The Ministry said the action was taken on the inputs from intelligence agencies.

HC upholds termination of Govt employee

He was Councillor, SMC and in blatant violations of rules and regulation was holding another public post simultaneously at State Motor Garages as a Tyre Mechanic and was terminated by the Government from services and a separate order was also issued for recovery of salary from him.

He had filed two writ petitions seeking quashing of his termination order issued by Director State Motor Garages where he was working as a Tyre Mechanic and advertisement notice issued for filling up the post.

"It clearly transpires that the petitioner, while working in the Department as a Tyre Mechanic, simultaneously continued to actively function as Councillor of Ward No.19 of the Corporation and received perks from the Corporation in the shape of monthly honorarium, lumpsum amount as cell phone charges and meeting charges, thereby committing gross misconduct", Court said.

The petitioner, court said, by doing so, has remained as a public representative as well as a Government employee leading to double draw of wages and salary which cannot be done by a Government official.

With regard to recovery of salary said if the authorities are allowed to recover the salary

received by the petitioner for the work done by him, it will definitely amount to begging which is not permissible under law in any circumstance whatsoever.

"That being so, the direction for recovery of the salary of the petitioner for the period he has performed duties in the State Motor Garages Department is not only harsh, but arbitrary as well and, therefore, deserves to be quashed", Justice Magrey said.

Court dismissed both the petitions to the extent of challenging termination of the services of the petitioner as also the advertisement of the post of Tyre Mechanic vide advertisement notice.

It was argued before the court that this conduct on the part of the employee was totally in violation of the Jammu and Kashmir Employees Conduct Rules/Municipal Corporation Act, thereby attracting disciplinary action under the relevant provisions of the rules and regulations governing the field.

It was also pleaded that, as per records, the petitioner has drawn honorarium as a Councillor from the Corporation as also the cell phone charges. It was also submitted that he may have got his resignation endorsed by the then Mayor of the Corporation, but the same has not been deliberately submitted before the Commissioner, SMC.

DB upholds life imprisonment of HM 'Area Comdr'

After hearing both the sides, the DB observed, "some of the eye-witnesses stated that there were some more persons when the appellant-accused committed the murder of the deceased but they had not entered the house where the offence was committed and it was only the appellant-accused who had committed the offence".

"Moreover, two more persons, who had been arrayed as accused in the case by the prosecution, had died before the appellant was produced before the court of law to face trial. Appellant was the main offender, who was charged to have committed the murder and the other accused persons who were stated to have accompanied him at the time of commission of the murder, had died before framing of charge", DB said.

"In-fact the charge of abetment or criminal conspiracy was against other accused and not the appellant. Therefore, there was no need to charge the appellant-accused, a main perpetrator of the crime, to be charged for

the offences of criminal conspiracy or abetment. This plea of the appellant is also found without any merit and substance", DB further said.

"Having regard to these reasons, Division Bench is of the considered opinion that the trial court has rightly connected the appellant-accused with the commission of offence, of which he was charged under Section 302 RPC and acquitted him of other charges particularly the offence under Section 7/27 Arms Act in view of the fact that the weapon of offence was not recovered", read the judgment of DB.

"The trial court, after marshalling the evidence brought on record and apt appreciation, has passed a very reasoned judgment and the appellant-accused has failed to point out anything that could be fatal to the prosecution case. In our opinion the impugned judgment / order do not call for any interference while exercising appellate jurisdiction". DB said while dismissing the appeal and confirming the life imprisonment of appellant.

Six Pak army officials killed in air crash

The accident comes more than a month after a similar incident occurred in Balochistan on August 1 when a Pakistan Army helicopter crashed, killing all six personnel, including a Lieutenant General, on board.

The Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR), the media wing of the Pakistani military, said today that 39-year-old Major Khurram Shahzad (pilot) and 30-year-old Major Muhammad Muneeb Afzal (pilot) were among those killed in the crash.

The funeral prayers of the six army personnel were offered at Quetta Garrison, according to the ISPR. Balochistan corps commander as well as senior military and civil officials attended the funeral.

Their bodies are now being sent to their native towns where they will be buried with full military honours, the army said.

Prime Minister Shehbaz

Sharif said he was deeply grieved and prayed for the deceased and their family members. He said the entire nation shared the grief of the bereaved.

President Arif Alvi also expressed grief over the incident and extended condolences to the victims' families.

Former Prime Minister Imran Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party leader Fawad Chaudhry said helicopter flying was getting dangerous in the country, adding that it required "engineering evaluation".

"Too many crashes [...] rest in peace bravehearts. All were too young to die," he said.

Balochistan, bordering Iran and Afghanistan, is home to a long-running violent insurgency. Baloch insurgent groups have previously carried out several attacks targeting security personnel and the USD 60 billion China Pakistan Economic Corridor projects. (PTI)

Apple trucks stranded on NH-44 being cleared: Div Com

Pole said that Chief Secretary had taken a review meeting which was attended by DGP and all officers of Traffic department.

"At present around 4000 trucks loaded with fresh, perishable, petroleum products and other requirements of the Valley are stranded in the Jammu region," he stated.

He said that the capacity of NH-44 for one way heavy motor vehicle movement is just about 3000 to 3500 if there is no disruption in traffic due to landslides, shooting stones and breakdown of loaded trucks. "Anything above the capacity disturbs the whole cycle of up and down release of traffic and this may result in piling up of traffic on NH," he added.

He said that there are difficulties in the movement of the traffic on Srinagar-Jammu National Highway due to shooting stones triggered by rains.

"We have difficulties in the movement of traffic on the highway due to rains and resultant shooting stones but it is beyond human control. I appeal to them to use alternate Mughal road to lessen the burden on Srinagar-Jammu National Highway," he said.

