

## Manmohan takes stock of Jat community problems

SAMBHA, Sept 27: Ch Manmohan Singh, president of All India Jat Maha Sabha today sought support from women folk to strengthen the cause of the Jat community.

In this regard, members of Jat Maha Sabha visited village Langoor in tehsil Ramgarh of district Samba and took stock of the problems being faced by the community members. Today's meeting was organized by local Sarpanch Kali Dass in which community members including women folk participated in large numbers.

Ch Manmohan said that after the wars of 1947, 1965 and 1971, the members of Jat community were facing numerous problems due to callous attitude of officers sitting at the helm affairs. He reiterated the demand of OBC status to the Jat community on the lines of other states which is its right and no power can stop Jats from getting their legitimate right.

In the meeting, the community members said that near about five to six feet filth gathered on their field in 2016 floods. They said that the land was still in the same position and they were not able to make it cultivatable. Besides, water pumps installed on their fields were also washed away and till

date they had not received a single penny from the Government. They also raised serious concern over the fake power bills sent by the Power Department to the farmers whose agricultural land was washed away in flash floods. They criticized the Government at the Centre for taking anti-farmers decisions by stopping financial assistance of Rs 2000 under PM Kisan Nidhi Scheme.

Ch Manmohan termed it unfortunate that after the passing of nearly six years since 2016 the helpless community are not able to cultivate their land which was the only source of their income and have been forced to live a miserable life, exposing the hollow claims of the Government at the Centre. He asserted that due to denial of ownership rights of custodian lands allotted to the displaced families of 1965 and 1971 in lieu of land left over in Chhamb sector after displacement, the Jat farmers were deprived of compensation from the Government.

Ch Manmohan stated that Jats have not occupied any land forcibly and illegally. The same custodian lands were allotted by the then Government. He said why the Government is shying to hand over ownership rights to the displaced persons.

## Pak wives of ex-militants seek citizenship or deportation

SRINAGAR, Sept 27: The Pakistani wives of Kashmiri surrendered militants who came to Kashmir under the rehabilitation policy over a decade ago today staged a protest, seeking either Indian citizenship or deportation.

Scores of these women appeared in the Press Enclave and

were seen holding a silent sit-in along with their children while alleging that no one from the administration came to them to talk about their issues.

"We were here even yesterday, protesting, seeking justice; we have come here in 2010 under the rehabilitation policy and since 2012, we are out of roads, seeking either the acceptance of the Government or the travel documents so that we could go and meet our families," Sairah Javid,

one of the protesting women said. She said that if the Government is not ready to accept them, then measures should be taken to facilitate their deportation back to Pakistan. "Then that is the only option for us and instead of making us suffer here, better is to send us back," she said.

The protesting women demanded immediate intervention from the Home Minister so that their issues are resolved. "The Government on a daily basis addresses several issues which are of human importance, but we fail to understand why they are not taking measures to address ours," they said.

Another woman, Misbah said that they came to Kashmir at the invitation of the Government and now they have been made to suffer daily which is not only taking a toll on them but is also resulting in a troubled upbringing of their children.

## Burqa clad woman arrested for kidnapping baby from hospital

KISHTWAR, Sept 27: Acting swiftly, Kishtwar police arrested a burqa clad woman and recovered the kidnapped 6-month-old baby from her possession within eight hours.

As per police sources, a six-month-old baby of Farmeem Ahmed, son of Bashir Ganai of Chhillara District Doda, at present Link Road District Kishtwar, was allegedly kidnapped from the District Hospital Kishtwar. The mother of the child has gone to District Hospital for his treatment, when the incident took place.

The CCTV cameras footage showed a burqa clad woman carrying away the baby from the hospital at around 12:00 Noon, sources said, adding that a search was launched to nab her and rescue the child.

Police had also announced a reward of Rs 10,000 for any information about the child.

Meanwhile, teams from Police Station Kishtwar under the direct supervision of SSP Kishtwar Shafiq Hussain Batt were constituted which put in

hectic efforts and finally recovered the child from a house near Veterinary Hospital Kishtwar within 8 hours.

District Doda was also arrested. After medical examination, the child was handed over to his parents.

A case under relevant sections stands registered at Police Station Kishtwar and further investigation is going on.

