that required industrialists to be sent to jail over minor issues and maintained India's ranking in ease of doing business list has improved considerably after he took office in 2014.

Modi said under his Government, India's position in the World Bank's annual ranking of countries for their ease of doing business jumped massively - from 142 to 63 in five years.

Speaking at a rally in Jamnagar in poll-bound Gujarat, the PM said he intends to see India figure in a top-50 ranking in the assessment report. "The (outdated) laws continued from the time of the British (rule) and I roped in an entire team (to review them) because I did not want the country's businesspersons to land in jail over trivial issues. We scrapped 2,000 such laws. I have to do more, and if traders sitting here know of such a law, let me know," he said.

In a veiled attack on the Congress, Modi said earlier Governments ignored the issue of

improving business environment in the country. "There was no mention of ease of doing business earlier...Compared to efforts put in by my Government. We changed the laws and the system legally which helped in improving India's ranking. When I became Prime Minister (in 2014), India was ranked 142 (in ease of doing business list). We worked hard for 5 to 6 years and we reached the 63rd position.

"If we push hard, we will go below-50. Such a massive improvement is not confined only on papers...Small businesses are helping improve things on the ground," the PM said.

Modi also praised former Ruler of Jamnagar Digvijay Singh for help extended by him to the people of Poland during World War II. "Poland helped us while bringing back our students from (war-torn) Ukraine as erstwhile ruler of Jamnagar Digvijay Singh had assisted Polish people during World War II," the PM said. (PTI)

### Patient care hit adversely as GMC Kathua sans MRI machine

Senior Resident and Junior Resident doctors but ironically, presently only two Radiologists are manning the department with the help of 10 technicians.

"Out of 10 technicians, four of them are engaged for CT scan and remaining are helping in rotational level in X-rays, Ultrasound and other tests which come under the department," said another source while wishing anonymity.

Due to the absence of sufficient manpower, especially the expert doctors in the department, the patient gets the long date of the CT scan from 2 to 3 months, while for Ultrasound, they (patients) get a 3 to 4 week date. "On daily basis, nearly 100 patients were recommended for Ultrasound wherein only 30 have been succeeded to get ultrasound and remaining 70 patients got a long date," said a doctor adding that because of only two doctors in the department who

serve the department in rotational basis (Day and Night) can make manually only 25 to 30 reports of Ultrasound in a day.

In CT scans, to make a report which takes about 15 to 20 minutes, but in some critical cases, it takes 30 to 45 minutes, said a Radiologist.

"If Government intentionally makes the Radiology department a fully functional department, at least 10 expert doctors including Professors, Associate Professors and Assistant Professors posts should be appointed along with more than 20 technicians, otherwise the patient care will disturb," said a doctor.

It is not a saga of only Radiology department, almost all the departments of this premier institution are functioning less than half sanctioned strength and the condition of the college and hospital will be deteriorated in coming days as most of the highly qualified faculty which is considered to be backbone of the this hospital have joined the AIIMS Jammu and GMC Jammu in recent recruitment made by both premier institutions of the Jammu.

Principal, Dr. Anjali Nadir Bhat admitted that it is a long pending demand of the institution and in the recent meeting with the higher-ups, she again raised the issue of installing MRI in the premier institution of Kathua. "The higher-up assured me along with other Principals of the matter would be resolved soon," she added.

### Against 15,155 hectares forest area diverted, afforestation done on 73,994 hectares in J&K

by Wildlife Protection Department. During the financial year 2021-22, against the total approved outlay of Rs 252.01 crore, the total expenditure ending March 2022 was Rs 127.74 crore. Besides, liability/spillover works of financial year 2021-22 amounting to Rs 10.05 crore will be released in financial year 2022-23.

As far as year-wise expenditure incurred under CAMPA by J&K Forest and allied departments and Wildlife Protection Department is concerned, the expenditure was Rs 1888.97 lakh in 2010-11 and the same increased to Rs 11351.34 lakh in 2019-20 and Rs 12774.05 lakh in 2021-22.

About the physical achievements under CAMPA, the data reveals that a total of 2885 hectares of area was treated in 2010-11 and this number increased to 12474 hectares during 2020-21. Likewise, only 890 boundary pillars were installed in 2010-11 but this number increased to 7176 in 2020-21 and 9669 in 2021-22.

moted 8000 officers at the Centre. Sixteen JKAS officers were inducted into IAS recently. Remaining 24 vacancies of inductions of JKAS officers into IAS will also be filled up shortly," Dr Jitendra Singh said.

He added that after clearing backlog for promotion of JKAS officers into IAS, the induction process will be made a regular feature depending on the vacancies.

The inductions from now onwards will be carried out every year to ensure that there is no backlog, he asserted.

It may be mentioned here that induction of 16 JKAS officers into IAS were approved by the DoPT and MHA on August 2 this year after 12 years.

However, since there were a total of 41 vacancies for inductions into IAS from JKAS officers, sources said 24 or 25 remaining vacancies will also be filled shortly and thereafter inductions will be carried out every year so that no backlog is created.

Inductions kept pending in Jammu and Kashmir due to failure of previous Governments to initiate measures as well because of certain

### Five terror-modules busted in Punjab

The Punjab Police today said it has busted five major terror modules after arresting 17 people in the past 10 days. Apart from this, police teams have also recovered three hand grenades and one improvised explosive device.

Inspector General of Police (IGP) Sukhchain Singh Gill said in the past 10 days, police teams managed to strike a major blow to the terrorist modules being operated by gangsters-turned-terrorists, including Lakhbir Singh, alias Landa, Harvinder Singh, alias Rinda, and Arsh Dala.

On October 1, the Punjab Police busted a module after arresting three operatives of an ISI-backed terror module jointly handled by Canada-based Lakhbir Landa and Pakistan-based Harvinder Rinda after recovering one sophisticated AK-56 assault rifle along with two magazines, 90 live cartridges and two bullet shells, he said.

Earlier on September 28, an operative of Canada-based terrorist Lakhbir Landa gang was arrested from Bihar for his involvement in several heinous crimes pertaining to murder, attempt to murder, assault, robbery and snatching.

The IGP said an ISI-backed Khalistan Tiger Force (KTF) terror module being operated by Canada-based terrorist and gangster Arshdeep Singh, alias Arsh Dala, was busted with the arrest of its two operatives from Chamkaur Sahib.

Police also recovered two illicit weapons, including a .22 bore revolver and .32 bore pistol along with 21 live cartridges.

Two days after, police arrested one more operative of the same module after recovering three hand grenades and two pistols from his car, said Gill.

On October 4, the Amritsar rural police busted an ISI-backed narcoterrorism module after arresting its main operative.
