**No other country practices terror like Pak: EAM**

"No other country practices terrorism in the manner in which Pakistan has done. You show me anywhere in the world what Pakistan has done for so many years against India. After the 26/11 Mumbai attack, it is important for us to be clear to ourselves that this kind of behaviour and action is unacceptable and there will be consequences," Jaishankar said during interaction with the audience at the talk.

Under the leadership of Prime Minister Modi, India successfully made other countries realise that terrorism can harm them too in the future if not contained now, he said. "We are fairly successful in taking along the world in this fight against terrorism," Jaishankar said. "Earlier, other countries used to ignore this issue thinking it would not affect them because it was happening somewhere else. Today, there is a pressure on those who support terrorism. This is an example of our diplomacy," the External Affairs Minister said.

Terrorist activities in the North East have declined because of India's strategic pact with

**125 dead following stampede during soccer match at Indonesia**

demanded that Arema management explain why, after 23 years of undefeated home matches against Persebaya, this one ended in a loss.

The violence spread outside the stadium where at least five police vehicles were toppled and set ablaze. Riot police responded by firing tear gas, including toward the stadium's stands, causing panic among the crowd.

"The stadium turned into a smoke-filled battleground when police fired tear gas," said Rizky, who came with his cousin to watch the game.

"I felt hot and stinging in my eyes, I couldn't see clearly while my head was dizzy and everything went dark ... I passed out," he said. When he woke up, he was injured in the emergency room. He said his cousin died because of head injuries.

"We wanted to entertain ourselves by watching a football match, but we got disaster," he said.

Another spectator, Ahmad Fatoni, said police had started beating the fans with sticks and shields, and they fought back.

"Officers fired tear gas directly at spectators in the stands, forcing us to run toward the exit," he said. "Many victims fell because of shortness of breath and difficulty seeing due to tear gas and were trampled."

He said he climbed the roof of the stands and only came down when the situation calmed down.

Others suffocated and were trampled as hundreds of people ran to the exit to avoid the tear gas. In the chaos, 34 died at the stadium, including two officers, and some reports include children among the casualties.

"We have already done a preventive action before finally firing the tear gas as (fans) began to attack the police, acting anarchically and burning vehicles," East Java police chief Nico Afinta said in a news conference early today.

More than 300 were rushed to hospitals but many died on the way and during a treatment, Afinta said.

National Police Chief Listyo Sigit Prabowo said the death toll had been revised to 125 from 174, after authorities found some of the victims were counted twice. More than 100 were receiving intensive treatment in eight hospitals, 11 of them in critical condition.

Indonesia's soccer association, known as PSSI, suspended the premier soccer league Liga 1 indefinitely in light of the tragedy and banned Arema from hosting soccer matches for the remainder of the season.

Grieving relatives waited for information about their loved ones at Malang's Saiful Anwar General Hospital. Others tried to identify the bodies laid at a morgue while medical workers put identification tag on the bodies of the victims.

"I deeply regret this tragedy and I hope this is the last soccer tragedy in this country, don't let another human tragedy like this happen in the future," Widodo said in a televised speech. "We must continue to maintain sportsmanship, humanity and a sense of brotherhood of the Indonesian nation."

He ordered the Sports Minister, the national police chief and the PSSI chair to conduct a thorough evaluation of the country's soccer and its security procedure.

Rajeev Rai Bhatnagar, Advisor to the Lt Governor lauded the efforts of students and teachers of

Youth and Sports Minister Zainudin Amali expressed regrets that "this tragedy happened when we were preparing for soccer game activities, both national and international level."

Indonesia is due to host the 2023 FIFA U-20 World Cup from May 20 to June 11, with 24 participating teams. As the host, the country automatically qualifies for the cup.

"Unfortunately, this incident has certainly injured our soccer image," Amali said.

In a statement, FIFA President Gianni Infantino expressed condolences on behalf of the global football community, saying "the football world is in a state of shock." The statement did not mention the use of tear gas.

At the Vatican, Pope Francis said he was praying for "all those who have lost their lives and were injured in the clashes that erupted after a soccer game in Malang, Indonesia."

Ferli Hidayat, local police chief of Malang, said there were some 42,000 spectators at the game Saturday, all of whom were Arema supporters because the organizer had banned Persebaya fans from entering the stadium in an effort to avoid brows.

The restriction was imposed after clashes between supporters of the two rival teams in East Java's Bliitar stadium in February 2020 caused 250 million rupiah (\$18,000) in damage. Brawls were reported outside the stadium during and after the semifinals of the East Java Governor's Cup, which ended with Persebaya beating Arema 4-2.

Rights groups responded to the tragedy by blaming the use of tear gas in the stadium by police.

Citing FIFA's stadium safety guidelines against the use of "crowd control gas" by pitch side stewards or police, Amnesty International called on Indonesian authorities to conduct a swift, thorough and independent investigation into the use of tear gas at Kanjuruhan stadium.

"Those who are found to have committed violations are tried in open court and do not merely receive internal or administrative sanctions," said Usman Hamid, executive director of Amnesty International Indonesia.

He said tear gas should only be used to disperse crowds when widespread violence has occurred and when other methods have failed. People must be warned that tear gas will be used and allowed to disperse. "No one should lose their lives at a football match," Hamid said.

