

6 drug peddlers arrested with heroin, poppy straw, ganja

JAMMU, Oct 2: Chowk Chabutra, Jhajar Kotli, Gandhi Nagar and Satwari Police arrested six drug peddlers along with heroin, poppy straw and ganja.

As per police sources, on specific information a team from Police Post Chowk Chabutra led by PSI Jyoti Choudhary under the supervision of SHO Pacea Danga Inspector Rakesh Sharma and SDPO City Sharad Kalu laid a naka and intercepted a person, who was moving under suspicious circumstances.

During checking, police team recovered 40 grams of heroin from the possession of the person and arrested him.

The arrested person was identified as Chetan Sharma, son of Shiv Darshan Lal of Rehari Colony District Jammu.

Meanwhile, a team from Police Station Jhajar Kotli led by SHO Inspector Samson Bhatti under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar laid a naka and intercepted a vehicle bearing registration number PB05AB-5858.

During search, police team recovered 37.430 kilograms of poppy straw from the vehicle

and arrested two persons, who were identified as Baldev Singh, son of Surjan Singh and Sukhdev Singh, son of Purnan Singh, both residents of Punjab. In another similar case, a team from Police Station Gandhi Nagar led by SHO Inspector Pankaj Sharma under the supervision of SDPO East Sachit Sharma arrested a drug peddler and recovered 8 grams heroin from his possession.

The accused was identified as Gurdit Singh alias Prince alias Pindi, son of Bhopinder Singh of Model Town Gangyal District Jammu.

In one more similar case, a team from Police Station Satwari led by SHO Inspector Sameer Jilani and assisted by PSI Saddam Hussain while on naka duty apprehended two drug peddlers along with 6 kilograms of ganja.

The arrested persons were identified as Hare Rai, son of Ram Parvesh Rai and Sanjay Rai, son of Lakhanu Rai, both residents of Nayatola Patna Bihar.

Cases under relevant sections have been registered at Police Stations Pacea Danga, Jhajar Kotli, Gandhi Nagar and Satwari and investigation started.

Drug peddler escapes from Rajbagh PS

JAMMU, Oct 2: A drug peddler who was arrested few days earlier escaped from the custody of Rajbagh Police Station this morning.

He was arrested on September 28 by a police team of PS Rajbagh during patrolling/checking duty in its jurisdictional area near Bamberwan road Rajbagh. He was identified as Murad Ali, son of Teg Ali of Jakhbar Bigwan tehsil and district Kathua.

During checking approximately 90 grams of Heroin like narcotics along with cash amount of Rs. 1,49,000/- was also recovered from his possession.

As per reports he was taken out for natural call from lockup to Police Station premises. He fled away after dodging the police team on duty. A police team put on job to arrest the absconding drug peddler. The Rajbagh Police is tightlipped over the unfortunate incident.

The locals said that the absconding drug peddler has larger complaints of supplying narcotics. He has links with Punjab drug dealers and selling the banned drugs in Kathua district.

Due to burgeoning traffic congestion on the above said road, the life

becomes totally out of gear and has come to a stand still. Undoubtedly, the Jammu city is progressing but there is no marked improvement as far as traffic scenario is concerned. The Gole Pully Talab Tillo to Bohri road always remains badly choked with vehicles for hours thereby causing extreme inconveniences to the general public, pedestrians and daily commuters. There is an urgent need to construct a flyover from Canal road to Bohri Chowk in order to streamline the burgeoning traffic over this road. However Talab Tillo Chowk, Gole Pully and Bohri Chowk have become now the accident prone areas. Construction of flyover between Canal road to Bohri Chowk will curb the traffic congestion problem on this road. Moreover, wrong priorities of traffic department and illegal occupying of roads by street vendors has also created chaotic traffic situation in our city. The Traffic Department is behaving like a revenue generating department. They have limited their work to just filing challans and collecting fines and pay little heed to improve quality of traffic services. Apart from collecting fines the Traffic Department need to concentrate on improving quality of traffic services so that common people heave a sigh of relief. Government needs to take due cognizance of the alarming traffic situation brewing up in Jammu and should formulate a genuine mechanism so that smooth flow of traffic can be maintained. Comprehensive traffic smart solutions by installing CCTV cameras at all busy routes of the city with high resolution picture can also go a long way in streamlining the traffic woes. Other steps like increasing manpower of traffic police, widening of roads and lanes, removal of encroachment and maximum flyovers have to be taken on war footing basis by the Government to save Jammu from further traffic chaos.