He added that the claim made by certain fruit growers unions on the halting of fruit trucks is half truth and natural reasons are hindering traffic.

Pole said in September, 46, 000 goods laden trucks including 29000 apple trucks have been sent out of Kashmir.

He said administration is doing all efforts and appealed that Mughal road be used, at least for empty vehicles.

The Divisional Commissioner said that normally apple production in Kashmir is 17 lakh metric ton but this year had a bumper crop. "This year due to abundant rainfall, there has been a bumper crop and it will cross 21 lakh metric ton," he added.

In South Kashmir, thousands of trucks are lined up on the highway

awaiting crossing. Some of the truckers have been here on the highway for last six days.

A trucker from Punjab, Mohinder Singh, has been here in Qazigund for last six days. "I came here on September 21 and since then I am waiting. We urge Government that we should be allowed to move on the highway otherwise apple will rot in the trucks," he said.

Another trucker, Ajjaz Ahmad, who loaded apple from Baramulla is waiting on the highway in Anantnag area for last four days. "If I continue to remain here for a couple of more days, the apple would rot. I appeal Government that we should be allowed to move ahead on the highway", he said.

In the meantime, all 10 fruit Mandis in the Kashmir which include Srinagar, Sopore, Shopian, Pulwama, Kulgam, Panchhar, Anantnag, Handwara, Baramulla and Ganderbal remained closed for second day today in protest against halting of trucks on the highway.

Kashmir valley Fruit Growers and Dealers Association (KVF&G&DA) protested against the halting of trucks. They also burnt apple boxes in Parimpora fruit market in Srinagar. They also held protests in Partap Park area of city centre.

Bashir Ahmed, president KVF&G&DA told Excelsior that the trucks are being stopped unnecessarily causing huge losses.

"The trucks are being halted for days together making fruit to rot and lose their sale contracts in the Mandis. On Saturday we travelled on the highway and saw 8000 trucks stranded. Some were there for 7-8 days," he said.

He said that Traffic department is not following the traffic advisory which is causing the traffic jams and damage to the fruit. "Some trucks were cleared yesterday but more have arrived there keeping the number of halted trucks same as it was two days ago," he said.

Narendra Modi-led NDA Government at the Centre, Patil said that since the change of guard happened in New Delhi, the prices of essential commodities have increased manifold. She claimed that after mirror shown to BJP in DDC elections where it could win only 75 out of 280 seats, it is day dreaming and befooling people and BJP can never come to power in J&K again.

She asked the party cadre to be united and disseminate information among the masses with regard to directionless policies of the BJP Government. She said unlike BJP Government, the Congress has a long history of bringing in colossal development without demeaning the Constitutional institutions. She asked the cadre to convince the people that it is only the Congress party which can tackle unemployment, poverty and lies of BJP leadership on ground because the BJP government has been exposed badly on all issues and problems, as it has only one expertise and that is of being rhetoric.

On this occasion, scores of political workers embraced Congress party. Azad launches Democratic Azad Party in J&K

"You just check Parliament records of who has spoken or who has not on this issue. Get the record of Parliament on any one's name. But my take is simple that I don't use such issues for elections."

"I am launching Democratic Azad Party (DAP) from here today. It symbolises democracy and freedom of speech and thoughts. Our ideology will be based on the ideals of Mahatma Gandhi," he said.

Azad also displayed Party flag (Blue, White and Yellow) during crowded press conference and explained about the idea behind choosing these colours connected to peace, creativity and deep and wide like a sea.

The former Congress leader said DAP will have no comparison or enmity with any other political party. It will focus on restoration of peace and normalcy in Jammu and Kashmir.

"I have never said restoration of Article 370 was not possible. And I never said this can't happen. I said that I cannot convince Prime Minister Narendra Modi. If anyone can persuade Modi Ji and Union Home Minister Amit Shah, they should do it. It will be a welcome step. I do not have any such influence on Modi Ji," Azad maintained.

"Only Parliament can restore Article 370 but we need a majority. When voting took place in Parliament on Article 370, they got 86 per cent votes. But I do not see chances of getting such a majority in near future by the opposition. The second option is the Supreme Court," Azad added.

By abrogating Article 370, the Central Government had revoked the special status of Jammu and Kashmir. The Supreme Court has agreed to list after Dussehra vacation the pleas challenging the decision. "It was a welcome step that the Supreme Court will be hearing the case from October 10," Azad said.

"In fact, Maharaja Hari Singh on the request of local people from J&K and specially Kashmiris, enacted State Subject Law to stop the settlement of rich people from Lahore and other parts of Punjab in 1927 and then made amendment in 1932. It continued even after Accession of the State of Jammu and Kashmir with the Union of India in 1947. Article 370 is basically 'a child' of Accession of Jammu and Kashmir with India," Azad remarked.

"We have already declared that our priority will be to restore Statehood to J&K besides protecting jobs and lands of the local. DAP will focus on the development, restoration of peace and normalcy in J&K. Our party has resolved to provide 50% seats to the women and youth during upcoming elections," Azad maintained.

15 dead, 24 hurt in Russian school shooting

Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov described the shooting as "a terrorist act" and said Russian President Vladimir Putin has given all the necessary orders to the relevant authorities.

"President Putin deeply mourns deaths of people and children in the school, where a terrorist act took place," Peskov told reporters today.

The school educates children between grades one and 11. It had been evacuated and the area around it has been cordoned off, the Governor said.

Russia's National Guard said Kazantsev used two non-lethal handguns adapted to fire real bullets. The guns were not registered with the authorities.

A criminal probe into the incident has been launched on charges of multiple murder and illegal possession of firearms.

Jai Kumar informed that Chandni Paath has been started at the temple today and the Kirtan will be held daily by different parties.
