## As Ladakhis hit streets, MHA extends powers to LG for GOs' recruitment

for appointment to such services and posts and the condition of service of persons appointed to such services and posts for the purposes of probation, confirmation, seniority and promotion will also be decided by the LG of Ladakh by framing rules," the MHA order read.

However, it said, any rule made under this direction shall be subject to previous consultations with the Union Public Services Commission.

In the case of services and posts, appointment to which requires prior approval of the Central Government, the prior approval of that Government shall also be obtained in respect of the rules, as to be made under this direction, for such services and posts.

"Nothing contained under this direction shall apply to any public services and posts borne on a cadre common to two or more Union Territories," the Home Ministry order said.

Meanwhile, massive processions were taken out by the LAB in Leh and KDA in Kargil today.

Large numbers of people participated in the processions at both the places which passed off peacefully with no untoward incident reported from any part of the two towns. Authorities had, however, made tight security arrangements all along the routes of the processions in Leh and Kargil.

Senior LAB leader and former MP Thupstan Chhewang, who led the procession from NDS Sports complex to historical Polo Ground in Leh, told the Excelsior that coordination committee of LAB and KDA will chalk out year-long agitation schedule in support of their demands which include Statehood for Ladakh,

Prominent among those who addressed the rally at Polo Ground Leh include Thupstan Chhewang, Ashraf Ali Bharcha, president Anjuman Imamiya, Dr Abdul Qayum, president Anjuman Moin-UI, Tundup Thinless, president All Ladakh Unemployed Youth Association, Padma Stanzin, president LEAF, Tsewang Norbu, Chairman, Panchayat Coordination Committee and Stanzin Chospel, Apex Body Youth Coordinator, among others.

In Kargil, the protest started from Hussaini Park and marched towards Isna Asharia Chowk and culminated at Lal Chowk Kargil. During protest, the speakers urged the Government of India to stop delaying tactics and listen to grievances of the people of Ladakh.

The LAB and KDA leaders said today's protests are beginning of the agitation. They vowed to continue the agitation till their demands are accepted.

achieved in the last three years with speedy implementation of the projects, and we continue to invest in schemes to make rural J&K self-reliant and to increase incomes by creating more self-employment opportunities at the local level," Sinha said.

He further said that it is our endeavour to realise the vision of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to encourage the participation of all citizens to be part of the decision-making in order to steer the engine of development and change the socio-economic landscape of rural Jammu Kashmir.

"We have prioritised the development of rural & border areas. This year, 10 PRI, 5 MGNREGA, one BDC, one Samridh Seema Yojana & 23 projects under 14FC are in progress in Garkhal to improve the lives of people, fulfil their basic needs and to accelerate overall development," he added.

Highlighting that employment, health, education and improving the productivity of the people are among the focus areas of the government during Back to Village, the Lt Governor said a target has also been set to identify 15 young boys and girls from every Panchayat for Self-employment assistance and 20 youths for skill development.

Assuring all necessary support from the administration for comprehensive and holistic development of panchayats, he asked the public representatives and rural population for making their village drug-free, litigation free and ensuring every woman is associated with self-help group, and youth are aware of their real potential.

The Lt Governor said, it is the responsibility of PRI members to ensure saturation of various schemes and initiatives like Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, KCC, PM Kisan Samman Nidhi, Soil Health Card, agriculture-related schemes, Ayushman Sehat Golden Card etc.

It must be ensured that every child is immunized; every citizen has a bank account; every child, every girl goes to school; every land owner has a land passbook; everyone should have a ration card with Aadhar seeding; Panchayat Ghar should function smoothly and youth are engaged in sports & other constructive activities, he further added.

In the last two years, through continuous mass campaigns, Block

Diwas, Gram Panchayats, other outreach campaigns and result-oriented policies, inclusive development of Panchayats has been ensured. Efforts have been made to bring Government services to people's doorsteps, Sinha observed.

Development of rural and far-flung areas is being given special attention. Now the development plans are being prepared in consultation with PRIs and around 20,000 projects have been taken up for execution which were decided by the people's representatives and the people together, he added.

The Lt Governor said that budget allocation of Rs 1000 crore to Panchayats, Rs 200 crore to DDCs, Rs 71.25 crore to BDCs, and Rs 600 crore for Samridh Seema Yojana, this year, is a reflection of the administration's commitment to empower and strengthen Panchayati Raj Institutions, border villages and addressing challenges by harmonizing policies and programmes, ensuring that the benefits of development reach all sections, granting every citizen their due rights and entitlements.

Fear-free corruption-free system has been established through paperless, faceless administrative mechanism. The capex budget of Jammu and Kashmir has also been increased to Rs 22,126 crore this year which is four times more as compared to earlier and this increase has been given for development works in collaboration with the three levels of Panchayati Raj system, said the Lt Governor.

Not only Handwara, he also ensured victory of the party candidate Bashir Ahmad Dar from nearby Kupwara Assembly segment, registering the best-ever performance of the party in its electoral history.

Since his entry into politics, Lone has revived and strengthened PC across Kashmir.

An Economics Graduate from Cardiff University, Lone was selected for Chevening Fellowship but he opted out of the programme due to his engagements.

## HC seeks report on condition of jail inmates

the directions passed by the Apex Court," the DB directed.

The Apex Court directed for overcoming of overcrowding, delay in trial, torture and ill-treatment, neglect of health and hygiene, insubstantial food and inadequate communication, prison vices, deficiency in communication, streamlining of jail visits, management of open air prisons in jails.

The apex court for resolving these issues and directed that the Under Trial Review Committee in every district should meet every quarter and the first such meeting should take place and the Member Secretary of the State Legal Services Authority of every State will ensure, in coordination with the Secretary of the District Legal Services Committee in every district, that an adequate number of competent lawyers are empanelled to assist under trial prisoners and convicts, particularly the poor and indigent, and that legal aid for the poor does not become poor legal aid.

"The Director General of Police/Inspector General of Police in charge of prisons should ensure that there is proper and effective utilization of available funds so that the living condition of the prisoners is commensurate with human dignity", the SC further directed.

It was also added that the issue of health, hygiene, food, clothing and rehabilitation of prisoners be prioritized and the Ministry of Home Affairs will ensure that the Management Information System is in place at the earliest in all the Central and District Jails as well as jails for women so that there is better and effective management of the prison and prisoners.

The Ministry of Home Affairs was also directed to conduct an annual review of the implementation of the Model Prison Manual for which considerable efforts have been made not only by senior officers of the Ministry of Home Affairs but also persons from civil society.

In context with the condition of under prisoners and under trials lodged in various jails of the Union Territory, the DB had direct the Director General of Prisons to sub-

mit a complete report with full details of the capacity of each jail in the Union Territory, the number of prisoners and under trials lodged therein and about the existing conditions as also the proposal with regard to the construction of any new jail within the Union Territory.

In this regard, the DGP reported that presently 5048 jail inmates are lodged in 14 jails in J&K against the sanctioned capacity of 3578. In Central Jail Kot Balwal sanctioned capacity is 902 and lodgements are 1016, in Central Jail Srinagar capacity is 509 and lodgements are 722, in District Jail Jammu capacity is 426 and lodgements are 688, in District Jail Kathua capacity is 275 and lodgements are 358, in District Jail Udhampur capacity is 292 and lodgements are 515, in District Jail Badherwah capacity is 155 and lodgements are 184, in District Jail Rajouri capacity is 152 and lodgements are 187, in District Jail Poonch capacity is 152 and lodgements are 192, in District Jail Baramulla capacity is 213 and lodgements are 326, in District Jail Kupwara capacity is 164 and lodgements are 320, in District Jail Anantnag capacity is 148 and lodgements are 199, in District Jail Kishtwar capacity is 68 and lodgements are 86 and in Sub Jail Reasi capacity is 26 while as lodgements are 67.

The DGP further added that to reduce the overcrowding in jails is under active consideration of the department and the department has submitted a proposal to Home Department for construction of 2 new jails in Reasi and Bandipora with the intake capacity of lodgement of 350 and 232 respectively.

DGP further informed the court that the Government has also transferred 148 kanals of Shamlati Deh land in Dambra, Tehsil Mahanpur of District Kathua in favour of Prisons Department for construction of High Security Jail.

"The health care facility to ailing jail inmates is top of the agenda of the department and is being provided on priority basis as also there are some hospital in some jails. All the prescribed medicines and suitable diet and all facilities as admissible under rules is being provided to jail inmates without delay", read the report.

The Jal Shakti Department organized 4290 Pani Samitis meetings (one per Panchayat) and provided an equal number of field testing kits to all Panchayats and gave training to them. It also arranged

certification of water sufficiency and quality of Panchayats. The Rural Development Department implemented Swachh Gram Plans by door to door collection and disposal and management of grey water, black water and solid waste. The Social Welfare Department converted 2.5 lakh UDID cards to digital format while the Labour Department distributed 2.5 lakh e-Stram cards. The Youth Services and Sports Department inspected playgrounds and ensured that at least one sports event is held in every Panchayat while Revenue and Rural Development departments inspected offices of Patwaris, Village Level Workers and ensured that name and phone number of the Patwari/VLW is painted on wall of the office. The RDD also inspected 1500 Amrit Sarovars to check their quality while the Youth Mission interacted with Youth Clubs.

The Culture Department and Deputy Commissioners uploaded high quality videos under Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav numbering 15,000 (at least three per Panchayats).

## Oil cos losing money on diesel

NEW DELHI, Nov 2:

PSU oil companies are losing a net Rs 4 per litre on diesel while their margins have turned positive on petrol, Oil Minister Hardeep Singh Puri said today on talks of a price reduction in the offering as international rates have softened.

Puri said his Ministry will seek assistance for the three fuel retailers - Indian Oil Corporation (IOC), Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL) and Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd (HPCL) for the losses they incurred on holding petrol and diesel prices since the Ukraine war to help the Government fight inflation.

"OMCs (oil marketing companies) still have under-recoveries on diesel," he told reporters when asked if there is a price reduction in the offering.

The three firms held prices despite international oil prices shooting up to more than a decade high.

The under-recovery - difference between the retail selling price and the international rate - currently is about Rs 27 per litre on diesel but the actual cash loss (the loss based on the actual cost of procurement of crude oil and turning it into fuel) is about Rs 3-4 per litre.

Puri said oil companies moderated prices during extreme volatility to help consumers.

ferred a net loss of over Rs 19,000 crore in the April-June quarter and are expected to report losses for the following quarter as well.

Asked if his Ministry will seek financial assistance to make up for the losses, Puri said, "emphatic yes."

"The question is will you try for it and my answer is yes," he said, refusing to discuss what relief will be sought. "The Government is ceased of the issue."

The Government last month doled out Rs 22,000 crore to the three firms as a one-time grant to make up for the losses they incurred on selling domestic cooking gas (LPG) in two years starting June 2020.

Puri's Ministry had sought Rs 28,000 crore for the LPG losses but got Rs 22,000 crore.

The softening of international oil prices had raised the expectation of a cut in petrol and diesel prices.

The basket of crude oil that India imports had shot up to USD 116 per barrel in June but has moderated to USD 92.25 this month.

If the price reduction happens, this will be the first cut since May 22 when the Government cut excise duty on the two fuels to shield customers from high global prices and rein in inflation.

Petrol and diesel prices are supposed to be revised daily but State-owned fuel retailers have not exercised their rights since April 6. Rates have been on freeze since then except on May 22 when prices were reduced following a cut in excise duty.

Prior to the April freeze, petrol and diesel prices had gone up by Rs 10 per litre each.

Petrol currently costs Rs 96.72 a litre in the national capital and diesel is priced at Rs 89.62 (PTT)

## Bovines smuggling bid foiled

JAMMU, Nov 2: Gharota Police today foiled bovines smuggling bid.

As per official sources, a team from Police Station Gharota led by SHO Inspector Joginder Singh Chib under the supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Mohan Lal laid a naka at new bridge Thathi and intercepted a vehicle bearing registration number HP11-4861.

During checking, police team rescued 13 bovine animals from the vehicle and arrested one person, who was identified as Bilal Ahmad, a resident of district Kulgam.

A case FIR Number 115/2022 under Sections 188 IPC and 11 PCA Act has been registered at Police Station Gharota and investigation started.
