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SIA raids house of SM handler

An SIA official said that it conducted a raid at the house of a Social Media handler at Magam involved in publishing of criminal content on the Social Media at the behest of militants and secessionist elements. "On a reliable information, a case FIR No. 18/2022 U/S 153-A, 505,506 IPC and 13 UA(P) Act was registered in Police Station SIA Kashmir and investigation was taken up. During investigation, it surfaced that the SM user was propagating anti-India and secessionist

propaganda besides, profiling and intimidating specific individuals especially those who are in support of peace, order and violence-free society, by issuing virtual threats," the official said. He further stated that the suspected person has been glamorizing militants and expressing active support to the anti-national elements by sharing incriminating photographs, videos and texts etc. on Social Media with active financial and ideological support of secessionist

groups as well as the militant organizations within the Valley for advocating their militant as well as secessionist activities. The official said that the search was carried out in compliance to court warrant obtained from the Court of Special Judge, Designated under NIA Act (TADA/POTA) Srinagar. He said that during search, incriminating material which include mobile phone, SIM cards and bank documents were seized for further investigation.

HC upholds attachment, eviction of property

Justice Sanjeev Kumar dismissed two petitions filed by Syed Akeel Shah and Syed Abeeel Shah hailing from North Kashmir's Sopore by recording that these petitions are found to be devoid of any merit and the same are accordingly, dismissed. "This Court is not required to resort to the principles of statutory interpretation to construe and understand the otherwise plain, clear and unambiguous provisions of Section 8 of the Act of 2002 and the Rule 5(2) of the Rules of 2013 whatever be the difficulty and whatever be the consequences, the provisions of PML Act are required to be given effect to so long as these provisions exist on the statute", Justice Kumar said. "If the words used in the statute are plain, clear, unambiguous and

capable of only one construction then," court said, "it would not be open to the Courts to adopt any other hypothetical construction on the ground that such construction would make the statute more consistent with its object and policy". The petitioners have been accused in two FIRs registered by the then Vigilance Organization Kashmir, respectively under Section 5 (2) of the J&K Prevention of Corruption Act, on the allegations as set out in the FIRs. Subsequently, the Enforcement Directorate, Jammu for offence under Prevention of Money Laundering Act and during investigation by ED, a provisional attachment orders were passed, with regard to movable/immovable properties of the all the three persons including bank accounts, and a residential accommodation.

The ED counsel and Deputy Solicitor General of India, appearing for the respondents argued that Section 8(4) of the Act clearly provides that owner or occupier of the attached property can be evicted forthwith after the order of attachment is confirmed by the Adjudicating Authority under Section 8(3) of the Act. Justice Kumar said that after following the procedure prescribed, the Adjudicating Authority may confirm the attachment of the property made under law or retention of property or record seized or frozen under the Act. "Once the provisional attachment made under Section 5(1) is confirmed by the Adjudicating Authority, the authorized officer is entitled to forthwith take possession of the attached property in the manner prescribed under the Rules of 2013", read the judgment.

Once Prime Minister Modi's address was over, he was surrounded by reporters who wanted to know about the location of the 1993 Mumbai blast mastermind Dawood Ibrahim, designated as a global terrorist by the United Nations, and asked when he and other terrorists wanted by India like Jaish-e-Mohammad chief

Masood Azhar and 9/11 mastermind Hafiz Saeed will be handed over. Butt stayed mum and walked away even as media persons fired a volley of questions at the top Pakistani officer. He was appointed as the director-general of the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) which is also the National Central Bureau of Pakistan to coordinate with Interpol in July this year. (PTI)

PM calls upon Intl community to eliminate safe terror havens

the ultimate sacrifice in this fight," he said. He said a safe and secure world is a shared responsibility of the global community. "When the forces of good cooperate, the forces of crime cannot operate," he said. He said there can be no safe havens for the corrupt, terrorists, drug cartels, poaching gangs or organised crime. "Such crimes against people in one place are crimes against everyone, crimes against humanity. Further, these not only harm our present but also impact our future generations. Police and law enforcement agencies need to devise procedures and protocols to increase cooperation. Interpol can help by speeding up Red Corner Notices for fugitive offenders," he said. India has 780 active Red Notices as of now, of which 205 are

related to criminals wanted by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI). In his 14-minute speech, the Prime Minister said terrorism is not limited to physical space and has spread its presence through online radicalization and cyber threats. "At the click of a button, an attack can be executed or systems can be brought to their knees. Each nation is working on strategies against them. But what we do within our borders is no longer enough. There is a need to further develop international strategies. "Establishment of early detection and warning systems, protecting transportation services, security for communication infrastructure, security for critical infrastructure, technical and technological assistance, intelligence exchange, many of these things need to be taken to a new level," he said. The Prime Minister said corrup-

tion and financial crimes have harmed the welfare of the citizens of many countries. "The corrupt find a way to park the proceeds of crime in different parts of the world. This money belongs to the citizens of the country from which they have been taken. Often, this has been taken from some of the poorest people in the world," he said. He said such illicit money is pushed into evil activities and becomes one of the major sources of terror funding. "From illegal drugs that destroy young lives to human trafficking, from weakening democracies to the sale of illegal arms, this dirty money funds many destructive enterprises. Yes, there are diverse legal and procedural frameworks to deal with them. However, there is a need for the global community to work even faster to eliminate safe havens," the Prime Minister said.(PTI)
