The State health agency that is implementing ABPMJAY SEHAT has achieved many milestones since the launch of initiative and more than 77 lakh people have been provided with Ayushman cards and so far 6 lakh beneficiaries have been provided free and cashless treatments under the scheme, the Lt Governor said lauding the agency's resolve. Around 1000 people are using the health golden card per day and getting treatment worth Rs 2.5 crore daily, he added. The Lt Governor further observed that approximately 92% of families in the J&K UT have at least one Ayushman Card. Four districts- Ganderbal, Shopian, Kulgam and Samba have been 100% saturated as per the NFSA database and while four others, Poonch, Anantnag, Pulwama and Ramban are nearing 98% saturation. Leave no one behind is not just a mantra for me but it is also my commitment to the people. Public well-being is always at the center of our policies and our spending on health programs has risen as compared to many developed and bigger states, he said. Sinha highlighted the achievements of J&K while further adding that the UT is emerging as a shining example across the country with world class health infrastructure. Besides, work on 7 new Medical Colleges is underway besides 2 AIIMS, 2 State Cancer Institute's, 2 Bone & Joint hospitals and more than 300 health infrastructure projects, he added. In last three years, 2742 health and wellness centers have been established; 207 Advanced Life Support Ambulances and 286 Basic Life Support Ambulances have been dedicated for the health care of the general public, he further added. In order to shift towards automated service delivery, we have launched 'e-SAHAJ' project which entails online appointment from doctors, and digitization of patient's medical records etc. In the first phase of e-SAHAJ, 575 health facilities have been covered and it is integrated with Rapid Assessment System, which will also provide real time feedback from common citizens, he said.

Mother-daughter killed in landslide

boulder, triggered by landslide in wee hours, completely smashed the house. The incident took place around 4.55 am and the landslide swept away the house of Mohammad Latief (45), leading to death of his wife Naseem Akhter (40) and their daughter Rubina Kouser (12). Latief and his son Basharat, who were seriously injured in the

Later, the surviving injured were shifted to GMC Rajouri for advanced treatment and their condition was stated to be stable. Locals alleged that a private company, contractor and others working on the road project were responsible for this incident as the work was being done in violation of safety norms. They demanded registration of FIR against the contractor. Police said that a case vide FIR number 362/2022 under Sections 304A, 336, 427, 429 and 323 IPC has been registered in this connection in Police Station Surankote and investigation was taken up. Meanwhile, on the direction of DC Poonch Inderjeet Singh, SDM Surankote, Nahim U Nisa visited the spot and handed over immediate cash relief of Rs 25 thousands to the victim family. The incident, were rescued by a patrolling party of Army, which noticed the landslide and found that family members were under debris. Both the injured are undergoing treatment at hospital and their condition was stated to be out of danger. Reports said that 48-RR Unit of Army, which was on patrolling in the area, launched the rescue operation and shifted the victims to Sub District Hospital Surankote where woman and her minor daughter succumbed to their injuries.

HC's final opportunity to Govt on PSA

However, the Union counsel TM Shamsi submitted before the bench that the maintainability of the writ petition is to be first decided. The PIL is challenging the legality of the PSA and seeks its scrapping. "PSA is illegal because it contravenes the 44th (1979) amendment to the Constitution of India. The Union of India was bound to bring this amendment into force." As per the pleadings, it is said that Section 8 of the PSA should be declared illegal because the Government has to approve the detention but it cannot approve without hearing the detainee. It is submitted that the 'power' to detain is power of the State and Divisional Commissioner or District Magistrate cannot detain a person. Moreover, the petitioner has added that the detainee cannot be moved from one place of detention without show cause. Advocate General of J&K DC Raina had previously raised a preliminary objection on the maintainability of the petition. He argued that the PSA was in consonance with the Constitution as the amendment to Article 22 of the Constitution would be automatically extended to J&K after the Abrogation of Article 370 and insofar as Sections 8 and 16 of the J&K Public Safety Act are concerned, the same are in consonance with the provisions of the Constitution of India. In the PIL, the petitioner has also raised the issue of legal aid which, he says, the State was bound to provide to a detainee booked under PSA. He adds that where the State detains a person under PSA, it has a duty under Article 22 of the Constitution read with Articles 20 and 21 to provide legal aid to the detainee.

