He demanded that daily wagers, home guards and SPOs should be regularized immediately as they are facing the apathy of Government since years.

"BJP had promised to fulfill their aspirations but even after the lapse of three years nothing could be achieved," Singh maintained adding: "On the name of employment and development BJP has only given soaring prices of essential goods and poverty." He appealed all the sections of society to strengthen NAUP which will become voice of common man. Anil Dev Singh, Bupinder Sharma, Uttam Chand, Nater Pal, Parveen Kumar and Mohit Dalhotra were also present on the occasion.



COVID cases dip to 2503

infections were recorded, the lowest in 680 days, while the active cases dipped to 36,168, according to the Union Health Ministry data updated today.

With the fresh cases, the total tally of COVID-19 cases rose to 4,29,93,494. On May 3, 2020, 2,487 cases were recorded. The death toll climbed to 5,15,877 with 27 fresh fatalities, the data updated at 8 am stated. India's current active caseload (36,168) is lowest in 675 days, Ministry said.

The active cases comprise 0.08 per cent of the total infections, while the national COVID-19 recovery rate further improved to 98.72 per cent, the ministry said. A reduction of 1,901 cases has been recorded in the active COVID-19 caseload in a span of 24 hours. The number of people who have recuperated from the disease surged to 4,24,41,449 and the case fatality rate was recorded as 1.20 per cent.(PTI)