People of the Kishtwar hailed the efforts of SSP Kishtwar Shafiq Hussain Batt and his team members for displaying high standards of professionalism to recover the child and arrest the abductor. They also raised pro-police slogans for rescuing the baby within hours.

## Notorious drug peddler booked under PIT NDPS Act

DODA, Sept 27: A notorious drugs peddler has been booked under Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (PIT NDPS) Act and is lodged in District Jail Bhandarwah here today.

As per police sources, a notorious drugs peddler namely Sadam Hussain Zargar alias Sanam Poonchi, son of Ali Mohd Zargar, a resident of Chinote, Bhandarwah has been booked under Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (PIT NDPS) Act for his repeated involvement in possession and transportation of narcotics substances.

It is pertinent to mention here that the said drugs peddler was involved in many offences related to NDPS Act which

includes FIR Number 200/2019 registered against him on 26-07-2019 at Police Station Gandhi Nagar Jammu and FIR Number 132/2022 registered on 15-08-2022 at Police Station Bhandarwah. He was serious threat to youths of the locality by way of getting them involved in consuming as well as selling drugs and spoiling their career vis health.

After booking him under PIT NDPS Act, the notorious drugs peddler has been lodged in District Jail Bhandarwah.

Doda Police is acting tough against the drug peddlers and is making strenuous efforts to eradicate drug menace from the society. So far 36 cases have been registered against 40 drug peddlers during the current year. Moreover, 32 drug peddlers were also detained under preventive custody.

## Juvenile among 4 arrested with stolen item

JAMMU, Sept 27: Bishnah Police arrested four thieves including a juvenile and recovered stolen item from their possession.

As per police sources, a complaint was lodged by a lady namely Santosh Kumari, wife of Prem of Ward Number 12 with Police Station Bishnah stating therein that some unidentified persons have stolen gold ornaments, cash and one LED from her house situated at Ward Number 12 Bishnah.

Acting over the complaint, a case FIR Number 167/2022 under sections 457 and 380 IPC was registered at Police Station Bishnah and investigation started.

During the course of investigation, a team from Police Station Bishnah led by SHO

Inspector Vikram Sharma under the supervision of SDPO RS Pura Surinder Singh and SP Headquarters Jammu Ramnish Gupta acted swiftly and with the help of technical assistance arrested four thieves including a juvenile.

The three arrested thieves were identified as Karan Kumar, son of Surfa Ram of Ward Number 10 Bishnah, Sahil Kumar, son of Bachan Lal of Ward Number 11 Bishnah and Arjun Kumar, son of Bishan Dass of Ward Number 13 Bishnah. However, the identity of the juvenile could not be disclosed as per guidelines of the court.

On their disclosure, one stolen LED was recovered and questioning is going on for more recoveries.

Further investigation into the case is also going on.

## Missing girl reunited with family by police

## Another drug peddler booked under PIT NDPS Act

UDHAMPUR, Sept 27: Udhampur Police today booked one more notorious drug peddler under the Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substance (PITNDPS) Act for his repeated involvement in selling and distributing contraband narcotics among the youth of Ramnagar area.

The accused, namely Krishan Lal alias Luni, son of Badri Nath, resident of Ward number 09, Ramnagar was taken into custody and sent to jail.

On the directions of SSP Udhampur, Dr Vinod Kumar, dossier of Krishan Lal was prepared and sent for approval of the competent authority. Subsequently, the case was duly processed and after obtaining sanction from the Divisional Commissioner Jammu, the said drug peddler was detained under PITNDPS Act.

According to Police, the accused was a threat to the

peaceful environment and had been trying to involve youth of the area in drug addiction.

Meanwhile, Udhampur Police arrested two drug peddlers and recovered 11.70 grams of contraband Heroin like substance from their possession.

The duo was riding a motorcycle (JK14H- 1297), which was intercepted by a Police party of PS Ramnagar, led by SHO Pushpinder Singh and assisted by PSI Abhinav Bhatti, under the supervision of SDO Ramnagar, Dr Bhisim Dubey.

On frisking of bike rider Ram Puri, son of Chuni Lal of Chigli Chowri Ramnagar and pillion Rajesh Singh son of Yash Pal of Ward number 11, Ramnagar, Police recovered 11.70 grams of contraband Heroin like substance and arrested both the accused persons on the spot.

In this regard, case FIR number 123/2022 under relevant sections of NDPS Act has been registered in PS Ramnagar.