Sinha visits Bhat's family; assures job, other help

house of Bhat at Muthi and offered his condolences to his wife Sweetie Bhat, children Shriya and Shanu and other relatives. Sinha later tweeted "Met the family members of martyr Puran Krishan Bhat Ji at their residence in Jammu and offered my condolences." He also tweeted that the administration has been directed to provide a permanent Government job to Bhat's wife and extend every possible help to the family. Bhat's brother-in-law Ashok Kumar Raina told reporters that L-G has assured them that the culprits will be brought to book. "The case is under investigation. It is at its conclusion stage," he said. Raina said that family demanded the speedy investigation in the case and punishment to the militants responsible for this heinous crime. He said the LG showed all sympathy to the family. He added that excesses have been committed against the family and it has faced a great tragedy. He assured that those responsible will not be spared and they will be brought to book", Raina said while quoting the LG. Raina said the family raised the issue of job, education for children and ex-gratia besides shifting household items from Choudhary Gund to Jammu. "The LG has assured us all support," he said adding that the demand for registration of families as migrants was raised with him and he assured us of support in the matter including hike in ex-gratia. He said LG offered his condolences and he spared some time out of his busy schedule to visit the family. He also said that family has full faith in the administration and LG as a head of UT has full information

about everything happening there. Bhat's elder brother, Ashwani Kumar Bhat who is also a Government teacher posted in Kashmir said that the family demanded his transfer to Jammu in view of prevailing situation and threat perception looming large in the Valley. He said being the elder member in the family he has now to share the responsibility and look after both the families. Bhat's wife said that she wants to hear the news that her husband's killers are dead. "This will give me justice." "We lived in utter fear for the past several months. The fear became real when militants gunned down my husband at the gate of my house in Choudhary Gund," she said. Choudhary Gund residents have submitted a memorandum to the L-G seeking the registration of 13 families as migrants in Jammu. Vir Ji Kaul said that the L-G has "assured us support in facilitating registration as migrants". Thirteen Kashmiri Pandit families, who migrated from a village in south Kashmir amid 'targeted' killings of members of their community, demanded that the administration register them as "migrants". Of the 13 families comprising 43 members, 10 had left Choudhary Gund village in Shopian district and reached Jammu on October 26. The remaining three had reached the city earlier. Meanwhile, the three Kashmiri Pandit families of adjoining Chotigam village in Apple rich Shopian district whose one member was gunned down by militants on August 16 this year while other two were injured have also demanded justice from Government. They have also demanded their registration as migrants besides grant of all facilities to them including free education to the children of Sunil Kumar Pandit who was gunned down by militants, said his sobbing wife Sunita. She said the family did not receive any help from Government except Rs one lakh as ex-gratia. Sunil has left behind his wife and four school going daughters. The family has now no source of income after losing their sole male member and bread earner. She also made an appeal to the LG seeking sympathetic in her case.

ever since I entered public life at the age of 18 and I will always hold him in the highest regard. To suggest otherwise is outrageous," said the former "Saad-i-Riyasat" of the erstwhile State of Jammu and Kashmir. Singh pointed out that he had dedicated his latest book "An Examined Life" to Nehru and in his article he made it clear that he was not dealing with the multiple allegations made against India's first Prime Minister by Rijiju. He said Rijiju's allegations were a separate matter and needed a much more detailed refutation on which "Ramesh should be working". Singh said his article in the English daily was specifically directed towards explaining the role of his father in the whole accession process. "Jairam goes on to make some unsavoury remarks regarding my father. His reading of history is evidently selective. He could go to the book by Prem Shankar Jha and other books on J&K to get a different view point," the former Union Minister and ex-Governor of J&K said. "I am one of the last living eye witnesses to the events preceding and following the signing of the Instrument of Accession which I have related in some detail in my autobiography," Singh said.

Reacting to Singh's article earlier, Ramesh had said on Twitter, "There is not a single scholarly and serious work on J&K that portrays Maharaja Hari Singh in good light." "Even this authoritative work by VP Menon doesn't make Hari Singh a wronged man. It is hence natural that his son Dr Karan Singh defends him in the HT today," Ramesh had said, sharing the screenshot of the cover of a book by Menon. "What I find surprising though is that Dr.Karan Singh has sided- stepping, Rijiju's hit job on Nehru..." the Congress general secretary in-charge communications had said. J&K's accession came into the focus as it was at the centre of the war of words between the BJP and the Congress last week. Rijiju wrote an article for a portal citing "five Nehruvian blunders", including floating the idea of a plebiscite and terming J&K's accession provisional. The Minister had said it was important to realise past mistakes to build a new future and added he has not tweaked history but stated facts to set the record straight. The Congress had demanded an apology from Rijiju over his criticism of Nehru's handling of the Kashmir issue and asked Prime Minister Narendra Modi to rein in Ministers from making "irresponsible statements".

