JAMMU, Oct 7: Secretary, Health and Medical Education (H&ME), Bhupinder Kumar, today chaired a meeting at Civil Secretariat here to review functioning of health sector in Kashmir division.

He impressed upon them to utilize the approved funds for the infrastructure to the maximum besides ensuring follow up of DPRs of NABARD with the concerned District Development Commissioners.
Among others the meeting was attended by Chief Medical Officers and Medical Superintendents Kashmir division.
While reviewing the functioning of National dialysis programme, Secretary expressed his dismay over less number of dialysis sessions being undertaken despite having good number of machines available and directed for improvement in the functioning of this programme for the benefit of patients.
He asked the chief medical officers to further improve their performance. He further laid stress on increasing availability of Jan Aushadhi drugs at hospitals and stressed for increasing sales of these drugs in government hospitals. He said people must be made aware about the benefits of these affordable and quality medicines.

Ujh Multipurpose Project DC Kathua reviews status of clearances

At the outset, DC Kathua exhorted the stakeholders viz RTIC, JKPCDC and Revenue to pace up the process concerning their departments. He said the project has huge significance as it will cater to the water and power needs of Kathua and Samba districts.
The DC informed that JKPCDC being a Nodal Agency for the project has to ensure early finalisation of DPR after thorough assessment of the areas being affected by the project so that necessary course of action with regard to revenue matters could be taken up.
It was given out in the meeting that NOC for Stage-I of the project has been received and the DPR of the project is awaiting approval from Central Water Commission (CWC). Once approval of DPR is accorded by CWC, the same shall be sent to the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC).
The DC further enjoined upon

the stakeholders to carry out the accurate assessment and adherence to the conditions laid down by concerned authorities including the site specific study for ecological impact on fish species in consultation with Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute (CIFRI) as mandated by MoEF&CC.
The ADC Billawar was asked to complete the process of mutation of state land under Compensatory Afforestation Fund Management and Planning Authority (CAMPA).
The DC further directed XEN RTIC Kathua to ensure early release of the amount due in lieu of areas pertaining to the forest department falling under the project.
Pertinently, the Ujh Multipurpose Project after completion will create the irrigation potential of 91,073 hectare alongwith power generation capacity of 89.50 MW with an estimated cost of Rs. 11,907 cr.
The meeting was attended by ACR Kathua Sandeep Seointra, CPO Kathua Utam Singh, XEN JKPCDC, XEN RTIC and ADC Billawar, Tehsildars of Billawar and Basohli joined virtually.

WVEPC celebrates 58th Foundation Day

JAMMU, Oct 7: Wool and Woollens Export Promotion Council (WVEPC), Union Ministry of Textiles celebrated its 58th Establishment Day here today.
Romesh Khajuria, Chairman WVEPC, who was chief guest on the occasion, said that the council was established to look into the issues as well as hardships being faced by the manufacturer and exporters of woolen products in early 60s when our country had just entered into foreign trade and introduced domestic woolen products in international market.
He further said that Union Minister of Commerce and Industry and Textiles, Piyush Goel has recently signed FTA with Australia which enables Indian importers to import raw wool at zero duty.
Khajuria said that production of wool in the country is not sufficient to meet demands of the wool industry particularly for the apparel sector and most of it is being imported from Australia, New Zealand, China and many other countries.

"Total production of raw wool in India was 40 to 48 million kg approx during the last decade. Out of the total wool produced in India, about 85 per cent is carpet grade wool, 5 per cent apparel grade and remaining 10 per cent coarser grade wool for making rough blankets etc," he maintained adding: "India exported woolen products worth Rs. 5300 crore in 2021-22 (excluding woollen carpets) and registered growth of 30 per cent over the last year.
Khajuria also said that woolen yarn and articles of wool apparel and clothing accessories (both knitted and woven) are among India's largest exported woolen products.
"India exports wool and woolen products to more than 150 countries around the world.
Suresh, Executive Director WVEPC shared best wishes and cooperation from its members.
WVEPC also appreciates hard work of export fraternity in achieving the ambitious export target of US \$ 400 billion during 2021-22, envisioned by PM Modi.

Notorious drug peddler detained under PSA

DODA, Oct 7: A notorious drug peddler has been detained under Public Safety Act (PSA) here.
As per police sources, a habitual offender of bovine smuggling and narcotics drugs namely Adil Fareed, son of Fareed Ahmed, a resident of Runta Baderwah has been detained under PSA by the order of District Magistrate Doda for his involvement in bovine smuggling incessantly and drug peddling as well.
It is worthwhile to mention here that the accused was involved in a number of FIRs of bovine smuggling and drugs peddling registered against him at Police Station Baderwah. In spite of involvement in number of FIRs of bovine smuggling, the subject did not mend himself and did not bother about the law of the land. In subject to mention here that the subject was also plunged in the black business of smuggling and supplying of nar-

cotics drugs to youth of the area which is evident from the FIR registered against him under NDPS Act at Police Station Baderwah.
The accused was a dreaded criminal involved in the business of bovine smuggling together with trade of narcotics drugs. His criminal activities of both types were definitely a serious threat to locals of the area especially youth and also detrimental and prejudicial to the public order of the district.
Acting tough against drug and bovine smugglers, this year Doda Police has registered 36 FIRs against 40 persons and 2 notorious drug peddlers have been booked under PSA.
