractive career progression up to the highest echelons.

Educational Opportunities: Trainee Scientific Officers in Engineering disciplines who successfully complete the Training Program and whose performance meets a minimum eligibility criterion are allowed to enroll for M.Tech. in Homi Bhabha National Institute (HBNI), a Deemed to be University. Those not desirous of pursuing M.Tech. and those belonging to Science disciplines are entitled to a Post-Graduate Diploma of HBNI provided their performance in the Training Programme meets a minimum eligibility criterion. WHAT ARE THE RECRUITMENT SCHEMES AND THE SELECTION PROCESS?

OCES-2022 (Scheme-I): This is a one-year Training Program for Engineering Graduates or Science Postgraduates. The Training Program is conducted in the BARC Training Schools located at BARC, Mumbai / Indira Gandhi Centre for Atomic Research, Kalpakkam / Raja Ramanna Centre for Advanced Technology, Indore / Nuclear Fuel Complex, Hyderabad / Atomic Minerals Directorate for Exploration and Research, Hyderabad. Trainee Scientific Officers (TSOs) will be paid a stipend of ₹55,000 p.m and a one-time Book Allowance of ₹18,000 during the Training period.

DGFS-2022 (Scheme-II): Under this scheme, Engineering Graduates or Physics Postgraduates who have secured M.Tech. / M.Chem.Engg. admission in 2022 in one of the Institutes listed below, in specified disciplines, will be offered a two-year DAE Graduate Fellowship. DGFS Fellows will be reimbursed their tuition fee during M.Tech. / M.Chem.Engg. and additionally be paid a stipend of ₹55,000 p.m., a one-time Book Allowance of ₹18,000 and a Contingency grant of ₹ 25,000 towards M.Tech. project related expenses. DGFS Institutes: IIT - Bombay, Delhi, Guwahati, Kanpur, Kharagpur, Madras, Roorkee and BHU - Varanasi, NIT-Rourkela and Institute of Chemical Technology (ICT) - Mumbai. On successful completion of M.Tech. / M.Chem.Engg., the DGFS Fellow would join DAE as a Scientific Officer, with additional increments (subject to conditions).

The selection procedure, which is common for both schemes, has two stages. An initial screening will be done either by a valid GATE-2021 / GATE-2022 Score in the applicable GATE discipline or by performance in an Online Test to be conducted in April, 2022. As cut-off GATE scores for screening into Selection Interviews will be decided only after the Online Test has concluded, candidates are advised to maximize their chances of being screened into the Selection Interview stage by *availing both the screening avenues detailed above*. In the second stage, the screened in candidates will be called for Selection Interviews to be held in Mumbai and Hyderabad# during June-July, 2022. Final Selection is solely on the basis of performance in Selection Interview, subject to medical fitness. #Only for Geology.

WHAT ARE THE QUALIFYING DEGREES? HOW DO I APPLY?

A minimum of 60% aggregate, as per the ordinances of the respective university, in the qualifying degree is an essential eligibility requirement. Science postgraduates are further required to have secured a minimum of 60% aggregate in B.Sc., to make them eligible. The eligible disciplines and degrees are as follows:
