

2 JeM associates arrested in Srinagar

SRINAGAR, Aug 9: Police today arrested two militant associates of Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) in Srinagar district.

An official said that two militant associates of JeM Arshad Mushtaq son of Mushtaq Mangroo of Badabagh Pulwama

and Suhail Majeed Mir son of Abdul Majeed Mir of Machpuna Pulwama were arrested by Srinagar Police and two grenades were recovered from them.

A case (FIR 124 u/s 18,23,39 UAPA & 4,5 Explosive act) was registered against them at Police Station Parimpora.

16 injured as Tempo falls into gorge

Mandi BDO office faces staff shortage

POONCH, Aug 9: Many posts are lying vacant in Block Development Office Mandi in Poonch district including the post of BDO as Block Development Officer Lorin is looking after the charge of this post from last three and a half months.

Official sources said that a transfer list of BDOs was issued by the Rural Development and Panchayat Raj department in April, transferring BDO Mandi Akankasha Gupta to Poonch block and Mohd Ibrahim to Lorin Block with additional charge of block Mandi, while no officer was appointed and given the full charge of BDO Mandi after that.

Moreover, the Post of Assistant Accounts Officer

(AAO) is also lying vacant since many years, Statistical Officer (SO) from last two years, Statistical Assistant (SA) from last many years, Junior Assistant from more than 3 months, Onspoter Panchayat from last 1.5 years, and the posts of Watcher, orderly, plantation supervisor are lying vacant from last many years due to which people are suffering badly.

Though the contractual and field staff is somehow managing the office work but people visiting to this office suffer due to acute shortage of staff. Elected representatives including local Sarpanches have urged Government to fill up the vacant posts of Block Development Officer Mandi and all other vacant posts so that people may not suffer more.

Burglary case solved, 3 held

SRINAGAR, Aug 9: Police in Ganderbal today solved a burglary case by arresting three accused persons involved in the commission of the crime and recover stolen property worth over Rs 5 lakh from their possession.

On July 30, Police Station Safapora received a written complaint from one Nisar Ahmad Mir, son of Gh Ahmad Mir resident of Kumar Mohalla Safapora stating therein that during the intervening night of 29/30 July 2023, some unknown burglars have barged into his house and looted cash worth lacs, police said.

Accordingly, police said, a case FIR No. 29/2023 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Safapora and the investigation was initiated.

As per police, on the receipt of the information, SSP Ganderbal Nikhil Borkar constituted a special Police team led by in-charge SHO PS Safapora under the supervision of DySP Hqrs Ganderbal.

"After hectic efforts and with the help of technical resources, 3 suspects were brought for questioning. During questioning, they admitted their involvement in the commission of the crime," police said.

PP nabs 5 from Baramulla

The Punjab Police on Wednesday said it has arrested five people from Jammu and Kashmir in connection with a heroin seizure case.

Police also seized a pistol, two magazines, 46 cartridges and Rs 11.20 lakh cash from them.

Addressing a press conference here, Deputy Inspector General (Border Range) Narendra Bhargav said the five people were nabbed from the Baramulla area of Jammu and Kashmir.

He claimed that the money, and arms and ammunition seized from them were to be used for terror activities.

The accused were identified as Raveel Kataria, Imtayaz Ahmed, Nafeez, Mukhtiar Ahmad and Fiaz Ahmed, all residents of Baramulla, police said.

Their arrest came following the questioning of three people who were arrested with 18 kilograms of heroin from Gurdaspur in Punjab on July 27.

Police with the help of the army launched an operation to nab the five people from the Baramulla area, Bhargav said. (PTI)

Pak PM to write for dissolution of National Assembly

ISLAMABAD, Aug 9:

Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif today said he would write to President Arif Alvi tonight for the dissolution of the National Assembly, three days before the end of its constitutional term.

Addressing the farewell session of the lower house of Parliament, he said he would meet Leader of the Opposition in the National Assembly Raja Riaz on Thursday to discuss the names of the caretaker premier.

According to Geo News, sources privy to the matter said that the much-awaited meeting between the premier and the opposition leader was to be held today but it was postponed due to Riaz's busy schedule.

"There is three days' time, during which consultations will be done together," Sharif said, adding that the names for interim premier will go to the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) if there is no agreement on the three names.

Father arrested for attempt to murder of son

SRINAGAR, Aug 9: A man accused of attempting to murder his son has been arrested in Sonawar area of Srinagar city today.

The accused identified as Mehmood Ahmad Wani, son of Nazir Ahmad Wani, a resident of Sonawar Srinagar stabbed his son after a heated argument with him.

The victim was evacuated to a nearby hospital, where his overall condition is said to be stable.

"We have registered an FIR under 121/2023 under section 307 of IPC against the accused", an official said adding the weapon of offence has also been recovered at the site.