Despite Indonesia's lack of international accolades in the sport, hooliganism is rife in the soccer-obsessed country where fanaticism often ends in violence, as in the 2018 death of a Persija Jakarta supporter who was killed by a mob of hardcore fans of rival club Persib Bandung in 2018.

Saturday's game is already among the world's worst crowd disasters, including the 1996 World Cup qualifier between Guatemala and Costa Rica in Guatemala City where over 80 died and over 100 more were injured. In April 2001, more than 40 people are crushed to death during a soccer match at Ellis Park in Johannesburg, South Africa. (AP)

**Surrendered militant arrested for twin Udhampur blasts, was in touch with Doda's Pak-based ultra**

terror.

"They (the Pakistan) can't see development in J&K. Home Minister (Amit Shah) is here to inaugurate several development projects. That is why during this high profile visit, they wanted to make their presence felt and convey message that all is not well," Dilbag said.

In a strong message to Pakistan, the DGP said destruction will lead Pakistan nowhere.

"First they should set their house in order and take care of issues back home than disturbing peace in Jammu and Kashmir," he added.

Disclosing that Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Toiba terror outfit was behind the recent twin blasts in Udhampur which were carried out ahead of high profile visit of HM to convey "all is not well" in the Union Territory, Dilbag said the case was worked out within the shortest period of three days with the arrest of a recycled militant.

"Definitely Pakistan and its agencies was been ensuring that the Valley remains not in peace but in disturbance. Now the things are better and improving with each passing day," he said.

Flanked by Additional Director General of Police, Jammu Mukesh Singh and other senior police officers from Udhampur district including DIG Suleman Choudhary and SSP Vinod Kumar, the police chief said whenever there is a high profile visit, the militants become desperate to carry out an attack.

"There is a drastic change in the overall security situation in J&K as borne out by facts and figures and not based on mere claims...a very large number of successful operations have been conducted. We have tried to keep our people and their properties safe during the counter-terror operations," Dilbag said.

He said "the people are by and large with us. We have tried to hit the terror eco-system on various fronts as a result of which the overall security scenario is much better today and you do not have the kind of situation that prevailed about four years back."

"We are watching them and keeping a close eye over their activities."

The DGP said Sheikh was an active militant in 2005 and was arrested in a case lodged at Billawar. He was recently released and was contacted by Khubaib.

"Whenever there is a high profile visit, we come across such types of activities. Two JeM fideyes were eliminated on the eve of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's last visit in April," he said.

He said the police and other security agencies are alert and frustrated by the nefarious designs of non-state actors like LeT and JeM with the arrest of several of their operatives like Talib Hussain who had spread his tentacles across the Jammu region.

Dilbag said they are keeping a close watch on the activities of former militants who are released from jails amid attempts by Pakistan-based handlers to recycle them into terrorism.

He also said several measures have already been taken to counter dropping of weapons and narcotics by drones from across the border and more counter-measures are in the pipeline to thwart such attempts.

"This (recycling of former militants) is not a problem related to Jammu province alone. There are numerous examples where such militants (after their release from jails) became active again for the second time, third time or even fourth time in the valley but most of them stand eliminated," the police chief said.

He said police are keeping an eye on such elements who were active militants at some point of time and are now released from jails after serving their sentence.

**Govt to set up 100 5G labs in country: Vaishnaw**

NEW DELHI, Oct 2:

The Government plans to set up 100 labs for 5G technology across India and at least 12 of them will be used to train students and conduct experiments, Telecom Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said on Sunday.

The Minister also asked companies participating in the Indian Mobile Congress to provide their input for the new telecom bill through which the government aims to simplify licensing regime.

"We are going to set up 100 5G labs across the country. I request the telecom industry to come together and convert at least 12 of these 100 labs into telecom incubators to train students and do experiments."

"The Government is working significantly towards simplifying the licensing regime for all telecom players. I am really happy to see the energy of startups and MSMEs, who are going to rural areas to benefit people," Vaishnaw said.

At the event, indigenous tele-

has been found between them so far.

"Whatever is happening in Punjab and J&K including air dropping of weapons and narcotics to fund terror activities is controlled by handlers sitting in Pakistan. They are common in both the cases but no direct link between Punjab militants and those operating in J&K has been found as of now," he said.

In response to another question, the DGP said there was no major involvement of women in terror related activities but women were found involved in narco trade. "We do not differentiate between a woman and a man as the law is equal for both of them."

On the proposal to install full body scanners on Jammu-Srinagar National Highway to check smuggling of weapons into Kashmir, he said the committee is working on it.

He said most of the areas in Jammu and Kashmir are still terror free. "Attempts are being made to revive militancy especially in Jammu region but all such attempts were thwarted by alert police and security forces with the busting of several modules this year."

The DGP said the use of sticky bombs by Lashkar-e-Toiba terror outfit is a challenge for the security forces.

"Most of the sticky bombs are being supplied through LeT. There are several incidents where sticky bombs were used in Jammu province and one in Kulgam district of south Kashmir," the DGP said, adding the sticky bombs are associated with the particular terror group and it is a "serious threat" because the devices are ready-to-use and easy to handle.

"This is a matter of national security which could have possible adverse effects on the country's interest," the Cabinet committee stated in a notification. It said that legal action was "necessary" and the FIA should form a committee comprising senior officials to probe the matter.

"The FIA team should take action against offenders as per law," the committee recommended in the summary. (PTI)
