SRINAGAR, Nov 14: The Kashmir Power Distribution Corporation Limited (KPDCL) today issued a fresh power curtailment schedule for Srinagar in winter period with effect from tomorrow.

The KPDCL in a fresh curtailment schedule stated that the metered areas will face 4 1/2 hours curtailment every day.

As per the new schedule, the metered areas will face curtailment of electricity for one and a half hours in morning, afternoon and evening each.

However, the non-metered areas will face curtailment for the period eight hours in a day. The non-metered areas in

All levels of health facilities from medical colleges to health and wellness centres organized education camps in which people were invited and provided information which can be used to prevent diabetes and also ensure early diagnosis. It was supplemented by providing free diagnostic services in which blood sugar was estimated in addition to hypertension screening.