Man dies, another injured in separate accidents

JAMMU, Aug 9: A 52-year-old man died in a road accident here, Police said.

They said Romi Sharma son of Satpal of Bakshi Nagar, Jammu, was injured after an auto collided with a car at Narwal, Qasim Nagar, Jammu, on August 1, 2023.

"He was admitted to Government Medical College and Hospital Jammu the same day where he didn't respond to the treatment around 2:16 am today," said police.

The body of the deceased has been shifted to the mortuary for conducting the post-mortem while a case under relevant sections of the law stands registered at Police Station Bagh-e-Bahu.

Meanwhile, a septuagenarian sustained injuries in a road accident here at Jaurian area today.

Police said Darshan Lal (72) son of Girdhari Lal of Jaurian, Akhnor, suffered injuries after he was hit by a motorcycle at Jaurian.

The injured has been hospitalised where his condition is stated to be critical.

Police in Jaurian have registered a case under relevant sections of the law and taken up further investigations.

ensure an agreement on one name with Prime Minister Shehbaz, the report said.

"All efforts will be made to finalise the name of the interim PM with the prime minister," he said.

Sharif thanked all parliamentarians for posing trust in him and slammed the previous PTI government led by ousted premier Imran Khan for its negligence and failures.

He also thanked China for supporting Pakistan at a time when the country was going through an economic crisis, saying that without Beijing's support, the agreement with the IMF would not have been possible.

"Chinese Premier Li Qiang had told me that he himself had talked to the IMF Managing Director to support Pakistan," he said, adding that in the previous four months, China had rolled over a loan of USD 5 billion for Pakistan.

The dissolution of the National Assembly will pave the way for the next general elections in the country.

The five-year tenure of the 342-member lower house of Parliament will end on August 12.

"On the completion of the

incumbent government's term, I would send a summary to the President of Pakistan for dissolution of the National Assembly by Wednesday and then an interim government will take over," Sharif said on Tuesday while addressing a ceremony.

President Alvi can either issue a notification forthwith to dissolve the assembly or let it run for 48 hours and after that, it will stand dissolved.

It is for the second time President Alvi is dissolving the assembly. First, in April of the previous year, then-Prime Minister Khan advised its dissolution, which he followed but the move was subsequently overturned by the Supreme Court.

A final meeting of the federal Cabinet would also be held, where the premier will give a round-up of his government's performance since April last year, the Dawn newspaper reported.

The 15th National Assembly came into existence following the election held on July 25, 2018, and its first session was inaugurated on August 13. The National Assembly is being dissolved earlier to get more time for holding elections. (PTI)

Two held with illicit timber

DODA, Aug 9: Police here today arrested two persons with illicit timber in large quantity.

Acting on specific information, cops from Police Station Gandoh led by Inspector Vikram Singh, SHO Gandoh seized the illicit timber in Bhowan Forest area of Gandoh.

The illicit timber was found to have extracted by Jamsheed Ahmed, son of Abdul Qayoom Khan and Shahbaz Ahmed Khan, son of Nazam Din Khan, both residents of village Sanwara, Tehsil Gandoh after they cut the green standing trees illegally in forest area of Gandoh.

The wooden logs were then stolen for selling illegally.

Both the accused were arrested and the logs were seized from the spot.

25-year-old man found dead

JAMMU, Aug 9: A 25-year-old man died under mysterious circumstance at Maheshpura Chowk area here, police said today.

They said Bhupinder Singh son of Rashpal Singh of Chenani, Udhampur, was admitted in Government Medical College Jammu on July 24, 2023 by some passerby after he fell unconscious.

"He didn't respond to the treatment around 10:55 pm yesterday," said police.

The body of the deceased has been shifted to the mortuary of the hospital for conducting the post-mortem while inquest proceedings have been initiated by the Bakshi Nagar Police Station to further probe the cause of the death of the young man.

Soldier drowns while taking bath in canal

JAMMU, Aug 9: An Army personnel drowned in a canal while taking a bath in Kathua district of Jammu and Kashmir on Wednesday, police said.

Kalki Sharma (24), a resident of Barwal village, was on leave, they said, adding he was posted in Srinagar.

Sharma went for a bath in the canal at nearby Magar Khan but got drowned, a police official said, adding a joint rescue team of the police and the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) later fished out the body of the soldier.

Meanwhile, a 22-year-old youth, Shahbaz Ahmad of north Kashmir's Kupwara district, was feared drowned in a canal in the Domana area on the outskirts of Jammu.

Ahmad, a resident of Magam village of Handwara, was travelling in a truck returning from Uttar Pradesh and decided to take a bath in the canal late Tuesday, the official said, adding rescuers including teams of the SDRF are searching for the missing youth.
