JAMMU, Oct 20: The Government today constituted a committee for formulation of a comprehensive Electric Vehicle Policy for the Union Territory of J&K. Headed by Administrative Secretary, Housing & Urban Development Department, the committee shall evaluate and suggest measures to promote electric mobility ecosystem in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir in general and in the twin cities of Jammu and Srinagar in particular. Administrative Secretary, Industries and Commerce Department; Administrative Secretary PDD; Administrative Secretary, Transport Department; Secretary, Law, Justice and Parliamentary

Affairs Department and Director General, Budget are among the Members of the committee, which shall furnish its report within a period of one month. The committee shall also analyze scope of incentives as may be granted for ownership of electric vehicles, including conversion of existing commercial fleets into electric setup. It shall suggest broad contours of the infrastructural requirements for shifting to electric mobility, comparing similar policies/rules of neighboring States and analyze aspects related to road safety associated with the usage of electric vehicles. The committee shall suggest measures to promote research and innovation as well as skill development in the field of electric vehicles.

**Two end lives by hanging**

JAMMU, Oct 20: In separate cases, two persons ended their lives by hanging themselves in Jammu. "A 30-year-old man namely Sanjay son of Sadhu Ram, resident of Dhami (Nagrota) was found hanging from the hook of a ceiling fan at his home," police sources said. They further said that a 25-year-old boy namely Anush Sharma son of Yashpal Sharma, resident of Bhajwal (Sunderbani) was found hanging from a tree with the help of rope at JDA park, near Trikuta Nagar, where he was presently living. Sources said the dead bodies of both the deceased were shifted to Government Medical College and Hospital, Jammu and after postmortem, handed over to their legal heirs for last rites. Nagrota Police and Trikuta Nagar police had taken cognizance in both the cases.
