**Massive protests in Leh, Kargil for 4 key demands**

 JAMMU, Nov 2: On the day the Leh Apex Body (LAB) and Kargil Democratic Alliance (KDA) launched agitation in support of their four major demands in the Union Territory of Ladakh and announced that they will shortly release year-long agitational programme, the Union Ministry of Home Affairs issued a notification extending

## FFRC bars private schools from collecting annual fee

SRINAGAR, Nov 2: The Committee for Fixation and Regulation of Fee of Private Schools J&K (FFRC) today directed all the private schools across Jammu and Kashmir not to collect the annual fee for the period from November 2022 to March 2023.

The orders have been issued after it received a complaint against the Tyndale Biscoe and Mallinson School Sheikhbagh, Srinagar and after having interaction with the School Management Authorities it was made clear to them that the academic session of the educational institutions comprises 12 months.

"It was also made clear to them that in view of the Government order No 2074-JK (Edu of 2022) dated 31 August 2022, read with Govt order No 2085-JK9Edu of 2022, dated 07-10-2022, the Government has made it clear that new admissions will commence from March of the calendar year and

Annual Examinations shall be conducted in March-April session in all the Government and Government Recognised Private schools," the FFRC said. It said that it was thus impressed upon these authorities that the School Managements notice to the students to pay the Annual Fee for November 2022 to March 2023 is legally not sustainable and the authorities in these circumstances should withdraw the notice.

"The authorities assured that they would put on hold the notice which asks students to pay Annual Fee for the period November 2022 to March 2023."

The FFRC said that it was made clear to the authorities of this school management that academic session cannot be stretched beyond the 12 months period, which now starts on 1st April and ends on 31 March of the calendar year.

## 'Transparent system boosting economy' Border villages strategic asset, equal development our priority: LG

JAMMU, Nov 2: Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha attended the Back to Village programme today at Garkhal border village in Akhnoor.

Addressing the gathering on the occasion, he observed that this participative Jan-Abhiyan promotes people-centric development for social transformation and focuses on improving the productivity of the rural J&K through increased ease of living. Sinha said that people's participation in development of border villages is significant for social advancement and unleashing the spirit of self-reliance.

"Back to Village provides an opportunity for effective planning, roadmap for execution with PRIs to fulfil the dream of Gram Swaraj", he added.

Termining border villages as a strategic asset, the LT Governor said the development of border villages is an

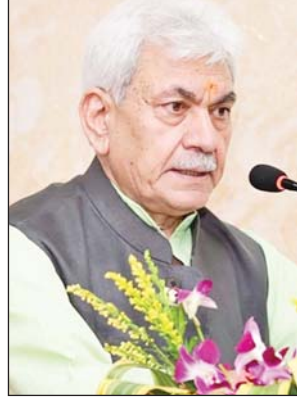
essential precondition to build an inclusive society where there would be no discrimination and everyone enjoys equal share of opportunity.

Emphasising that one-size-fits-all approach will not be feasible for transforming rural areas because each village has its unique identity and requirements, he stressed that both administration and people must discuss and deliberate upon the

aspirations of people and work on the projects that are viable and sustainable. Saying that solutions to the crucial issues will come from the people, the Lt Governor directed the officers to interact with Gram Panchayat on first Monday of every month to understand the people's problems, realize their strength and bridge the chasm between policy and implementation for transformation of rural landscape.

Noting that the days of indiscretion and arbitrariness are over, he said, "we have established fairness and transparency in the system to remove the development imbalances and to weed out nepotism and corruption. Today, a transparent system is giving boost to J&K's economy and making its growth sustainable".

## Party nominates probable candidates Jabbar, Akhnoor left out; NC may not go for alliance

SRINAGAR, Nov 2: National Conference (NC) today nominated the constituency in-charges for 47 Assembly segments across Kashmir in a step towards the preparations for the upcoming elections in Jammu and Kashmir.

The constituency in-charges appear to be the party candidates for the next Assembly elections whenever they are announced by the Election Commission of India.

However, Abdullahs are

missing from the list but they can't be constituency in-charges but can make entry in the list of candidates once the elections are announced. The constituencies can be Lal Chowk, Ganderbal or Hazratbal. Although Omar has been making assertions that he will not contest assembly polls after he was released from Hari Niwas guest house, he will take the final decision at the appropriate time.

The list is an indication that NC may go solo in these elections and may not contest polls under the banner of the People's Alliance for Gupkar

Declaration (PAGD). It may be mentioned here that in August 2022 NC passed a resolution in the presence of its vice president Omar Abdullah, that NC will contest all 90 Assembly on its own but senior Abdullah later said that a decision on polls will be taken only when they are announced. Ishfaq Jabbar, former MLA from Ganderbal has not found a place in the list as he has been critical of the NC recently and is close to the present establishment headed by Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha who (Contd on page 4 Col 5)

## Will hold follow up of all demands, promises Visiting officers during B2V4 to be Panchayat Prabharis, Mentors

JAMMU, Nov 2: The Government today announced that all visiting officers to the villages during Back to Village IV (B2V4) programme from October 27-November 3, will be Panchayat Prabharis and act as Mentors of the Panchayat to ensure that demands and promises are followed up and converted into a reality.

B2V4 Committee Chairman and Principal Secretary Higher Education and Information Rohit Kansal told the Excelsior that this is for the first time that B2V has given 21 clear and quantified deliverables to the visiting officers.

## Lone elected PC president HC seeks report on condition of jail inmates

SRINAGAR, Nov 2: As the authorities today informed that the Jail Manual and Training Manual have been notified, the High Court today sought updated status of the directions passed by the Supreme Court with regard to condition of jail inmates and the facilities provided to them in jails.

The Division Bench of Chief Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey and Justice V C Koul directed the Home Department and the Director General Prisons J&K to file the updated status report on next date of hearing mentioning therein the updation of required facilities for the inmates and under trials.

Meantime, the Additional Secretary Home appraised the court that the department has already notified the Jail Manual and Training Manual and the DG Prisons has indicated in his affidavit the details of capacity of each jail in UT and number of prisoners and under trials lodged therein with the existing condition.