ED attaches Shabir Shah's house for money laundering

According to ED, he has been involved in carrying out illicit activities along with his accomplice Mohammed Aslam Wani, who is an activist of Jaish-e-Mohammed. "He was using Aslam Wani as a courier for collecting 'hawala' money sent by his Pakistani-based sympathisers to deliver the same in Srinagar," the ED said. Investigation also revealed that he was in touch with Hafiz Saeed, chief of banned outfit Jamaat-ud-Dawa based in Pakistan. He had been receiving money for carrying out separatist activities in J&K and has acquired various properties through a maze of dubious transactions," the agency alleged. The attached property was shown to have been gifted to his wife and daughters by his sisters-in-law in 2005, which was purchased in their name by his father-in-law in 1999. "However, in spite of repeated opportunities given to his father-in-law and sisters-in-law, they have failed to justify the sources of fund to acquire the said property. Investigation has also revealed that Shah is the de-facto owner of the said property purchased via unexplained source of fund by his father-in-law," the ED said.

SC dismisses appeal of Judicial Officer

The petitioner, who was serving as Munisiff Pulwama in Kashmir Division, was removed from the judicial service by the Governor of the then State of Jammu and Kashmir. The order by the High Court had been passed by the Governor on the recommendations of the Full Court that the said petitioner, in view of his proven misconduct, was not worthy of retention in the judicial service. The officer had been taken to task with regards to certain documents, which he had failed to sufficiently stamp. At the outset, the counsel for petitioner submitted that the fault for the misconduct was with another official. He further stated that the enquiry which had been conducted also proved noting and that there had been a lot of uncertainty regarding the guilt of the petitioner. The allegations were that the documents were insufficiently stamped. The transactions in question had required prior permission of the administration, which were given, but since that permission was very old, the officer had to again ask for permission. As per the enquiry, the officer did not do his duty with caution and as required. Further, it stated "It seems that the delinquent officer and the Nazir hatched a conspiracies to cause monetary loss to the State exchequer to undue benefit to the party whose documents were to be registered." The complainant, as per the petitioner, was a militant who had issued him a threat because he had given an order in a case of the militant's father. The petitioner stated that he was a minority within a minority in Kashmir, as he was an Ahmadiyya and as such was being targeted by the complainant. However, the bench was not satisfied with the submissions. Justice Bela M Trivedi remarked, "He was a Judicial Officer, he should have been more careful. The entire thing has been scrutinised by the enquiry officers, by the High Court Judge. The matter has been considered by full court. There is a conscious decision taken by all the Judges. It has been considered on the judicial side as well. So what more can we do?" Accordingly, the appeal was dismissed.(Agencies)

LG Ladakh gets power under 2 more Central laws

Government" respectively under "the Minimum Wages Act, 1948" and "the Poisons Act, 1919". "In pursuance of clause (1) of article 239 of the Constitution, the President hereby directs that the Lieutenant Governor of the Union Territory of Ladakh shall, subject to the control of the President and until further orders, exercise the powers and discharge the functions of the appropriate Government under the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (11 of 1948) within the said Union Territory," read the notification. Similarly, the powers vested with the appropriate Government under another Central Law have also been delegated to LG Ladakh. "In pursuance of the powers conferred under clause (1) of Article 239 of the Constitution, the President hereby directs that the powers and functions of the State Government under the Poisons Act, 1919 (12 of 1919) shall, subject to the control of the President and until further orders, be exercised by the Lieutenant Governor of the Union Territory of Ladakh within the said Union Territory," the notification further stated.

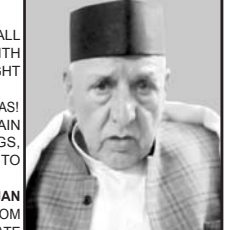

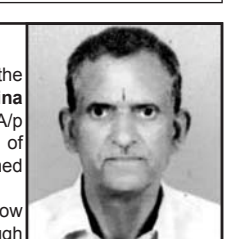
